12. Consideration of Bills and Joint Resolutions on Third Reading.
13. Consideration of Bills and Joint Resolutions on Second Reading.
14. Correction and approval of Journal.
15. Miscellaneous Business.
16. Petitions and Memorials.

On the first legislative day of each week the Daily Order of Business shall include, after prayer, The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

At 8:30 a.m. every legislative day, the President shall call the Senate to order for the sole purpose of conducting the order of business of "Introduction and reference of Resolutions, Memorials, Bills and Joint Resolutions".
