INTRODUCTION AND REFERENCE OF BILLS

SB 670—A bill to be entitled An act relating to state personnel systems; amending s. 110.125, F.S.; specifying certain uses for a portion of personnel administrative costs; amending s. 110.205, F.S.; revising various exemptions from the Career Service System to reflect membership in the Senior Management Service and the Selected Professional Service; amending s. 110.401, F.S.; limiting the applicability of the Senior Management Service; recognizing the need for training programs; amending s. 110.403, F.S.; vesting rulemaking authority exclusively in the Department of Administration; providing that a Senior Management Service employee serves at the discretion of the agency head; specifying additional duties of the department; amending s. 110.405, F.S.; abolishing the Senior Management Advisory Committee; authorizing the Secretary of the Department of Administration to appoint advisory committees and to hire a consultant; creating s. 110.406, F.S.; requiring an annual report and specifying the contents of such report; creating s. 110.407, F.S.; providing

for biennial performance audits by the Auditor General; creating part VI of chapter 110, F.S.; establishing the Selected Professional Service system; providing a declaration of policy; specifying coverage and providing for pay and benefits; providing for suspension, dismissal, and other actions affecting employees; providing for rules, records, and performance appraisal; requiring an annual report and a biennial performance audit; specifying certain leave and insurance benefits to be provided to Senior Management Service and Selected Professional Service employees; providing for the transfer of unused leave credits and the continuity of service with respect to affected employees; requiring the adoption and application of specific criteria for agency reorganizations and requiring review of existing bureaus; amending s. 447.203, F.S.; defining "public employer" with respect to Selected Professional Service employees; reviving and readopting provisions relating to the Senior Management system; repealing s. 110.404, F.S., relating to the Senior Management Policy Committee; providing for future review and repeal; providing for retroactivity; providing an effective date.

SB 671—A bill to be entitled An act relating to offenses against children; amending s. 90.90, F.S.; providing circumstances under which the videotaping of the testimony of a child victim or witness shall be conducted outside of the presence of the defendant; providing an effective date.

SB 672—A bill to be entitled An act relating to law enforcement officers and correctional officers; amending s. 112.533, F.S.; prescribing requirements for the receipt and processing of complaints against such officers; amending confidentiality requirements pertaining to such complaints; providing penalties; providing an effective date.

SB 675—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the sale of alligator products; amending s. 372.6645, F.S.; changing permit requirement to a license requirement; deleting legislative intent; adding crocodilia products to the scope of the act; deleting reference to retail sales and permit fees; providing penalties; providing an effective date.

SB 678—A bill to be entitled An act relating to sewage treatment facilities; amending s. 403.1835, F.S.; providing a revolving loan program for sewage treatment facilities, requiring plans and specifications prior to loan approval; limiting the use of loans; authorizing penalties for delinquent repayments; authorizing the use of federal funds; authorizing the department to establish rules for prioritizing projects; establishing administrative requirements for local governments receiving assistance; providing an effective date.

SB 679—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Brevard County; creating the South Brevard County Aviation Study Commission; providing for membership and organization; specifying duties of the commission; requiring a report to the Brevard County Legislative Delegation; providing for future repeal; providing an effective date.

SB 680—A bill to be entitled An act relating to endangered children; providing for search warrants for abused or neglected children; providing for transfer of such children for dependency intake; authorizing hospitals and physicians to temporarily detain children whose life or health would be endangered by return to their custodians; providing circumstances under which a law enforcement officer may take a child into protective custody; providing an effective date.

SB 681—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the qualification and registration of electors; amending s. 97.091, F.S.; requiring a supervisor of elections to purge an elector's name from the registration books under specified conditions; relieving such supervisor of elections from civil or criminal liability; providing for reinstatement to the registration books by court order; providing an effective date.

SB 682—A bill to be entitled An act relating to possession of a controlled substance; amending s. 893.13, F.S.; repealing the prohibition against a person possessing a controlled substance lawfully dispensed to him in a container other than that in which the substance was originally delivered; providing an effective date.

By Senator Stuart—

SB 683—A bill to be entitled An act relating to water and sewer systems; amending s. 381.272, F.S., relating to the requirement that individ-

ual potable water wells and onsite sewage disposal systems be connected to a central system when available; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Natural Resources and Conservation; and Health and Rehabilitative Services.

By Senator Stuart—

SB 684—A bill to be entitled An act relating to motor fuels; creating ss. 206.701-206.703, F.S., imposing an additional state tax on motor fuels to be used for specified purposes; authorizing counties to levy an additional tax on motor fuels to be used for such purposes; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Transportation; and Finance, Taxation and Claims.

SB 685—A bill to be entitled An act relating to sentencing; adopting and implementing the revisions to the sentencing guidelines promulgated by the Florida Supreme Court in accordance with the provisions of s. 921.001, F.S.; providing an effective date.

