INTRODUCTION AND REFERENCE OF BILLS

First Reading

The following bills are offered for introduction. This constitutes first reading as provided in Article III, Section 7 of the Constitution and the bills are referred as indicated.

By the Committee on Natural Resources and Conservation—

SB 897—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Department of Natural Resources; adding s. 20.25(2)(g), Florida Statutes; creating a new Division of Beaches and Shores within the department; adding s. 370.02(5), Florida Statutes, and transferring to said section and amending paragraphs (c) and (d) of subsection (2) of said section; providing powers and duties of such division; authorizing the executive director of the department to establish bureaus within such division; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Natural Resources and Conservation; Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs; Governmental Operations; and Appropriations.

By Senators Scott, Jenne, Beard, Poole, McClain, Frank, Stevens, Thomas, Hair, Hill and Anderson—

SB 898—A bill to be entitled An act relating to natural gas and petroleum pipelines; providing that certain natural gas or petroleum pipelines are developments of regional impact; establishing the Energy Pipeline Study Committee; providing for membership and duties of the committee; providing requirements for developing such a pipeline; providing an effective date.

SB 899—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Public Service Commission; amending ss. 366.03, 366.071(5), 366.82(2), 368.021, Florida Statutes; amending s. 366.06(3), Florida Statutes, and adding subsection (4) to said section; adding ss. 366.05(10), (11), 368.05(3), Florida Statutes; creating s. 366.115, Florida Statutes; limiting authority of commission over natural gas; authorizing imposition of administrative penalties on public utilities; specifying period for withholding of consent to rate schedule; requiring request for test period in connection with certain rate requests; providing for calculation of deficiency or excess; providing for change of energy consumption goals and time periods; providing a rule of construction; providing an effective date.

SB 900—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public health; creating s. 154.065, Florida Statutes; providing for the distribution of certain public health funds; amending s. 402.05, Florida Statutes; authorizing scholarships and stipends for individuals entering certain health care professions; amending s. 402.06, Florida Statutes; raising the interest on such scholarships; amending s. 402.07, Florida Statutes; providing for interest and repayment; creating s. 402.08, Florida Statutes; providing penalties; providing an effective date.

By Senator Stevens—

SB 901—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the practice of optometry; amending s. 463.002(4), Florida Statutes, redefining the term "optometry" to prohibit practitioners from using certain drugs in practice; providing exceptions; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Health and Rehabilitative Services, and Commerce.

By Senator Kirkpatrick—

SB 902—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Pesticide Law; amending s. 487.021(29), (36), and (37), Florida Statutes, and adding new subsections (7), (9), and (25); defining the terms "batch" or "lot," "date of manufacture," and "ineffective"; revising the definition of the terms "misbranded," "pest," and "pesticide"; adding subsections (12) and (13) to s. 487.031, Florida Statutes, prohibiting the sale of a pesticide unless the batch or lot designation and date of manufacture are shown on the immediate container; amending s. 487.051(2)(d), Florida Statutes, authorizing the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to assess a penalty for a pesticide found to be deficient in analysis, ineffective, or short measure; amending s. 487.071(3), Florida Statutes, providing for the analysis of certain pesticides by referee chemists under certain circumstances; amending s. 487.091(3), Florida Statutes, and adding subsections (4), (5), and (6); providing penalties for deficient analysis and ineffective or short measure products; providing for denial, suspension, or revocation of registration; providing an effective date.

SJR 903—A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Section 7, Article X of the State Constitution, relating to lotteries, to authorize accredited colleges and universities to conduct lotteries.

By Senator Gordon—

SB 904—A bill to be entitled An act relating to planning and budgeting; amending ss. 216.182 and 216.192(2), Florida Statutes; providing the Executive Office of the Governor the initial responsibility to approve the program plan for fixed capital outlay projects; deleting reference to supervision by a member of the Cabinet or certain boards with respect to the authority of any department to contest certain fixed capital outlay program plans and to contest certain plans for the release of appropriated funds; amending s. 216.212(3), Florida Statutes, and adding a subsection; providing that certain federal funds for the State University System are appropriated by statute for the purpose received; authorizing the Administration Commission, under certain circumstances, to approve the receipt and expenditure of funds from federal and other sources; amending s. 216.231(1), Florida Statutes, relating to certain administered funds, to remove the Executive Office of the Governor from provisions with respect to said funds; providing an effective date.

