Forms of Common Motions

To take up a bill for second reading either on same day as first reading or without reading text:

Mr. President, I move that the rules be waived and Senate Bill No. be read a second time by title only.

To take up a bill for third reading on same day as second reading:

Mr. President, I move that the rules be further waived and Senate Bill No. be read the third time in full and placed upon its passage.

To take up a bill, which has been amended, for third reading on same day as second reading:

Mr. President, I move that the rules be further waived and Senate Bill No. as amended be read a third time in full and placed upon its passage.

To take up a bill for third reading on a day other than that of second reading:

Mr. President, I move that Senate Bill No. be read a third time in full and placed upon its passage.

To take up a bill out of order:

Mr. President, I wish to give 15 minutes notice of motion that Senate Bill No. in column of page . . . of the Calendar, be considered now, out of regular order. (Rule 7.13, unanimous consent).

To introduce a bill out of order:

Mr. President, I wish to give 30 minutes notice of my intention to ask unanimous consent to introduce a bill out of order. (Rule 6.8).

To substitute a companion bill (when both on same reading):

Mr. President, I move that House Bill No. , a companion measure which is now on page of the Senate Calendar, be substituted for and considered in lieu of Senate Bill No.

To substitute a companion bill (when House bill on different reading):

Mr. President, I move the rules be waived and House Bill No. a companion measure which is now on page of the Senate Calendar, be taken up, read, substituted for and considered in lieu of Senate Bill No. (Rule 6.11, $\frac{2}{3}$ vote).

To withdraw bill from calendar and refer to a committee:

Mr. President, I move that Senate Bill No...... which is now on the Calendar, column, page...., be withdrawn from the Calendar and referred to the Committee on (Rule 5.9, $\frac{2}{3}$ vote).

To recommit bill:

To convene Committee of Whole:

Mr. President, I move that the Senate do now resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole. (Rule 5.12, $\frac{2}{3}$ vote).

To place a measure on the Calendar despite unfavorable report:

Mr. President, I move that Senate Bill No. be placed on the Calendar, the unfavorable report of the

Committee on to the contrary notwithstanding. (Rule 5.10, $\frac{2}{3}$ vote).
To extend time for committee consideration:
Mr. President, I move the rules be waived and the committee on be granted an additional days for the further consideration of Senate Bill No
To jointly refer a bill:
Mr. President, I move that Senate Bill No which is now in the Committee on be also referred to the Committee on (Rule 7.7, 2/3 vote).
To change vote after announcement of roll call:
Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent of the Senate to be recorded as voting "yea" (or "nay") on the final passage of Senate Bill No , which passed
Personal Privilege:
Mr. President, I rise to a point of personal privilege and ask permission to address the Senate.
To move adoption of an amendment:
Mr. President, I move the adoption of the amendment.
To concur in House amendments:
Mr. President, I move that the Senate concur in House amendment No to Senate Bill No
To refuse to concur in House amendments:
Mr. President, I move that the Senate refuse to concur in House amendment No to Senate Bill

To recede from Senate amendment:

Mr. President, I move that the Senate recede from Senate amendment No. to House Bill No.

Conference Committee:

To rush general bills to House after final passage:

Mr. President, I move the rules be waived and Senate Bill No. be immediately certified to the House.

To indefinitely postpone:

Mr. President, I move that Senate Bill No. (with pending amendments) be indefinitely postponed.

Reconsideration (immediate):

Mr. President, I move that the rules be waived and the Senate do now reconsider the vote by which Senate Bill No. passed (failed to pass).

Reconsideration:

Mr. President, I move that the Senate reconsider the vote by which Senate Bill No. passed (failed to pass).

To hold a bill in its current status until the next legislative day:

Mr. President, I move that consideration of Senate Bill No. be deferred, the bill retaining its place on the Calendar. To convene Senate at other than the regular time:

Mr. President, I move that the rules be waived and when the Senate adjourns that it adjourn to reconvene at a. m. p. m. tomorrow (date).

To adjourn instanter:

Mr. President, I move that the Senate do now adjourn.

To adjourn at a future time:

Mr. President, I move that the rules be waived and the Senate adjourn (at a. m. p. m.) (after completion of consideration of).

To hold an Executive Session:

Mr. President, I move that the Senate proceed to the consideration of executive business.

Vetoed Bill:

Mr. President, I move that Senate Bill No. of the 19.... session be passed, the veto of the Governor to the contrary notwithstanding.

Mr. President, I move that the Governor's veto of Senate Bill No. Session, be sustained.
