SB 776—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Broward County; creating and establishing the Performing Arts Center Authority in said county as a public body corporate and politic for the purpose of planning, promoting, developing, constructing, extending, enlarging, repairing, remodeling, improving, relocating, equipping, maintaining, and operating facilities and sites for holding any type of cultural, tourism, or promotional event, or civic, recreational, or similar event or activity; providing definitions; providing for the method and manner of the appointment of the authority and terms of the authority's membership; providing for reimbursement of members' expenses; providing for removal of members; providing for the organization, powers, functions, financing, privileges, duties, and responsibilities of the authority; providing for competitive bidding in certain instances; authorizing the acquisition of certain property acquired by eminent domain; providing for budget approval by the

Broward County Commission and the Commission of the City of Fort Lauderdale; providing for the issuance of revenue bonds by the authority to carry out the purposes of this act; providing for sources of revenues for paying for the construction of facilities and the administrative expenses of the authority and for paying for said revenue bonds; authorizing appropriations by the county and other governmental units in Broward County for operation and maintenance of said facilities; providing for public or private subscriptions; providing for the issuance of a license to sell alcoholic beverages for on-premise consumption; providing severability; providing an effective date.

SB 777—A bill to be entitled An act relating to pari-mutuel wagering; providing legislative intent; providing for breeders' and stallion awards; amending s. 550.262, F.S.; providing for payment of a sum equal to the breaks and escheated moneys from thoroughbred races to the Florida Thoroughbred Breeders' Association and from standardbred races to the Florida Standardbred Breeders' and Owners' Association; providing for awards to the breeders of registered Florida-bred horses, and to the owners of Florida stallions who sire the Florida-bred horses that win stakes races; providing for payment of awards at a uniform rate of not less than 15 percent, if funds are available; providing for submission of a plan each year by the breeders' associations that will provide a uniform rate and procedure for payments; providing for approval of the plan by the Florida Pari-mutuel Commission; amending s. 550.263, F.S.; providing for the distribution of certain escheated property; transferring certain fund assets and equity from the Florida Thoroughbred Breeders Promotion Trust Fund and the Florida Harness Horse Racing Promotion Trust Fund; providing an effective date.

SB 782—A bill to be entitled An act relating to birth centers; creating the "Birth Center Licensure Act"; providing legislative intent; providing definitions; providing for the issuance, renewal, denial, and revocation of licenses to conduct birth centers by the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services; providing for license applications, fees, and expenses; providing for administration; providing for requirements for birth center facilities; providing for client selection; providing for informed consent; providing for client education and orientation; providing for prenatal care; limiting surgical services; providing for laboratory services; providing for intrapartum care; providing for postpartum care; providing for consultation; providing for transportation and transfers; providing for records and reports; providing for clinical records; providing for quality assurance; providing for rules and enforcement; providing for inspections; providing for inspection reports; providing for criminal and administrative penalties, injunctions, emergency orders, and moratoriums; providing an effective date.

SB 783—A bill to be entitled An act relating to corrections; amending s. 921.001, F.S.; providing that certain prisoners may be released from incarceration by a circuit court order mitigating punishment; providing for post-release supervision of such prisoner by the Department of Corrections; amending s. 921.185, F.S.; providing procedures for requesting an order mitigating punishment; prohibiting an appeal of an order denying such motion; providing for the reincarceration of a prisoner who violates a condition of his post-release program; amending s. 944.291, F.S.; providing that a prisoner who is released before the end of his sentence by reason of gain-time allowances shall remain under the supervision and control of the department; providing an exception; amending s. 944.30, F.S.; requiring the Parole and Probation Commission to review the sentence of certain prisoners for the purpose of recommending a commutation of sentence to the Board of Pardons; providing for the release of such prisoners subject to certain conditions; prescribing those prisoners eligible for release; amending s. 940.03, F.S.; requiring the commission to provide the Board of Pardons with certain information when it recommends a sentence be commuted; providing an effective date.

SB 789—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the state highway system; amending s. 316.003, F.S.; defining the term "bicycle path"; amending s. 316.091, F.S.; prohibiting the operation of certain vehicles upon a limited access facility; authorizing the operation of a bicycle upon such facilities in certain circumstances; amending s. 316.1995, F.S.; prohibiting the operation of certain vehicles upon a bicycle path; amending s. 316.304, F.S.; prohibiting a person from operating a vehicle while wearing a headset or certain other listening devices; providing penalties; amending s. 335.065, F.S.; providing for the planning and construction of bicycle paths and pedestrian ways along state transportation facilities; repealing s. 316.2075, F.S., relating to the prohibition against operating a motor vehicle on bicycle trails and footpaths; providing an effective date.