SB 905—A bill to be entitled An act relating to state government; creating ss. 16.535, 112.3185, 287.001, 287.058, Florida

Statutes; amending s. 287.012(3), Florida Statutes, and adding subsection (5) to said section; amending ss. 287.032, 287.042(4), (5), (8), (10), 287.057, Florida Statutes; expanding provisions relating to the procurement of contractual services by the Department of General Services; creating a Legal Services Trust Fund for the Attorney General to represent state agencies; providing for approval of private legal assistance; providing exceptions; providing for ethical considerations in the procurement of contractual services; providing duties of the Division of Purchasing; providing penalties; establishing competitive bidding and sealed proposal procedures; providing for the content of contract documents; adding s. 216.031(9), Florida Statutes; including requests for contractual services within provisions relating to agencies' budgets; amending s. 287.055(2)(a), Florida Statutes; deleting land-surveying services from the Consultants' Competitive Negotiation Act; providing an effective date.

SB 907—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the state university system; adding s. 240.235(5), (6), Florida Statutes; prohibiting use of the state university system fee collection process to collect funds for the benefit of any political organization; providing that voluntary additional fees be collected only from students indicating an affirmative desire to pay such fees; providing an effective date.

SB 908—A bill to be entitled An act relating to motor vehicle licenses; amending s. 320.025(1), Florida Statutes; authorizing certain investigative agencies to qualify for confidential motor vehicle licenses; providing an effective date.

SB 909—A bill to be entitled An act relating to landlord and tenant; amending s. 83.801, Florida Statutes, eliminating the "Mini-self-storage Landlord and Tenant Act" and creating the "Self-storage Facility Act"; amending s. 83.803, Florida Statutes, providing definitions; amending s. 83.805, Florida Statutes, providing a lien for certain obligations due under the act; creating s. 83.8055, Florida Statutes, providing for denial of access to personal property located in a self-storage facility under certain circumstances; amending s. 83.806, Florida Statutes, providing for enforcement of liens, for notice and for sale of property; providing for advertisement of sale; providing for the sale or disposition of property governed by the act; creating s. 83.808, Florida Statutes, relating to contractual liens and agreements; creating s. 83.809, Florida Statutes, providing for the application of the act; repealing ss. 83.802, 83.804, and 83.807, Florida Statutes, relating to application of the part, to obligations created by the act, and to postjudgment procedures under the "Mini-self-storage Landlord and Tenant Act"; providing for severability; providing an effective date.

s. 216.168(1), Florida Statutes; limiting the times during which the Governor may formally amend his recommendations; providing for informal changes; repealing s. 216.046, Florida Statutes, relating to the Governor's supplemental recommendations; providing an effective date.

SB 911—A bill to be entitled An act relating to additional state funds for school districts; adding s. 236.081(8), Florida Statutes; providing for a partial ad valorem tax equalization program; repealing s. 236.081(1)(f), Florida Statutes, relating to determination of sparsity supplement to be added to a district's basic amount for current operation; providing an effective date.

SB 912—A bill to be entitled An act for the relief of Metropolitan Dade County Transit Authority; providing an appropriation to compensate the county for its loss of revenue sustained by overpayment of motor vehicle license taxes on county buses; providing an effective date.

SB 932—A bill to be entitled An act relating to child support enforcement; amending s. 409.2554(5) and (7), Florida Statutes, and adding subsection (8) to said section; providing definitions; amending s. 409.2561(1), Florida Statutes; providing for reimbursement of obligation to the department; providing for enforcement of support; amending s. 409.2567, Florida Statutes; providing for a fee for the cost of services; creating s. 409.2572, Florida Statutes; providing for the appointment of a protective payee; amending s. 409.2574, Florida Statutes; providing for income deductions; providing an effective date.

