# BILLS ON CALENDAR

## SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR AS DETERMINED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES AND CALENDAR FOR THURSDAY, MARCH 5, 1998

### **CS/SB's 360, SB 350 by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senators Burt, Klein and others**

**Execution by Lethal Injection;** (THIS BILL COMBINES S360,350) provides for execution by means of lethal injection if electrocution is held to be unconstitutional; provides legislative intent. Amends 922.10. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committee on Ways and Means

### **SB 198 by Senator Klein**

**Death by Lethal Injection/Records;** provides exemptions from public records requirements for information identifying person administering lethal injection during execution of death sentence; provides for future review & repeal & finding of public necessity; takes effect on same date as similar legislation providing for execution of death sentence by lethal injection, etc. Amends 945.10. Effective Date: Contingent.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice

### **CS/SJR 964 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Lee**

**Death Penalty/Execution Method;** constitutional amendment to preserve death penalty, & permit any execution method unless prohibited by Federal Constitution; requires construction of prohibition against cruel or unusual punishment to conform to US Supreme Court interpretation of Eighth Amendment; prohibits reduction of death sentence based on invalidity of execution method, & provides for continued force of sentence, etc. Amends s. 17, Art. I.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice

### **SJR 1234 by Senator Dudley and others**

**Rules of Criminal Procedure;** constitutional amendment to allow Legislature to repeal, by general law enacted by majority vote of membership of each house, rules of criminal procedure adopted by the State Supreme Court & to provide that law enacted by Legislature governing criminal procedure prevails over any conflicting Supreme Court rule. Amends s. 2, Art. V.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice

### **SB 898 by Senator Burt**

**Postconviction/Capital Cases;** repeals Rule 3.852, Florida Rules of Criminal Procedure, re production of records in postconviction proceedings in capital cases. Effective Date: 07/01/1998 if enacted by 2/3rds vote of membership of each house of Legislature.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice

### **CS/SB 1328 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Burt**

**Capital Collateral Proceedings;** deletes requirement that specifies time for capital collateral regional counsel to commence representation of person sentenced to death; requires that Justice Administrative Commission maintain registry of attorneys in private practice who are available to be appointed to represent defendants in postconviction capital collateral proceedings; limits number of capital defendants that attorney may represent, etc. Amends Ch. 27. Effective Date: 07/01/1998.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice

### **CS/SB 1330 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Burt**

**Capital Cases/Administration;** requires that Secretary of State establish regional records repository for each capital collateral regional office; requires that public defender, law enforcement agencies, state attorney, & DOC copy & deliver records to records repository which pertain to capital case; provides requirements for sealing confidential records & records that are exempt from disclosure under Public Records Law, etc. Amends 27.702; repeals 27.708(3). Effective Date: 07/01/1998.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice

### **CS/SB 188 by the Committee on Health Care and Senator Brown-Waite**

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs

#### **CS/SB 276 by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Brown-Waite and others**

**Controlled Substances;** deletes references to dextropropoxyphene in its nondosage forms from Schedule II; adds references to propoxyphene in its nondosage forms to Schedule II; deletes references to gamma-hydroxy-butyric from Schedule II; adds references to gamma-hydroxy-butyric acid to Schedule II; adds references to ketamine to Schedule III; deletes references to dextropropoxyphene in its dosage forms from Schedule IV, etc. Amends 893.03. Effective Date: 10/01/1998.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committee on Ways and Means

#### **SB 288 by Senator Thomas and others**

**Rural Hospitals;** revises definition of "rural hospital" to increase allowable number of licensed beds; provides that rural hospitals designated after July 1, 1998, may not be included in rural hospital disproportionate share of financial assistance programs unless additional appropriations are provided. Amends 395.602, 408.07, 409.9116. Effective Date: 07/01/1998.

Reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Health Care and withdrawn from the Committee on Ways and Means

#### **CS/SB 290 by the Committee on Health Care and Senator Klein**

**Paramedics & EMTs;** provides for paramedics & emergency medical technicians to provide health promotion & wellness activities & blood pressure screenings; provides for paramedics to administer immunizations & requires verification & documentation of their qualifications to do so; provides conditions to provision of such community health care; provides for rulemaking. Amends 401.411; creates 401.272. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Care, with one amendment

**CS/SB 302 by the Committee on Community Affairs and Senator Lee**

**Regional Poison Control Center;** requires each basic & advanced life support service & air ambulance service to develop & implement prehospital emergency dispatch protocol with appropriate regional poison control center; provides that regional poison control centers shall assume responsibility & liability for calls transferred in accordance with protocol. Amends 395.1027; creates 401.268. Effective Date: 07/01/1998.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs

**CS/CS/SB 306 by the Committees on Governmental Reform and Oversight, Education, Senator Grant and others**

**Universities/Student Fee Exemptions;** revises effective date of certain fee exemptions that are provided for students who are placed in foster care or in independent living arrangement or who are adopted from CFS Department; provides for retroactive application. Amends 239.117, 240.235, .35. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Reform and Oversight, and withdrawn from the Committee on Ways and Means

**CS/SB 364 by the Committee on Health Care**

**Public Records/Natural Persons;** exempts information re natural persons in health, medical, patient, or health insurance records from public records law; provides exceptions; exempts from public discussion portions of public meetings during which contents of health, medical, patient, or health insurance information re natural person are considered; provides exceptions; provides justification for exemptions, etc. Amends 119.07, 286.011. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Care

**SB 376 by Senator Kirkpatrick**

**Solid Waste Disposal;** revises & clarifies conditions under which disposal of solid waste is exempt from DEP permitting requirements. Amends 403.707. Effective Date: Contingent.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Natural Resources and withdrawn from the Committee on Ways and Means

