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## INTRODUCTION AND REFERENCE OF BILLS

### First Reading

By Senator McPherson—

**SB 881**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to pari-mutuel wagering; providing findings of fact and declaration of public purpose in reference to the condemnation of Hialeah Race Course in Hialeah, Florida; providing authority for the Department of Business Regulation to file condemnation proceedings against Hialeah Race Course; amending s. 550.081, Florida Statutes, to establish a special Hialeah operating period within the second period of racing; providing for a method of granting racing dates; eliminating the special 21-day racing period; amending s. 550.09(3)(b), Florida Statutes, relating to taxes on thoroughbred racing operations; providing that the section of law governing the maximum length of a race meeting shall not be interpreted in a specified manner; providing effective dates.

—was referred to the Committees on Commerce; and Finance, Taxation and Claims.

**SB 882**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to pari-mutuel wagering; amending s. 550.35, Florida Statutes, providing that it is unlawful for any person to transmit or communicate to another, by any means, the results, changing odds, track conditions, jockey changes, or other information relative to any horserace, dograce, or jai alai contest from any racetrack or fronton during a certain time period; providing an exception allowing any horsetrack, dogtrack, or fronton to disseminate information concerning races or games conducted at the licensee's enclosure by immediate or delayed broadcast; providing an exception authorizing licensees to broadcast to locations outside the state; authorizing licensees to receive such information from racetracks or frontons located outside the state; providing a definition; prohibiting the transmission of racing information to any person by any means when the information is knowingly used for illegal gambling purposes; providing legislative intent; providing penalties; providing for the application of the act with respect to conflicting laws, orders, or rules; providing an effective date.

**SB 883**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to medical telecommunications and transportation; amending s. 401.25(2)(d), Florida Statutes, 1982 Supplement, providing that municipalities shall not be denied a certificate of convenience and necessity with respect to an application for licensure as a basic or advanced life support service under certain circumstances; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Health and Rehabilitative Services.

**SB 884**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to jai alai frontons; creating s. 551.115, Florida Statutes, authorizing additional racing days for certain existing jai alai frontons in certain areas of the state; providing restrictions; providing an effective date.

**SB 885**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to tax on sales, use and other transactions; amending s. 212.04(2)(b), Florida Statutes, 1982 Sup-

plement; exempting from said tax admissions to fund-raising events conducted by library support groups; adding paragraph (u) to s. 212.08(7), Florida Statutes, 1982 Supplement; exempting purchases and sales of tangible personal property by such groups; providing an effective date.

**SB 886**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to mobile home parks and mobile home owners; establishing a Mobile Home Study Commission to investigate matters related to the right of first refusal, rent increases, and tenant displacement; providing for membership organization, meetings, per diem and travel expenses, and staff and administrative support; providing for public hearings; providing for a final report; providing an appropriation; providing effective and expiration dates.

—was referred to the Committees on Commerce, Rules and Calendar, and Appropriations.

**SB 887**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to beverage licenses; amending s. 561.19(2), Florida Statutes; requiring a filing fee for applications for beverage licenses; providing an effective date.

**SB 888**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to land and water management; amending s. 380.06(9)(b), Florida Statutes, relating to application for development approval for developments of regional impact, to provide a limitation with respect to the request for additional information; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Natural Resources and Conservation.

**SB 889**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to computer-related crimes; amending s. 815.03(8), (9), Florida Statutes; providing definitions; amending ss. 815.04(1), (2), (3), 815.05(1)(a), (2)(a), 815.06(1), Florida Statutes; removing the element of knowledge from the list of elements of certain offenses; creating s. 815.08, Florida Statutes; providing civil remedies; providing limitations on civil and criminal actions; amending s. 895.02(1), Florida Statutes; including computer-related crimes in racketeering activity; providing penalties; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Judiciary-Criminal and Judiciary-Civil.

**SB 890**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; amending s. 487.041(2), Florida Statutes; requiring the department to establish a fee for pesticide registration and limiting the maximum fee; renumbering s. 487.042(4), (5), Florida Statutes, and adding a new subsection (4) to said section; requiring the department to establish a fee for licensure of restricted pesticide dealers, limiting the maximum fee, and providing for deposit of the fees; amending s. 576.041(1), Florida Statutes; requiring the department to establish a fee for the inspection of commercial fertilizer, limiting the maximum fee, and providing for deposit of the fees; amending s. 578.08(1), Florida Statutes; requiring the department to establish a fee for the registration of seed dealers and limiting the maximum fees; amending s. 580.061(1)(a), (2), Florida Statutes; requiring the department to establish a fee for the inspection of commercial feed distributed in this state and limiting the maximum fee; providing an effective date.

**SB 891**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to termination of pregnancies; amending s. 390.001(4)(a), Florida Statutes, requiring physicians to notify the parent or guardian of an unemancipated pregnant minor prior to the termination of her pregnancy; providing a procedure for judicial waiver of such requirement; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Health and Rehabilitative Services, and Judiciary-Civil.

**SB 892**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the appointment of members of the Public Service Commission; amending s. 350.031(3), Florida Statutes; prescribing circumstances under which the Public Service Commission Nominating Council may limit the number of persons it recommends to the Governor for appointment to the commission and may refuse to accept further applications, providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs.

**SB 893**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to traffic offenses; amending s. 318.18, Florida Statutes, 1982 Supplement; raising civil penalties for traffic infractions; creating s. 318.195, Florida Statutes; establishing an assessment for State Highway Safety Program; adding s. 316.660(3), Florida Statutes; providing for collection and distribution of Highway Safety Trust Fund assessments; adding s. 34.191(5), Florida Statutes; providing for collection and distribution of Highway Safety Trust Fund assessments; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Transportation and Appropriations.

**SB 894**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to collective bargaining; amending ss. 447.301(2), 447.309(5), Florida Statutes; removing exclusion of statutes and ordinances relating to retirement from matters subject to collective bargaining by public employees; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Rules and Calendar.

By Senator Weinstein—

**SB 895**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to jurors and jury lists; amending s. 40.01, Florida Statutes; eliminating the requirement that jurors be registered electors and requiring a common data base list to be used for the selection of jurors; creating s. 40.011, Florida Statutes, requiring the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles to furnish a common data base list to the clerk of the court and providing for affidavits for application for jury duty for those citizens whose names do not appear on the list; creating s. 40.022, Florida Statutes, requiring the clerk of the court to purge the jury lists once a month of convicted felons, mentally incompetent persons, and deceased persons; providing for affidavits for application for jury duty for those citizens whose civil rights and mental competency have been restored; amending s. 905.37(3), Florida Statutes, eliminating the requirement that statewide grand jurors be registered electors; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Civil.

**SB 896**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the regulation of trade, commerce, and investments; amending s. 559.805(4), Florida Statutes; increasing the fees charged by the Division of Consumer Services for filing disclosure statements on sales of business opportunities; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Finance, Taxation and Claims.

By Senator Crawford—

**SB 897**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to livestock at large; amending s. 588.18, Florida Statutes, providing that the board of county commissioners in each county shall set fees with respect to impounding animals and related matters; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

By Senator Meek (by request)—

**SB 898**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to sentencing; amending s. 775.087(2), Florida Statutes, and s. 893.135(2), Florida Statutes, 1982 Supplement, authorizing the court to waive or reduce the mandatory minimum terms of imprisonment for certain crimes committed by persons possessing a firearm, and for drug trafficking offences, if the person has no prior felony conviction; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Judiciary-Criminal; Corrections, Probation and Parole; and Appropriations.

**SB 899**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to purchasing; amending s. 287.042(4)(f), Florida Statutes, 1982 Supplement; applying minority vendor provisions to commodity purchasing; defining "minority-owned firm or company"; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Governmental Operations.

**SB 900**—A bill to be entitled An act for the relief of Freddie Lee Pitts and Wilbert Lee; providing an appropriation as compensation for being convicted of a crime they did not commit; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Special Master and the Committees on Corrections, Probation and Parole; and Finance, Taxation and Claims.

**SB 901**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to trial jury; creating s. 913.18, Florida Statutes, creating a presumption of discrimination in jury selection in criminal cases under specified circumstances; providing remedies; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Civil.

By Senator Meek (by request)—

**SB 902**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to housing and economic opportunity; authorizing each county and municipality to establish a Housing and Economic Authority to disburse state funds to provide housing and economic opportunity for low-income and disadvantaged persons; prescribing the size and membership of a board of directors for each authority; providing rulemaking authority to each such agency; providing for the deposit of state funds into each county or municipal Housing and Economic Opportunity Trust Fund; specifying purposes for which such funds may be disbursed including low-interest loans for the construction of housing for low-income families residing in this state, financial assistance for low-income home buyers or renters, and low interest rates and capitalization funds for minorities, small businesses, and contractors; providing limitations and procedures; requiring an annual report to the Governor; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs; and Appropriations.

**SB 903**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to postsecondary education; amending s. 240.343(1)(a) and (d), Florida Statutes, providing that with respect to community college employees there shall be no limit on the number of days of sick leave an employee may accrue; providing additional criteria for computing terminal pay for accumulated sick leave; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Personnel, Retirement and Collective Bargaining; and Appropriations.

**SB 904**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to district school boards; amending s. 240.377, Florida Statutes; authorizing such boards to expend a portion of funds accruing from auxiliary enterprises and undesignated gifts for promotion and public relations under state board regulations; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Education and Appropriations.

By Senator Meek—

**SB 905**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; creating a joint legislative and executive task force to study and make recommendations for legislation to improve the quality of education for certain students; prescribing membership and duties of the task force; providing for per diem and travel expenses; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Education, Rules and Calendar, and Appropriations.

**SB 906**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Leon County; providing permanent status for certain employees of the Leon County Sheriff; specifying rights of employees; providing procedures for appeal of disciplinary actions and complaints against employees; providing for the appointment of boards to hear appeals and procedures with respect thereto; providing an effective date.

**SB 912**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to a special election for the approval or rejection by the electors of a joint resolution relating to limitations on appropriations; providing for publication of notice and for procedures; providing an effective date.

**SJR 913**—A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Section 1, Article VII of the State Constitution, relating to finance and taxation; providing that in no year shall the rate of increase in appropriations from state general tax revenues exceed the estimated rate of growth of the economy of the state as determined by law; providing that no appropriation in excess of this limitation shall be made unless the legislature sets forth the dollar amount and rate by which the limit will be exceeded; providing for a three-fifths vote of each house of the legislature to adopt any appropriation in excess of the limitation; providing for a working capital fund; providing for tax relief.
