The following Proclamation was received:

PROCLAMATION
State of Florida

(Amendment to Proclamation dated June 14, 1983)

TO THE HONORABLE MEMBERS OF THE FLORIDA SENATE
AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES:

WHEREAS, on the 14th day of June, 1983, a proclamation of the Governor was issued convening a Special Session of the Florida Legislature commencing at 10:00 a.m., Wednesday, June 15, 1983, and extending through midnight, Friday, June 17, 1983, and

WHEREAS, consultation with the leadership of the Florida Legislature reflects that progress is being made and that this Special Session should be continued until the matters under consideration are completed, and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the citizens of the State to extend the length of the Special Session in order to permit full and adequate consideration of all items within my proclamation of June 14, 1983,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, BOB GRAHAM, Governor of the State of Florida, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by Article III, Section 3(c)(1), Florida Constitution, do hereby extend the Special Session through midnight, Wednesday, June 22, 1983.

Except as amended by this Proclamation, the Proclamation of the Governor dated June 14, 1983, is ratified and confirmed.
