WHEREAS, Monica Farrell performed with the USO for President Reagan during the ceremony relighting the Statue of Liberty, and

WHEREAS, Monica Farrell was Guest Conductor for the Jacksonville Symphony Orchestra under Maestro Skitch Henderson, and

WHEREAS, Monica Farrell is currently a senior honors student at Jacksonville University, and

WHEREAS, among her many accomplishments are membership in the Who's Who Among College Students, Mu Phi Epsilon Music Fraternity, and Phi Kappa Lambda, and

WHEREAS, representing Florida, Monica Farrell won the talent competition in the 1985 Miss America Pageant, and

WHEREAS, Monica Farrell was crowned Miss Florida USA 1988 on August 9, 1987, and

WHEREAS, Monica Farrell will represent Florida at the Miss USA Pageant on March 1, 1988, and

WHEREAS, Florida is fortunate to have bright, young people serve as representatives, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the Senate of the State of Florida:

INTRODUCTION AND REFERENCE OF BILLS

On motion by Senator Johnson, by the required constitutional two-thirds vote of the Senate the following bill was admitted for introduction:

By Senators Johnson, Beard, Frank, Grant, Woodson, Peterson and Crawford—

SB 31-B—A bill to be entitled An act relating to building designations; naming building six of the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles located in Tampa the "Clinton James Hutches Building"; authorizing the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles to erect suitable markers; providing an effective date.

—which was referred to the Committee on Governmental Operations.

On motion by Senator Johnson, by two-thirds vote SB 31-B was withdrawn from the Committee on Governmental Operations and by unanimous consent taken up instanter.

On motions by Senator Johnson, by two-thirds vote SB 31-B was read the second time by title and by two-thirds vote read the third time by title, passed and certified to the House. The vote on passage was:
