**SM 778**—A memorial to the Congress of the United States, urging Congress to provide for the protection of anti-communists fleeing to the United States.

**SB 779**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to food distribution programs; creating the Florida Food Utilization Advisory Council within the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; providing for membership and functions; requiring a report and proposed legislation; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Agriculture and Appropriations.

**SB 780**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the tax on promissory or nonnegotiable notes; amending s. 201.08, F.S.; providing an exemption for certain student loans guaranteed by the Federal Government or the state; providing an effective date.

**SB 781**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the relief of Stella Yamuni for injuries sustained by her minor son, Sean Yamuni, through the negligence of the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services; providing an appropriation for compensation for this negligence; providing an effective date.

**SB 782**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to water quality standards; amending s. 403.813, F.S.; providing criteria for the restoration and construction of seawalls and riprap; amending s. 403.918, F.S.; requiring the Department of Environmental Regulation to establish rules protecting certain wetlands; providing an effective date.

**SB 783**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the licensure of graduates of foreign medical schools to practice medicine; amending s. 458.311, F.S.; permitting such applicants to take certain licensure examinations and complete their internship requirements before taking the licensure examination; providing that such applicants may not be denied the right to take the examination under certain circumstances; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Health and Rehabilitative Services; and Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs.

**SB 784**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to medical practice; amending s. 458.303, F.S.; requiring certain medical schools to be in good standing with the department before graduates of those schools may be

issued a medical faculty certificate without examination; amending s. 458.311, F.S.; requiring applicants for licensure by examination to have met certain preprofessional, postsecondary educational requirements; providing conforming language; providing an effective date.

**SB 785**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to acupuncture; amending s. 455.24, F.S.; providing that a required statement appear in certain advertisements by a person licensed to practice acupuncture; amending s. 457.105, F.S.; prescribing requirements necessary to be certified to practice acupuncture; repealing s. 457.111, relating to the requirement that informed consent be obtained before acupuncture is performed; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Economic, Community and Consumer Affairs.

**SB 786**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to psychological services; amending s. 490.005, F.S.; revising experience requirements for licensing of psychologists; amending s. 490.007, F.S.; providing that a license as a psychologist, clinical social worker, marriage and family therapist, mental health counselor, or school psychologist which is not renewed becomes inactive; eliminating an inconsistency; amending s. 490.009, F.S.; authorizing the Department of Professional Regulation or the Board of Psychological Examiners, as applicable, in disciplining applicants or licensees for the commission of specified acts, to revoke a license, to restrict practice, or to place the person on probation for a period of time and subject to conditions; providing an effective date.

**SB 787**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to dentists; amending s. 466.006, F.S.; providing requirements for the practical portion of the examination for licensure; providing for procedures for preparing, grading, standardizing, and conducting examinations; providing for clinical examination procedures to be performed on live patients; amending s. 466.018, F.S.; providing for the presumption of a dentist of record where none is specified; providing for the maintaining of dental records; amending s. 466.017, F.S.; providing for the establishment of procedures to verify compliance with certain rules; amending s. 466.024, F.S.; authorizing the delegation of certain tasks to dental hygienists or dental auxiliaries; providing an effective date.

**SB 788**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to insurance; amending s. 631.021, F.S.; changing venue of certain proceedings against insolvent insurers; creating s. 631.153, F.S.; prohibiting intervention in insurer delinquency proceedings and providing for exclusiveness of the claims procedure regarding the insurer receivership estate; amending s. 631.171, F.S.; correcting cross-references; amending s. 631.193, F.S.; providing that a release does not discharge a guaranty association from certain responsibilities and duties; amending s. 631.252, F.S. reducing time periods for the continuation of certain insurance policies; amending s. 631.263, F.S.; providing for the invalidity of certain transfers after the filing of the original petition in delinquency proceedings; amending s. 631.361, F.S.; providing for the filing of delinquency petitions by the department solely in the circuit court in and for Leon County; limiting the period of the order with respect to the proceeding; providing for an extension; amending s. 631.391, F.S.; providing that an order of rehabilitation or liquidation releases certain persons from the duty to cooperate with the department in certain proceedings; amending s. 631.57, F.S.; establishing the exclusive method of service of process upon the Florida Insurance Guaranty Association; amending s. 631.717, F.S.; restricting the liability of the association; providing the method of service of process upon the Florida Life and Health Insurance Guaranty Association; providing an effective date.

**SB 790**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to Brevard County; amending chapter 67-1143, Laws of Florida; defining "public health services" to consist of those health services which are organized and operated to protect the health of the general public; partially enumerating such services; authorizing the Board of County Commissioners of Brevard County to provide such "public health services," to enforce compliance with state and local laws relating to such services, and to assess and collect fees and charges in connection with such services; providing for a liberal and controlling construction; providing an effective date.

**SB 791**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the City of Key West, Monroe County; amending section 8 of chapter 69-1191, Laws of Florida, by amending the monthly salary received by the Chairman of the Utility Board of the City of Key West, Florida, as compensation for services, from three hundred dollars (\$300.00) per month to seven hundred dollars (\$700.00) per month and by amending the monthly salary received by the other members of said board as compensation for their services from two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) per month to six hundred dollars (\$600.00) per month; providing that all laws, whether general or special, in conflict herewith are superseded; providing an effective date.

**SB 792**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to state government; creating the Department of Public Advocacy; providing its powers and duties with respect to representing the public interest of the people of the state in their interaction with agencies of state government which regulate or administer activities which affect the general public; providing administrative divisions and providing for the creation and incorporation of certain state and local councils, committees, and commissions to carry out the responsibilities of the department; transferring the public counsel and the Division of Consumer Services of the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to the new department; renaming the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services as the Department of Agriculture; providing for penalties; providing for reports; creating s. 20.317, amending ss. 20.14, 350.061, 350.0613, 350.0614, 400.304, 400.307, 415.104, 570.29, and 760.04, and repealing ss. 20.19(6), (7), and (8), 393.001, 393.066(8), and 570.542, 570.543, and 570.544, relating to the statewide and district human rights advocacy committees, to the Florida Developmental Disabilities Planning Council, and to the Division of Consumer Services and the Florida Consumers' Council, all Florida Statutes, to conform; providing for future review and repeal; directing that changes in terminology and references in the Florida Statutes be made; providing an appropriation; providing for severability; providing an effective date.

**SB 793**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to hospitals; amending s. 395.101, F.S., exempting community mental health centers from provisions requiring hospitals to pay assessments for deposit in the Public Medical Assistance Trust Fund; providing an effective date.

By Senator Crawford—

**SB 794**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to tax on sales, use, and other transactions; amending s. 212.05, F.S.; providing application of said tax to the sale of boats and to boats purchased outside the state; authorizing posting of bond under certain conditions; providing for refunds; providing for issuance of repair permits and for registration of repair or docking facilities; providing for issuance of a cruise permit by the Department of Natural Resources; providing for fees; providing penalties and providing for seizure of boats; exempting the Department of Revenue from certain costs, fees, and claims; providing for amnesty for certain taxpayers; providing for rules; providing an effective date.

**SB 796**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to tax collection; amending s. 192.091, F.S.; deleting provisions which authorize a tax collector to receive a commission on licenses; amending s. 197.0155, F.S.; increasing the minimum amount of ad valorem taxes which may be prepaid in installments; amending s. 197.0158, F.S.; establishing a minimum amount of ad valorem taxes due which, if not paid, will not be collected; amending s. 197.086, F.S.; prescribing fees to be paid by certain delinquent taxpayers; amending s. 197.132, F.S.; increasing the fee for duplicate tax certificates; amending s. 197.141, F.S.; increasing the service charge for endorsing a tax certificate; amending s. 197.151, F.S.; establishing a minimum charge for redemption of certain tax certificates; amending s. 197.186, F.S.; increasing the service charge on certain unclaimed redemption moneys; amending s. 197.241, F.S.; permitting consolidated applications for tax certificates; modifying certain deadlines for certain applications; requiring payment of current taxes before issuance of a tax deed; providing an effective date.

**SB 800**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to health maintenance organizations; amending s. 641.31, F.S.; providing that such organizations shall make available, for an appropriate additional premium, care provided by osteopathic physicians, chiropractic physicians, and podiatrists; providing an effective date.

**SB 801**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to legal classification; requiring that Native Americans be designated as such for purposes of identification; providing an effective date.

**SB 802**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to nursing homes; amending s. 400.021, F.S., redefining the term "nursing home facility"; amending s. 400.141, F.S., providing that every licensed nursing home facility shall provide nursing services under the direction of a registered nurse on the premises at all times; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committee on Health and Rehabilitative Services.

**SB 803**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the regulation of scuba diving; providing definitions; creating the Board of Scuba Instruction and providing for its composition; providing exemptions; providing for the regulation of scuba instructors and scuba instructor's assistants; establishing qualifications and providing for the examination and licensure of scuba instructors; providing for the renewal of licenses; providing for the adoption of rules; establishing qualifications for scuba instructor's assistants; requiring registration of such assistants; establishing guidelines for scuba instructor training schools and providing for the licensure of such schools; requiring reports; establishing prohibited acts; providing grounds for the discipline of licensees and registrants; providing penalties; providing an exemption from examination for certain persons; providing standards for compressed air used in recreational sport diving; providing for the testing of compressed air; providing exemptions from such testing; requiring certification for certain air stations providing compressed air; providing penalties; amending s. 20.30, F.S.; providing conforming language; amending s. 861.065, F.S.; requiring persons operating vessels within a certain distance of a divers-down flag to take certain actions; providing penalties; providing an effective date.

**SB 814**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to uniform traffic control; creating s. 316.1951, F.S., prohibiting parking of motor vehicles, vessels, or other personal property for specified purposes for which a penalty is provided by law; providing an effective date.

**SB 815**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to water management districts; amending s. 373.0693, F.S.; providing for the subdivision of the Southwest Florida Water Management District into three subdistricts; providing for boundaries; providing for the power to provide for the number and boundaries of basins at a future date; amending s. 373.0695, F.S.; providing for the duties of basin boards; amending s. 373.0697, F.S., relating to basin taxes; providing that the governing board of the district shall review basin budgets; amending s. 373.503, F.S., relating to district taxation, to provide tax millage requirements for the Southwest Florida Water Management District; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Natural Resources and Conservation; Finance, Taxation and Claims; and Appropriations.

**SB 816**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the tax on sales, use, and other transactions; authorizing counties to levy a discretionary additional 1 percent tax for the 1987 calendar year; creating a trust fund for deposit of proceeds; specifying the purposes for which the proceeds from the tax may be used; providing for the administration, collection, and distribution of tax proceeds; providing penalties; providing for a referendum; providing severability; providing an effective date.

**SB 817**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to bridge designation; designating the bridge at AIA spanning the Nassau River from Amelia Island into Duval County as the "Alexander G. **SB 818**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to state procurement of personal property and services; creating s. 14.28, F.S., creating a Minority Enterprise Advocacy Office in the Executive Office of the Governor; amending s. 17.11, F.S., requiring the Comptroller to provide such advocacy office with certain information; amending s. 255.05, F.S., exempting certain public building or public work contracts from payment and performance bond requirements; amending s. 287.012, defining "minority business enterprise"; amending s. 287.042, F.S., requiring the Division of Purchasing of the Department of General Services to help identify services, commodities, and projects of state agencies that could be provided by such enterprises; deleting a criminal penalty for false representation as a minority owned business, creating s. 287.0422, F.S., creating a Minority Enterprise Assistance Office in the Department of General Services and providing its duties; creating s. 287.0423, F.S., providing for the certification of minority business enterprises; creating s. 287.0424, F.S., providing duties of state agencies regarding such enterprises; amending s. 287.055, F.S., requiring state agencies to consider whether a firm is a certified minority business enterprise in the procurement of professional services; amending s. 287.062, F.S., authorizing agencies to reserve certain contracts for such enterprises; creating s. 287.085, F.S., requiring state agencies to give certain preference to such enterprises; creating s. 287.086, F.S., providing a corporate income tax credit for corporations contracting with the state which use such enterprises; amending s. 287.094, F.S., declaring contractors with the state in breach of contract for failure to adhere to obligations to use of such enterprises; providing exceptions; providing penalties; providing for injunctions; providing for review and repeal; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Governmental Operations; Finance, Taxation and Claims; and Appropriations.

**SB 819**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to school-age child care; providing legislative intent; creating the School-Age Child Care Incentives Program; creating the School-Age Child Care Incentives Trust Fund; providing for distribution of funds; establishing criteria governing eligibility for state grants from the trust fund; requiring an annual report; amending s. 228.061, F.S.; authorizing public schools to conduct school-age child care programs; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Education and Appropriations.

By Senator Thurman—

**SB 820**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to elections; creating s. 99.013, F.S., relating to the residency requirement of law for public officers and candidates for public office; defining "residency requirement," "resident," and "residence"; requiring that certain candidates or public officers have only one declared residence; providing prima facie proof thereof; providing factors to be considered; providing for investigation of violations by the Florida Elections Commission; amending s. 106.18, F.S., requiring omission from the ballot of the name of any candidate found in violation of the residency requirement of law; amending s. 106.25, F.S., granting the Florida Elections Commission authority to investigate, consider, and determine such violations; providing procedure; amending s.

106.26, F.S., providing procedure upon a determination that such a violation has occurred or has not occurred; amending s. 114.01, F.S., relating to vacancy in office, to conform; providing an effective date.

**SB 821**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; amending s. 228.041, F.S.; including academically talented students within the definition of “exceptional student”; amending s. 236.081, F.S.; providing an academically talented cost factor in the Florida Education Finance Program; providing an effective date.

**SB 822**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to adoption; amending s. 63.092, F.S., providing that a written recommendation based on the preliminary study in an adoption case be mailed to the petitioner; providing a time period for petitioning the court for a determination as to the suitability of the intended placement by an intermediary; amending s.

63.162, F.S., providing that the Department of Health and Rehabilitative Services shall be given notice of hearing in the case of nonagency and agency adoptions; providing an effective date.