SB 933—A bill to be entitled An act relating to juveniles; amending ss. 39.032(5), (6), 39.04(2)(e), 39.09(2)(c), 39.33, 39.331, 39.332, 39.333, 39.334, 39.335, 39.336, 39.337, 790.23, 812.014, Florida Statutes; providing circumstances for detention; providing time periods for filing information or returning indictment; providing for transfer for prosecution as an adult; requiring establishment of mediation and arbitration programs; providing purpose; providing definitions; providing for selection of mediators and arbitrators; providing procedures for initiation of mediation or arbitration; providing for hearings; providing for disposition of cases; providing for review; providing for funding; prohibiting possession of specified weapons by juvenile offenders; providing penalties for theft by juveniles; providing an effective date.

SB 935—A bill to be entitled An act relating to planned communities; creating the Uniformed Planned Community Act; providing definitions; providing applicability; providing for variation by agreement; providing for separate titles and taxation; specifying applicability of building codes; providing for eminent domain; specifying applicability of supplemental principles of law; providing rules of construction; prohibiting unconscionable agreements or terms; requiring good faith; providing for liberal administration of remedies; providing for adjustment of dollar amounts; providing for creation of planned communities; providing for unit boundaries; providing for construction and validity of declaration and bylaws; providing for description of units; specifying contents of declaration; providing for leasehold planned communities; providing for allocation of votes and common expense liabilities; providing for limited common elements; providing for plats and plans; providing for exercise of development rights; providing for alteration of units; providing for relocation of boundaries; providing for subdivision of units; providing for easements for encroachments; providing for use for sales purposes; specifying easement rights; providing for amendment of declaration; providing for termination; specifying rights of secured lenders; providing for master associations; providing for merger or consolidation; providing for addition of unspecified property; providing organization, membership, powers and duties of unit owners association; providing for transfer of special declarant rights; providing for bylaws; providing for upkeep; providing for meetings and quorum; providing for voting and proxies; specifying tort and contract liability; providing for conveyance or encumbrance of common elements; requiring insurance; providing for surplus funds; providing for liens; providing for records; requiring public offering statements; providing cancellation rights; providing for resale; providing for escrow accounts; providing for release of liens; providing for express and implied warranties and modification thereof; providing statute of limitations; specifying effect of violation of rights of action; providing for attorney's fees; providing for labeling of promotional material; providing declarant's obligation to complete and restore; providing for substantial completion; specifying regulatory powers and duties of Department of Business Regulation; requiring registration; requiring approval of uncompleted units; authorizing cease and desist orders; authorizing revocation of registration; specifying investigative powers; requiring annual reports; providing for regulation of public offering statements; providing an effective date.

SB 936—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida RICO Act; amending ss. 16.53, 895.05(2)(c), (5), Florida Statutes; creating s. 895.055, Florida Statutes; providing for deposit of proceeds from civil actions under the Florida RICO Act in the Legal Affairs Revolving Trust Fund; creating a RICO account within the trust fund; specifying uses of moneys in the account; authorizing appointment of private attorneys to bring civil actions under the Florida RICO Act; providing for payment of fees and expenses of such attorneys; authorizing state attorneys and state agencies to request institution of a civil proceeding; providing an effective date.

SB 937—A bill to be entitled An act relating to publicly owned buildings; amending s. 255.254, Florida Statutes; requiring before release of certain funds certification to the Executive Office of the Governor that certain analyses have been completed; prohibiting inclusion of certain design components into a building design under certain circumstances; deleting the prohibition against certain building construction which does not include solar energy systems in certain facilities; amending s. 255.255(3)(e), Florida Statutes; requiring inclusion of solar and heat recovery water heating systems in a certain comparison of systems; adding s. 255.257(5), (6), Florida Statutes, and renumbering present subsection (5) of said section as subsection (7); requiring the Division of Building Construction and Property Management of the Department of General Services to report annually to the Legislature on the status of the state energy management plan; providing requirements for such report;

providing a conditional prohibition on increases in a state agency's annual appropriation for utility costs; providing an effective date.
