SR 1966—A resolution commemorating the celebration of Saint Patrick's Day on March 17, 1996

WHEREAS, Saint Patrick is responsible for bringing literacy to the people of Ireland, which led to Ireland's status as one of the most literary nations in the world, and

WHEREAS, there are over forty million Americans, including over three million Floridians and a significant number of members of the Florida Legislature, of Irish ancestry, and

WHEREAS, Americans and Floridians of Irish birth or Irish descent have played a significant role in the building of America and Florida, especially in military and government service, business, politics, and the arts, and

WHEREAS, the 1988 Florida Legislature adopted the MacBride Principles, providing that state retirement funds not be invested in companies operating in Northern Ireland which discriminate in their hiring practices, and

WHEREAS, Florida is the home of Bob Linnon, National President of the Irish American Unity Conference, a national organization working for nonviolent solutions for peace with justice in a united Ireland and sponsors the national campaign for the MacBride Principles, and

WHEREAS, Florida's Capital City has established a Sister City Program with Sligo, Ireland, and

WHEREAS, prospects for peace in all of Ireland are growing brighter through the efforts of decent people in many areas of the world, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the Senate of the State of Florida:

That the Senate joins with the Irish-American Caucus and all Floridians of good heart on this Saint Patrick's Day, March 17, 1996, in celebrating the continuing contributions of Irish Americans, their spirit, and their dreams for peace and brotherhood.

WHEREAS, during its first century of service to this country, the Jewish War Veterans of the United States of America, Inc., has been dedicated to promoting the welfare and special needs of all veterans and has promoted Americanism and patriotism, combated anti-Semitism and racism wherever it has occurred, and advocated the doctrine of freedom, universal rights, and eternal freedom for all Americans, and

WHEREAS, by instilling love of country, promoting awareness in community, honoring the memories of those who have made the ultimate sacrifice in defense of this nation, and tending to the graves of the fallen, Jewish War Veterans of the United States of America, Inc., has helped create a better place in which to live, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Resolved by the Senate of the State of Florida, the House of Representatives Concurring:

SENATOR DUDLEY PRESIDING

Senator Bankhead moved the following amendment which was adopted:

Amendment 2—On page 21, lines 4-7, delete those lines and insert:

(2) A local WAGES coalition and a jobs and education regional board may be combined into one board if the membership complies with subsection (1). Notwithstanding paragraph (1)(b), in a region in which the duties of the two boards are combined, a person may be a member of the WAGES coalition even if the member, or the member's principal, could benefit financially from transactions of the coalition.
