**SB 1008**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to litter control; creating the "Solid Waste Management, Litter Control, and Recycling Act"; providing legislative findings; providing legislative goals; specifying duties of the Department of Commerce in administering the act; providing responsibilities with respect to recycling; providing for education of the public; providing for monitoring and evaluation; creating the Solid Waste Management Study Commission; providing for appointment of members and powers and duties of the commission; providing for abolishment review and abolishment of the commission; requiring reports to the Legislature; providing restrictions on beverage containers; providing penalties; providing an effective date.

**CS for SB 858**—A bill to be entitled An act relating to public health units; amending s. 154.04, F.S.; providing conditions under which a registered nurse working in a county public health unit may assess a patient and order and deliver medications; restricting the medications which may be issued; requiring written protocols; providing for inspection of protocols and records; providing for rules; providing for annual evaluation of the effects of the act; providing effective and repeal dates.
