INTRODUCTION AND REFERENCE OF BILLS

SB 705—A bill to be entitled An act relating to chemical substances; requiring each person who sells or delivers specified substances to maintain a record with respect to each sale or delivery; specifying content of such records; providing for inspection of the record; providing retention period; providing penalties for failure to maintain the record and for making false statements in the record; providing for rules; providing an effective date.

—was referred to the Committees on Health and Rehabilitative Services; Judiciary-Criminal; and Commerce.

SB 706—A bill to be entitled An act relating to education; amending s. 228.087, F.S., expanding the scope of certain summer camp programs to all elementary and secondary students; providing an effective date.

SB 707—A bill to be entitled An act relating to removal or destruction of newspapers; providing that the knowing and malicious removal of a newspaper from the property of another or the destruction of such newspaper is a noncriminal infraction; providing civil penalties; providing for injunctions; providing a rule of construction; providing an effective date.

SB 708—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the Local Government Transportation Assistance Act; amending ss. 334.046 and 335.20, F.S.; revising eligibility requirements for matching grants to local governments under said act; providing for reimbursement to local governments of the entire cost of projects eligible under said act under certain conditions; providing authorized uses for such reimbursement; providing an effective date.

SB 713—A bill to be entitled An act relating to outdoor advertising; amending s. 479.01, F.S.; redefining the term "unzoned commercial or industrial area"; amending s. 479.04, F.S., relating to license fees, to correct a cross-reference; amending s. 479.07, F.S., relating to sign permits; providing clarifying language; providing that certain sign permits shall become void; amending s. 479.107, F.S.; revising applicability requirements with respect to the removal of signs on highway rights-of-way; providing a definition; amending s. 479.11, F.S.; prohibiting signs in certain areas; amending s. 479.26, F.S.; increasing allowable measurements for certain signs; creating s. 479.32, F.S.; providing for a tourist-oriented directional sign program; creating s. 479.34, F.S.; creating a Travel Information Advisory Council; creating s. 479.36, F.S.; providing for designated scenic highways; repealing s. 338.065, F.S., relating to general motorist services signs and business logo signs; providing for review and repeal; providing an effective date.

moneys in the trust fund to counties for construction of certain road projects; providing circumstances for appropriation of such moneys to the Department of Transportation; providing for bonding; requiring agreements between counties and the department; subjecting counties to requirements of general law relating to road construction for projects funded by the additional tax; providing intent; amending s. 337.11, F.S.; providing for rejection of certain bids; requiring a person protesting a bid decision to post bond; providing deadlines for award and execution of contracts and for issuance of authorization to proceed; requiring contracts to specify deadlines and the effect of failure to meet deadlines; requiring withholding of a portion of periodic payments prior to completion and acceptance of a project; providing an effective date.
