SB 475—A bill to be entitled An act relating to chiropractic licensure; amending s. 460.406(1)(b), Florida Statutes; requiring an applicant for chiropractic licensure examination to be a graduate of a college approved by an accrediting agency approved by the United States Office of Education; providing an effective date.

SB 476—A bill to be entitled An act relating to real estate time-sharing plans; amending s. 721.06, Florida Statutes, 1982 Supplement, and s. 721.08(1)(a), Florida Statutes, deleting references to waiver of a time-share purchaser's right to cancel a time-share contract; amending s. 721.10(2), Florida Statutes, prohibiting sellers from soliciting for such a waiver or from including provision for a waiver in the contract; providing an effective date.

SB 477—A bill to be entitled An act relating to water and sewer systems; adding s. 367.071(3)(c), Florida Statutes, 1982 Supplement; requiring a referendum before a governmental agency may conclude the purchase of such utility; providing an effective date.

SB 478—A bill to be entitled An act relating to transportation; creating Part VI of chapter 348, Florida Statutes, creating the "St. Lucie County Expressway Authority Law"; providing definitions; creating the St. Lucie County Expressway Authority; providing for membership, powers, and duties; providing for the issuance of bonds; providing for a lease-purchase agreement; providing that the Department of Transportation may be appointed as agent of the authority for construction; providing for the acquisition of lands and property; providing for cooperation with other units, boards, agencies, and individuals; providing for the covenant of the state; providing an exemption from taxation; providing that bonds or other obligations issued pursuant to the act shall be legal investments and securities for certain institutions; providing that pledges made by the department are enforceable by bondholders; providing that the powers of the part are additional and supplemental to certain existing powers; providing an effective date.

SB 479—A bill to be entitled An act relating to state agency contracts; creating s. 286.30, Florida Statutes; providing definitions; providing a hearing procedure; providing for denial or revocation of a contractor's privilege to provide services or commodities to certain state agencies or to bid on work let by certain state agencies for specified reasons; providing for a period of disqualification; providing for reinstatement of the privilege; providing a hearing procedure; providing for a continuation of obligations under preexisting contracts; providing penalties; providing notification requirements; providing investigative authority; creating s. 286.31, Florida Statutes; providing for distribution of moneys recovered; creating s. 286.32, Florida Statutes; prohibiting administrative stays of denial or revocation of bidding privileges; providing criteria for judicial stays and injunctive relief; providing that certain activities constitute an immediate danger to public safety, health and welfare; creating s. 286.33, Florida Statutes; providing a definite period of time during which a state agency's official project cost estimates and potential bidders' identities are exempt from the provisions of s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes; creating s. 286.34, Florida Statutes; providing for compilation and dissemination of contractor ineligibility information by the Department of General Services; providing an effective date.

SB 480—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the retirement system for school teachers; amending s. 238.06(4), Florida Statutes; providing that teachers who become a member of the system on or after July 1, 1955, but prior to December 1, 1970, must pay into the system prior to retirement total contributions equal to 8 percent, plus accumulated regular interest, of any out-of-state compensation received during out-of-state service for which they receive credit; providing an effective date.
