

## CONSTITUTIONAL VOTE REQUIRED

*(membership of 40)*

### TWO-THIRDS

- (M) Introduce, during special session, business not within purview of proclamation (Article III, § 3(c)(1))
- (M) Take up new business during extended session (Article III, § 3(d))
- (M) Expel member (Article III, § 4(d))
- (P) Waive 3 separate days for reading of bill (Article III, § 7)
- (P) Override veto (Article III, § 8(c))
- (P) Convict impeached officer (Article III, § 17(c))
- (M) Repeal court rule (Article V, § 2(a))
- (M) Increase or decrease number of judgeships recommended by Supreme Court (Article V, § 9)
- (M) Enact a bill increasing state revenues (Article VII, § 1(e))
- (M) Enact general bill requiring counties or municipalities to spend money or take action requiring expenditure of money (Exceptions apply) (Article VII, § 18(a))
- (M) Enact general bill reducing authority of counties or municipalities to raise aggregate revenues above 2-1-89 level (Exceptions apply) (Article VII, § 18(b))
- (M) Enact general bill reducing the percentage of a state tax shared with counties or municipalities below 2-1-89 level (Exceptions apply) (Article VII, § 18(c))
- (M) Authorize higher education capital outlay bonds in excess of \$50 million (Article XII, § 9(3 note))

### THREE-FOURTHS

- (M) Enact bill for special election on constitutional amendment (Article XI, § 5(a))

### THREE-FIFTHS

- (P) Extend session (Article III, § 3(d))
- (M) Prohibit special law pertaining to specified subject (Article III, § 11(a)(21))
- (M) Creation of trust fund (Article III, § 19(f)(1))
- (M) Exceed limit on corporate income tax (Article VII, § 5(b))
- (M) Propose constitutional amendment (Joint Resolution) (Article XI, § 1)
- (P) Authorize interest above 5% on certain school bonds (Article XII, § 9(d)(5))
- (P) Authorize interest above 5% on certain bonds (Article XII, § 9(2 note))

- (M) Authorize higher education capital outlay project financed by bonds (Article XII, § 9(4 note))
- (P) Authorize interest above 5% on certain school bonds (Article XII, § 9(5 note))

## CONSTITUTIONAL PUBLIC REVIEW PERIOD

General appropriation bills—72 hour public review period required before final passage (Article III, § 19(d))

Bills increasing state revenues—72 hour period after third reading before final passage (Article VII, § 1(e))