SB 686—A bill to be entitled An act relating to courtroom testimony; allowing the use of anatomically correct dolls to assist child victims testifying in sexual battery proceedings; providing an effective date.

SB 687—A bill to be entitled An act relating to judicial proceedings involving children; providing that specified civil or criminal cases involving children shall have precedence over other suits, cases, or proceedings; providing an effective date.

SB 688—A bill to be entitled An act relating to evidence; amending ss. 90.603, 90.605, F.S.; limiting provision relating to disqualification of witnesses because of communicative skills; providing that a child who understands the duty to tell the truth shall be allowed to testify without taking an oath; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Civil.

SB 689—A bill to be entitled An act relating to evidence; amending s. 90.612, F.S.; providing that the court may allow a party to ask a leading question on direct or redirect examination of a child of a specified age; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Civil.

By Senator Peterson—

SB 690—A bill to be entitled An act relating to farm labor; amending sections 2, 3, and 4 of chapter 77-25, Laws of Florida, updating references with respect to authority to administer and enforce federal farm labor law; amending s. 450.28, F.S., decreasing the minimum number of farm workers required to be employed to subject a farm labor contractor to the Farm Labor Registration Law; providing additional definitions; amending s. 450.29, F.S., providing exclusions from application of the Farm Labor Registration Law for immediate family members of persons presently excluded, and for persons who transport workers by carpool; amending s. 450.30, F.S., providing for registration renewal on the registrant's birthdate or date of incorporation; amending s. 450.31, F.S., increasing the fee for application for registration; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Agriculture, Commerce and Appropriations.

By Senators Plummer and Weinstein—

SB 691—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public utilities; creating the "Florida Citizens Utility Board Act"; providing legislative intent; providing definitions; creating a nonprofit membership corporation to be known as the Florida Citizens Utility Board; providing for automatic dissolution of the corporation under certain circumstances; providing powers and duties of the corporation; providing for appointment of an interim board of directors; providing limitations; providing duties; providing for election by the membership of a board of directors; providing terms, qualifications, procedures for filling of vacancies, meeting requirements, compensation, bonding requirements, and duties of the board of directors; providing nomination and election procedures; requiring submission of certain statements by candidates; providing for election of officers of the board and providing terms and duties thereof; providing for employment of an executive director and providing the powers and duties thereof; providing for matters relative thereto; authorizing the corporation, within certain limits, to furnish public utilities in this state with certain described enclosures or statements describing the corporation and soliciting contributions therefor, which enclosures or statements the public utilities are required to include in certain regular mailings or billings to residential utility customers; requiring public utilities to establish and maintain special accounts in which contributions to the corporation are to be deposited; providing for monthly transfer of such funds to the corporation; providing for reimbursement of public utilities for certain costs incurred; authorizing the corporation to represent residential utility consumers in regulatory agency proceedings; providing for an annual meeting of the membership of the corporation; providing that corporation records shall be available for public inspection and may be copied; prohibiting certain activities and providing penalties therefor; providing that the corporation may dissolve itself in accordance with certain provisions of law; prohibiting the corporation from endorsing or supporting any political party or candidate; providing limitations on the expenses of the corporation; limiting the liability of a public utility with respect to certain claims; providing for liberal construction of the act; providing severability; providing an effective date.

SB 692—A bill to be entitled An act relating to plant industry; amending s. 581.011, F.S., clarifying the definition of "department" and defining "quarantine"; amending s. 581.031, F.S., providing powers of the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services with respect to records of the movement of nursery stock; requiring maintenance of certain records by nurserymen, stock dealers, agents, and plant brokers; amending s. 581.131, F.S., increasing the maximum registration and renewal fee for such persons; amending s. 581.141, F.S., expanding to any person the applicability of departmental fines for violations under chapter 581, F.S.; amending s. 581.161, F.S., authorizing fumigation or treatment of plants exposed to infestation or infection; amending s. 581.185, F.S., providing legislative policy, definitions, prohibitions, and rules with respect to preservation of native flora in Florida; establishing the Regulated Plant Index, revising the Endangered Plant List and the Threatened Plant List, and creating the Commercially Exploited Plant List; providing for adherence to the Federal Endangered Species Act of 1973; modifying defenses available in prosecution under the section; providing exemptions; removing an exemption for logging operations; providing duties of the department with respect to the Regulated Plant Index; amending s. 581.186, F.S., increasing membership on the Endangered Plant Advisory Council and expanding duties thereof; amending s. 581.201, F.S., providing subpoena powers to the department; amending s. 581.211, F.S., providing a penalty for violation of rules relating to the quarantine of plants or plant products; saving s. 581.186, F.S., from Sundown repeal; providing for future review and repeal; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Agriculture and Appropriations.

