certain information relating to persons with AIDS and AIDS Related Complex; amending s. 384.34, F.S.; providing a penalty for engaging in sexual intercourse while infected with human immunodeficiency virus; providing an effective date.

building and loan associations may invest, without limitation, in securities of, or other interests in, certain open-end or closed-end management type investment companies or investment trusts registered under the Investment Company Act of 1940; providing an effective date.
