By Senator Kirkpatrick—

SB 310-H—A bill to be entitled An act relating to the advance disposal fee program; amending s. 403.7197, F.S.; revising dates relating to implementing the advance disposal fee program; providing an effective date.

On motions by Senator Kirkpatrick, by unanimous consent **SB 310-H** was taken up out of order and by two-thirds vote read the second time by title.

On motion by Senator Kirkpatrick, by two-thirds vote **SB 310-H** was read the third time by title, passed and certified to the House. The vote on passage was:
