Trust Funds Termination Within DOT; terminates specified trust funds & fund accounts within DOT; provides for transfer of current balances to general revenue, paying of outstanding debts & obligations, & removal of terminated funds & accounts from various state accounting systems. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 3477 by Bronson (Identical S 0560)

Determination of Millage; authorizes taxing authorities to adopt tax levies & budgets of their dependent special taxing districts by single votes, unless member of public requests separate discussion & vote for tax levy or budget of any such district. Amends 200.065. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 3479 by Bronson (Compare CS/H 1847)

Agriculture Emergencies; distributes municipal tax on motor fuel to Agriculture Emergency Eradication TF; distributes fuel sales tax deposited in Fuel Tax Collection TF to said Agriculture TF; distributes State Comp. Enhanced Transp. System Tax deposited in Fuel Tax Collection TF to said Agric. TF; distributes local option fuel tax to said Agric. TF; takes effect July 1 of year enacted if CS/H1847 or similar legislation is adopted in same legislative session, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3481 by Culp, Effman and Trovillion (Identical S 0832)

Information Resources Management; provides that certain information resources management projects are not required in agency strategic plans; provides that certain info resource management projects are not subject to mandatory notice & review requirements for amendments to agencies' original approved operating budgets; provides that certain coordinating councils & boards are required to develop annual performance reports, etc. Amends Ch. 282, 186.021, .022, 215.96, 216.181. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 3483 by Morrioni

Elections/Polling Places; revises provisions re solicitation of voters near polling places; provides for removal of certain persons from polling rooms & polling places & their vicinity. Amends 102.031. Effective Date: 07/01/1998.

HB 3485 by Safley (Identical S 0152)

Governor/Powers & Duties; regulates nomination of appointees to federal regional fisheries management councils. Amends 14.23. Effective Date: 01/01/1999.

HB 3487 by Safley (Identical S 0792)

Dental Insurance Coverage; requires health insurance policies & contracts to provide coverage for general anesthesia & hospitalization for certain persons under certain circumstances. Creates 627.4295, .65755; amends 627.6471, .6472, 641.31. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 3489 by Heyman, Stafford, Culp, Villalobos, Hafner and Meek (Identical S 0798)

Sexual Offenses Against Children; requires CFS Dept. to report within specified period each alleged juvenile offense involving child victim under 16 years of age to appropriate law enforcement agency having jurisdiction over offense; prohibits any person at least 21 years of age from engaging in sexual activity with person 16 or 17 years of age; provides exception for acts between married persons; redefines "child abuse", etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3491 by Boyd (Similar CS/S 0380)

Florida Retirement System; increases retiree health insurance subsidy payment & contribution rate; clarifies benefits payable under existing systems; changes contribution rates for specified classes & subclasses of system & for retiree health insurance subsidy; provides for benefit computations using dual retirement ages for service in Senior Management Service Class & Elected State & County Officer's Class, etc. Amends 112.363, Ch. 121. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HJR 3493 by Arnold

Public Education Funding; constitutional amendment, effective July 1, 2002, to require appropriation of at least 40 percent of total appropriations each year for public education, excluding lottery proceeds & federal funds; allows Legislature to suspend this requirement for any one year or portion thereof by separate bill approved by two-thirds vote. Amends s. 1, Art. IX, creates s. 22, Art. XII.

HB 3495 by Ball (Similar S 0678)

Crime Prevention Education; provides legislative findings; authorizes Legal Affairs Dept., state attorneys, DOC, Juvenile Justice Dept., Parole Commission, State Courts Administrator, county sheriff's & local police departments, & other law enforcement agencies to participate in crime prevention & crime prevention education activities. Creates 960.0015. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3497 by Ball (Similar S 0712)

Municipalities/Business Enterprises; provides legislative findings; authorizes municipal governing bodies to expend public funds to attract & retain business enterprises; specifies that such use of public funds constitutes public purpose & defines economic development activities that qualify as such public purpose. Amends 166.021. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 3499 by Futch (Similar S 0820)

Skateboarding or Rollerblading; provides legislative purpose; provides definitions; provides limitations on liability re governmental entities & public employees re persons who participate in skateboarding or rollerblading activities on property owned or leased by governmental entity; provides exceptions; provides for liability of independent concessionaires or other persons or organizations for certain injuries or damages, etc. Creates 316.0085. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 3501 by Livingston

Small Business Tech. Growth Program; creates Fla. Small Business Technology Growth Program; requires technology development board of Enterprise Florida, Inc., to administer & manage program; requires board to establish separate account in Florida Technology Research Investment Fund for certain purposes; specifies sources of moneys in account; provides program purposes; provides criteria for awards of assistance from program, etc. Creates 288.95155. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 3503 by Laurent (Compare S 0312)

Water Resource Management; provides legislative policy re state & regional water resource management; encourages use of water from sources nearest area of need; defines "donor area"; clarifies legislative

intent that water resource development is function of water management districts; requires additional information in permit applications for proposed transport & use of water pursuant to certain provision, etc. Amends Ch. 373, reenacts 373.536(5)(c). Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HJR 3505 by Crist

Death Penalty/Execution Method; constitutional amendment to preserve death penalty, & permit any execution method unless prohibited by Federal constitution; requires construction of prohibition against cruel or unusual punishment to conform to US Supreme Court interpretation of Eighth Amendment; prohibits reduction of death sentence based on invalidity of execution method, & provides for continued force of sentence, etc. Amends s. 17, Art. I.

HB 3507 by Crist

Judicial Nominating Commissions; provides for appointment of members of judicial nominating commissions; prohibits justices or judges from being members of said commissions; prohibits members of said commissions from holding other public office; requires that acts of said commissions be made by concurrence of majority; provides for suspension & removal of members of said commissions pursuant to uniform rules of procedure, etc. Amends 43.295, 440.45; repeals 43.29. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3509 by Constantine

Specialty License Plate Requirements; revises language re requirements for requests to establish specialty license plates; revises language re said plates to provide criteria for discontinuance of issuance of approved plates; revises language re annual required audit or report; revises language re annual use fees of said plates. Amends 320.08053, .08056, .08062. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 3511 by Constantine (Compare S 0774)

Driver License Revocations; provides permanent revocation of driver license for murder resulting from operation of motor vehicle & for vehicular homicide; eliminates ability to apply for reinstatement if person is convicted of 4 or more DUI violations; provides for commencement of period of suspension or revocation for incarcerated offenders; provides penalties for driving while license is permanently revoked, etc. Amends Ch. 322. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3513 by Livingston

Lee Co./Hyacinth Control District; provides for codified charter of its special acts in single act & repeals all prior special acts re said district as required by certain provision; provides for continuation of said district in county from effective date of this act; prescribes powers, organization, & duties of board; provides that legal authority for said district shall be construed liberally to accomplish continuation of work of said district, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 3515 by Rodriguez-Chomat

Educational Facilities/Construction; provides that buildings & activities associated with school construction shall not be considered development for purposes of Fla. Local Government Development Agreement Act; provides requirements for undertakings that involve demolition or substantial alteration; provides that buildings & activities associated with school construction shall not be considered development for purposes of land & water management, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3517 by Saunders (Compare H 3521)

Florida Green Communities; revises declaration of policy & legislative intent re "Florida Greenways & Trails Act"; authorizes development & implementation of process for designation of lands for greenways system; provides for criteria & procedures for evaluation & selection of certain projects to be funded by trust fund; restricts use of motorized vehicles on lands or waters acquired with trust fund moneys, etc. Amends Chs. 260, 216, 259, 261, 253, 380. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

HB 3519 by Saunders

Florida Green Communities; provides land acquisition procedures under "Florida Green Communities Act"; authorizes certain payment latitude where good cause is shown; provides for certain utilization of

appraisals; provides for certain disclosure of appraisal reports; provides that title to certain property may be held by local governmental entity; requires certain protection of interests of state, etc. Amends 253.025, 259.041; creates 261.02. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

HB 3521 by Saunders (Compare H 3517)

Fla. Green Communities TF/DEP; creates said trust fund within DEP; provides for sources of moneys & purposes; provides for future review & termination or re-creation of trust fund; takes effect 07/01/2000, if HB 3517 or similar legislation is adopted in same legislative session or an extension thereof. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3523 by Fuller

Landscape Designers; grants Agriculture & Consumer Services Dept. certain powers & duties, including rulemaking authority, re landscape designers; prohibits landscape designers from certain activities re nursery stock, for which there are penalties; provides requirements for application for & renewal of certificate of registration; provides for revocation & suspension of certificates of registration & fines, etc. Amends Chs. 581, 481. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3525 by Crow (Similar S 0790)

Everglades River Grass License Plate; creates Fla. Everglades River of Grass license plate; provides for distribution of annual use fees received from sale of such license plates. Amends 320.08056, .08058. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 3527 by Trovillion (Identical S 0404)

Criminal Penalty/Jail Rules; provides criminal penalty for refusing to obey jail rules & regulations. Amends 951.23. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 3529 by Trovillion, Feeney, Reddick, Sembler and Bronson (Identical S 0618)

Regional Planning Councils; prescribes membership in councils. Amends 186.504. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 3531 by Betancourt

Court Watcher's Pilot Program; provides legislative goals; directs Attorney General's Office to establish 2-year pilot program for court watchers' organization; defines "court watcher"; provides for creation & incorporation of not-for-profit court watchers' organization entitled "Alliance for Constitutional & Ethical Court Watch Program"; provides for board of directors; requires board to submit annual report to Legislature, Attorney General, & Fla. Supreme Court, etc. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3533 by Andrews

English/Speakers of Other Languages; requires school district procedures to allow parents to remove student from English for Speakers of Other Languages program without certain reassessment. Amends 233.058. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3535 by Arnall (Similar H 3005)

Employer Release of Employee Info.; expands provisions re employer immunity from liability & disclosure of information re former employees to include immunity from liability for current employers & disclosure of information re current employees; provides specified requirements of employers re background investigation of applicant for employment or appointment as full-time, part-time, or auxiliary law enforcement or correctional officer, etc. Amends 768.095. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 3537 by Andrews

Unlawful Killing/Unborn Quick Child; provides that killing unborn quick child by injury to mother which would be murder in any degree if it resulted in death of mother is murder in same degree; provides penalties; provides that unlawful killing of unborn quick child by injury to mother which would be manslaughter if it resulted in death of mother is manslaughter; provides penalties; provides applicability, etc. Amends 782.09. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 3539 by Ritter

Notification of Escaped Prisoner; requires that state correctional facility, county jail, juvenile detention facility, or residential commitment facility immediately notify sentencing judge of escaped offender. Amends 960.001. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HR 9301 by Bullard

Perrine-Cutler Ridge Council, Inc.; commends Perrine-Cutler Ridge Council, Inc., for its contributions to business & civic life of communities of Perrine & Cutler Ridge.

HR 9303 by Bullard

Brice, John R.; recognizes heroism of John R. Brice during World War II & achievements & contributions of his life.

HR 9305 by Effman, Minton and Fasano

Florida's Veterans of World War II; honors residents of State of Florida who served their country in World War II.

HR 9307 by Thrasher

Ham Jam Week in Clay County; proclaims November 5-8, 1998, as Ham Jam Week in Clay County.

HR 9309 by Roberts-Burke

Florida Memorial College; honors Florida Memorial College for more than a century of dedication & commitment to academic excellence in State of Florida.

HR 9311 by Constantine

Kuchar, Matt/U.S. Golf Association; commends & congratulates Matt Kuchar as winner of U.S. Golf Association's 1997 U.S. Amateur Championship.

HR 9313 by Morroni



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
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
