WHEREAS, the Florida Council of the American Electronics Association and the Florida High Technology and Industry Council believe that a healthy business environment is the key to leadership in the "information age," and

WHEREAS, the Florida Council of the American Electronics Association and the Florida High Technology and Industry Council encourage electronics and information technology companies to grow in Florida, and

WHEREAS, the Florida Council of the American Electronics Association and the Florida High Technology and Industry Council assist this high growth industry in the export of Florida made products, and

WHEREAS, the Florida Council of the American Electronics Association and the Florida High Technology and Industry Council provide technological training and management education for Florida residents, and

WHEREAS, the Florida Council of the American Electronics Association and the Florida High Technology and Industry Council improve the educational system with particular emphasis on engineering and computer science graduate education, and

WHEREAS, the Florida Council of the American Electronics Association and the Florida High Technology and Industry Council encourage high tech development that will create jobs and tax revenues for Florida, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the Senate of the State of Florida:

That the Florida Senate hereby recognizes May 11, 1989, as "High Tech Day" in the State of Florida.
