## INTRODUCTION AND REFERENCE OF BILLS

## First Reading

By Senator Stuart—

**SJR 824**—A joint resolution proposing an amendment to Section 9 of Article VII and the creation of Section 20 of Article XII of the State Constitution relating to ad valorem taxation for water management purposes.

—was referred to the Committees on Natural Resources and Conservation; Finance, Taxation and Claims; and Rules and Calendar.

By Senator Meek—

**SB 825**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to alcohol and drug abuse; creating s. 233.0661, F.S., directing the Department of Education, in consultation with professionals in the field of alcohol and drug abuse and the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles, to establish an alcohol and drug abuse program; directing the State Board of Education to determine the contents of the program and its duration; providing required elements of the program; authorizing private schools to obtain approval of certain course curricula; creating s. 233.0662, F.S., creating the Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention and Education Trust Fund; providing funding; amending s. 316.193, F.S., providing a mandatory fine, to be deposited in such trust fund, for driving while under the influence of alcoholic or other substance or with an unlawful blood alcohol content or while intoxicated; amending s. 322.09, F.S., directing the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles not to issue any driver's license to any person under 18 years of age who does not present proof of satisfactory completion of the alcohol and drug abuse program; providing an effective date.

**SB 826**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; amending s. 229.8055, F.S.; revising the Florida Environmental Education Act; providing duties of the Department of Education; creating an Office of Environmental Education and providing its duties; revising provisions relating to environmental education projects; requiring reports; providing for an Environmental Education Advisory Committee; providing for review and repeal; providing an effective date.

**SB 829**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to vehicle theft; creating s. 812.15, F.S., providing definitions; authorizing law enforcement officers to seize a vehicle or vehicle part reasonably believed to be stolen or to have had its identification number altered or removed; providing for release and disposition of the vehicle or part; providing an effective date.

**SB 832**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to tax collectors; adjusting certain service fees collected by tax collectors; amending s. 319.32, F.S., relating to issuance, duplication or transfer of certificates of title; amending s. 320.04, F.S., relating to registration of motor vehicles; amending s. 320.065, F.S., relating to registration of certain rental trailers; amending s. 320.0815, F.S., relating to mobile homes and recreational vehicles license plates or stickers; amending s. 327.11, F.S., relating to vessel registration; amending s. 327.25, F.S., relating to vessel registration service fees; amending s. 328.03, F.S., relating to vessel certificates of title; amending s. 372.57, F.S., relating to fishing, hunting, and trapping licenses; amending s. 372.5712, F.S., relating to waterfowl stamps; amending s. 372.573, F.S., relating to permits to use commission lands; amending s. 372.60, F.S., relating to issuing duplicate licenses; amending s. 372.65, F.S., relating to freshwater fish or frog dealer's license; providing an effective date.

**SB 833**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the State University System; amending s. 240.233, F.S.; prohibiting use of standardized test scores as an admission requirement; prohibiting the admission of students who do not have a specified grade-point average; prohibiting exceptions to admissions requirements; providing an effective date.

**SB 834**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Mississippi-Louisiana-Alabama-Florida Rapid Rail Transit Compact; providing for entry of the state into said compact for the purpose of studying the feasibility of rail passenger service between the states; providing for appointment of a joint commission; providing powers and duties; providing an effective date.

**SB 835**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; amending s. 236.25, F.S., relating to the district school tax for capital outlay purposes and the purchase of new and replacement equipment; providing an effective date.

**SB 840**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to uniform traffic control; amending s. 316.003, F.S.; defining "passenger motor vehicle" and "multipurpose passenger vehicle"; creating s. 316.310, F.S.; requiring the installation and maintenance of bumpers on passenger motor vehicles; adopting an impact-resistance standard; creating s. 316.312, F.S.; requiring the installation and maintenance of bumpers on multipurpose passenger vehicles and certain trucks; establishing a maximum bumper height; providing an exemption; creating s. 316.314, F.S.; prohibiting the operation upon the streets and highways of a passenger motor vehicle, a multipurpose passenger vehicle, or a certain type of truck with an altered or modified suspension system; establishing a standard of measurement; providing an exemption for vehicles in tow; providing penalties; providing an effective date.

**SB 843**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to school buses; amending s. 234.211, F.S.; specifying limits of insurance coverage on school buses operated by certain nongovernmental entities; providing an effective date.

**SB 844**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Florida Atlantic University West Palm Beach Center; amending section 2 of chapter 82-247, Laws of Florida, as amended; providing the use of a certain parcel of land by the United Way of Palm Beach County, Incorporated; deleting the requirement that certain land revert to the state; authorizing the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund to execute certain title documents; directing the board to execute title documents required by this act as soon as practical; providing an effective date.
