## CONSIDERATION OF RESOLUTIONS

On motion by Senator Sullivan, by two-thirds vote **SR 1384** was withdrawn from the Committee on Rules and Calendar.

On motion by Senator Sullivan—

**SR 1384**—A resolution recognizing February 6 through February 12, 1994, as National Burn Awareness Week.

WHEREAS, over 2,500,000 burn injuries occur each year in the United States and Canada with over 100,000 people being treated in hospitals and emergency facilities for scald burns every year, and

WHEREAS, a majority of these burns are caused by contact with hot tap water and hot liquid spills, and

WHEREAS, the projected nationwide cost for providing intensive burn care totals over \$1 billion annually, and

WHEREAS, over 100 children a day are treated in emergency rooms for kitchen and scald burns, and

WHEREAS, scalds are the number one cause of burns in children, and

WHEREAS, burns are the number one cause of accidental deaths in children under 2 years of age, and

WHEREAS, children under 5 years of age and adults 65 years of age and older are the most seriously and frequently affected, and

WHEREAS, the Burn Awareness Coalition and Task Force, comprised of many top burn doctors, nurses, burn foundation leaders, firefighter organizations, and other concerned individuals, across the United States and Canada, report that burn-prevention education could reduce the number of burns by up to 75 percent, and

WHEREAS, the prevention of scald burns is one of the important issues being addressed by the Burn Awareness Coalition, and

WHEREAS, these injuries and many thousands of deaths, could be reduced dramatically with a massive and cohesive educational public awareness campaign, and

WHEREAS, as the Burn Awareness Coalition and Task Force campaign explains, "the worst kind of burn is the one you could have prevented," NOW, THEREFORE,

*Be It Resolved by the Senate of the State of Florida:*

That this body join with concerned individuals throughout the United States and Canada in recognizing February 6 through 12, 1994, as National Burn Awareness Week.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution, with the Seal of the Senate affixed, be presented to the Burn Awareness Coalition and Task Force in recognition of its service to the people of the State of Florida.

—was taken up out of order by unanimous consent, read the second time in full and adopted.

On motion by Senator Hargrett, by two-thirds vote **SR 1348** was withdrawn from the Committee on Rules and Calendar.

On motion by Senator Hargrett—

**SR 1348**—A resolution commending the St. Peter Claver Catholic Church and St. Peter Claver School on the occasion of their Centenary Celebration.

WHEREAS, St. Peter Claver School was established in February, 1894, by the Catholic church to provide educational opportunities for African-American children in the City of Tampa, and

WHEREAS, the first school year closed on June 10, 1895, with examinations being given to 80 pupils by Father Philip de Carriere, S.J., and

WHEREAS, in February, 1896, a new school building built by Father Tyrrell was ready for occupancy, and

WHEREAS, on June 12, 1896, at the feast of the Sacred Heart, the school was blessed and placed under the patronage of St. Peter Claver Church, and

WHEREAS, attendance at St. Peter Claver School increased so rapidly that by 1904, a third teacher was added to the faculty, and during the years 1901 to 1915, 18 pupils of St. Peter Claver School received teaching certificates and were teaching in various Tampa schools, and

WHEREAS, over the last one hundred years, St. Peter Claver Church and St. Peter Claver School, overcoming many adversities, have continued to provide educational opportunities for African-American students in Tampa, and

WHEREAS, from the time of its foundation until 1926, St. Peter Claver Church and School were under the direction of the priests of the Society of Jesus, and in 1926, the administration of the church and school was handed over to the Fathers of the Society of St. Joseph, who have worked tirelessly for the African-American Community, and

WHEREAS, over the years countless benefactors, including clergy and lay persons, have contributed to St. Peter Claver School and Church, realizing the intellectual and moral advantages that have come to children, boys and girls, who received the instruction provided to them by St. Peter Claver, and

WHEREAS, one of the most active of these benefactors of St. Peter Claver was Father Joseph O'Keefe, Member Emeritus of the Development Council of St. Peter Claver School, whose consistent and continuing efforts on behalf of the church and school included the building and paying off the mortgage of the Parish Hall, and

WHEREAS, St. Peter Claver Church and St. Peter Claver School are justifiably proud of a 100-year tradition of spiritual and educational leadership in Tampa's African-American community and have the respect and admiration of all of the citizens of Tampa, NOW, THEREFORE,

*Be It Resolved by the Senate of the State of Florida:*

That St. Peter Claver Church and St. Peter Claver School are commended, on this their Centenary Celebration, for their outstanding accomplishments in providing educational and moral leadership to the citizens of Tampa.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution, with the Seal of the Senate affixed, be presented to the St. Peter Claver School, the Church, and Father Callist Nyambo, incumbent pastor, as a tangible token of the sentiments of the Florida Senate.

Local governments which have adopted the South Florida, One and Two Family Dwelling or EPCOT Plumbing Codes may continue their use provided the requirements contained therein meet or exceed the requirements of the State Plumbing Code.*

(2) *Subsection (1) shall not apply to recreational vehicles.*

Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 1994.