By Senator Peterson—

SB 693—A bill to be entitled An act relating to water resources; amending s. 373.216, F.S.; requiring that applications for consumptive use permits to supply potable water to coastal communities, or applications for modification or renewal thereof, be restricted to desalination as the primary means of water production after October 1, 1987; providing a condition for applications proposing water production by other means; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Natural Resources and Conservation; and Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs.

By Senator Kiser—

SB 694—A bill to be entitled An act relating to professional regulation; amending s. 455.209, F.S., providing an additional ground for suspension of a professional regulatory board member and limiting such board members' immunity from civil liability; amending s. 455.213, F.S., authorizing hearing examiners to issue final orders relating to the issuance of licenses; authorizing the board to appeal the order; amending s. 455.219, F.S., restricting the use of trust funds of the various professions by the Department of Professional Regulation; amending s. 455.223, F.S., requiring the department's subpoenas to be supported by affidavit; amending s. 455.225, F.S., deleting the authority of the department to investigate anonymous complaints; providing limitations of departmental action on complaints; requiring boards rather than probable cause panels to make probable cause determinations; limiting the exception of probable cause proceedings from public hearing laws; authorizing the hearing officer to issue final orders relating to complaints; authorizing dismissals of complaints for agency violations; authorizing withholding of adjudication; providing record expungement procedures; amending s. 455.227, F.S., requiring boards to adopt codes of penalties; amending ss. 455.241 and 465.0165, F.S., to conform; repealing s. 455.215, F.S., relating to board intervention in licensing proceedings; repealing s. 455.221, F.S., relating to legal and investigative services for the department and boards; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs; Judiciary-Civil; and Appropriations.

SB 695—A bill to be entitled An act relating to judgments; amending s. 55.141, F.S.; revising the manner of satisfying a judgment and the procedure for recording a satisfaction of judgment, including the service charges therefor; providing for effect of recording; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Judiciary-Civil and Appropriations.

By Senator Myers—

SB 696—A bill to be entitled An act relating to imitation controlled substances; providing a definition; prohibiting the manufacture, distribution, sale, or possession of, with intent to manufacture, distribute, or sell, imitation controlled substances including certain sale or distribution of such substances to any person under the age of 18; prohibiting the advertisement or solicitation for distribution of such substances; providing penalties; providing an exception; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Judiciary-Criminal.

SB 697—A bill to be entitled An act relating to firefighters; providing that death or disability of a firefighter due to cancer is presumed to have been accidental and contracted in the line of duty unless competent evidence to the contrary is shown; providing for a physical examination upon employment, requiring the employing agency to keep a record of exposures of firefighters to cancer producing and similar toxic substances; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Personnel, Retirement and Collective Bargaining; Commerce; and Appropriations.

By Senator Girardeau—

SB 698—A bill to be entitled An act relating to consumer protection; requiring used appliance dealers to provide warranties upon sale of a used appliance; declaring noncompliance to constitute an unfair and deceptive trade practice for purposes of enforcement and penalties; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs; and Commerce.

By Senator D. Childers—

SB 699—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services; creating ss. 413.611 and 413.612, F.S.; providing intent; creating a central registry for reports of head injuries; providing definitions; requiring certain reports of head injuries; creating

an advisory council; providing for review and repeal; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Health and Rehabilitative Services; Governmental Operations; and Appropriations.

SB 700—A bill to be entitled An act relating to tax on sales, use, and other transactions; amending ss. 212.04, 212.12, and 376.11, F.S.; revising the dealer's credit for collecting the tax; providing an effective date.

CS for SB 1—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Beverage Law; amending ss. 561.01, 561.29, 561.15, 562.11, 562.111, 322.141, F.S.; defining "person of legal age"; specifying penalties for violations of the Beverage Law; prohibiting consumption or possession of alcoholic beverages by persons not of legal age and the selling or dispensing of alcoholic beverages to such persons; providing that such persons shall not be licensed under the Beverage Law; specifying color of drivers' licenses issued to such persons; prohibiting beverage licensees from withholding membership, services, or facilities on account of race, religion, sex, or national origin; providing exceptions; providing that specified amendments in the act are void in the event of certain judicial decisions; providing an effective date.

By the Committee on Natural Resources and Conservation—

CS for SB 100—A bill to be entitled An act relating to solid waste; providing legislative intent; amending s. 403.703, F.S.; providing a definition; creating s. 403.7078, F.S.; specifying liability for the operation and closure of landfill facilities; requiring a landfill disposal fee or surcharge; requiring annual audits by the Department of Environmental Regulation; providing penalties for noncompliance; specifying uses of fees or surcharges; providing rulemaking authority; amending s. 403.707, F.S.; providing for performance standards for construction and closure of resource recovery and management facilities; providing an effective date.