**SB 394 by Senator Forman**

**Human Rights Committees;** provides legislative intent re duties & powers of Statewide Human Rights Advocacy Committee & district human rights advocacy committee; provides for Statewide Human Rights Advocacy Committee to monitor activities of, & investigate complaints against, CFS Dept., Health Dept. & AHCA; revises duties of district human rights advocacy committee to conform to expanded duties of statewide committee, etc. Amends Ch. 402. Effective Date: 07/01/1998.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary

**SB 396 by Senator Forman**

**Human Rights Advocacy Councils;** redesignates Statewide Human Rights Advocacy Committee as Statewide Human Rights Advocacy Council; redesignates district human rights advocacy committees as local human rights advocacy councils & provides for additional local councils to be established; provides for local councils to monitor activities of, & investigate complaints against, CFS Dept.; conforms

terminology to changes made by act, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/1998.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families and Seniors

**SB 404 by Senator Bronson**

**Criminal Penalty/Jail Rules;** provides criminal penalty for refusing to obey jail rules & regulations. Amends 951.23. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Criminal Justice

**CS/SB 406 by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Clary**

**Land Platting;** defines terms re platting; requires plats & replats of subdivisions submitted for approval to be accompanied by boundary survey of platted lands; revises provisions re naming & replatting subdivisions; provides requirements for recording of plat; revises provisions re approval of plats by governing bodies; requires plats to be reviewed by professional surveyor & mapper before approval by governing body, etc. Amends Ch. 177. Effective Date: 07/01/1998.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries

**SB 412 by Senator Clary**

**Premium Finance Agreement Payments;** provides that any installment paid to premium finance company under premium finance agreement shall be deemed to be timely payment if it is received with postmark on or before due date; provides applicability. Amends 627.841. Effective Date: 10/01/1998.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

**SB 472 by Senator Dyer**

**Veterinary Medical Practice;** revises & provides exemptions from regulation under provisions re veterinary medical practice; requires criteria for providers of continuing education to be approved by board; exempts veterinarians licensed in another state from certain requirements for temporary licensure in this state; requires limited service permittees to register each location & provides registration fee, etc. Amends Ch. 474. Effective Date: 07/01/1998.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Regulated Industries and withdrawn from the Committee on Ways and Means

**SB 474 by Senator Dyer**

**Community Policing Innovations;** includes reduction or prevention of crime within community redevelopment activities under Community Redevelopment Act of 1969 & defines "community policing innovation"; authorizes county or municipality to appropriate funds for community policing innovations; includes community policing innovations within safe neighborhood improvement plans, etc. Amends Ch. 163; creates 943.1729. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs

**CS/SB 476 by the Committee on Transportation, Senator Dyer and others**

**Driver's License Suspension;** deletes certain additional suspension periods imposed for driving with suspended license or for failing to surrender driver's license to HSMV upon suspension or revocation;

provides suspension or revocation of driver's licenses not to be concurrent with imprisonment; authorizes issuance of driver's license for business purposes to persons with two or more DUI convictions 10 or more years apart. Amends 322.28, 271. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation

#### **SB 480 by Senator Klein**

**Controlled Substances/Child Care;** corrects misplaced statutory provision re unlawful sale or possession of controlled substance within specified area surrounding child care facility; provides that certain enhanced penalties do not apply unless owner or operator of facility posts sign identifying facility as a child care facility. Amends 893.13. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice

#### **CS/SB 486 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Silver**

**Law Enforcement Department;** provides additional authority for executive director of dept. re organization of department; provides for department to be reorganized into specified programs; deletes division structure; requires department to develop & maintain information system; authorizes department to enter into contracts; deletes requirement that certain agencies inform department of persons incarcerated or released from jail, etc. Amends Ch. 943, 20.201, 938.07. Effective Date: 07/01/1998.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and the Committee on Governmental Reform and Oversight, reports the Committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committee on Ways and Means

#### **CS/SB 492 by the Committee on Community Affairs and Senator McKay**

**Property Owners/Assessment Notice;** revises time for providing written notice of assessment to property owners; revises time in which value adjustment board hearing must be held; revises time for notice to petitioner of scheduled time of appearance before board. Amends 170.07, 194.032. Effective Date: 01/01/1999.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs and withdrawn from the Committee on Ways and Means

#### **SB 496 by Senator Kirkpatrick and others**

**State Employee Telecommuting Program;** repeals s. 3 of ch. 94-113, Laws of Florida; abrogates repeal of provision which establishes state employee telecommuting program. Abrogates repeal of 110.171. Effective Date: 10/01/1998.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Reform and Oversight, and withdrawn from the Committee on Ways and Means

#### **CS/SB 514 by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Grant and others**

**Sexual Predator Registration;** revises period of time after which sexual predator may petition court for removal of such designation; requires that court make certain determinations following petition to remove offender's designation as sexual predator; requires that state attorney be given notice of such petition; authorizes state attorney to present evidence at hearing on petition; authorizes court to allow sexual predator to petition court at future date. Amends 775.21. Effective Date: 07/01/1998.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice

#### **CS/SB 524 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Campbell**

**Offense of Murder/Redefined;** redefines offense of capital murder in first degree to include act of unlawfully killing human being while perpetrating, or attempting to perpetrate, murder of another human being; redefines offense of second-degree felony murder to include act of unlawfully killing human being while perpetrating or attempting to perpetrate murder of another human being, etc. Amends 782.04; reenacts FS. Effective Date: 10/01/1998.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committee on Ways and Means

#### **SB 526 by Senator Campbell**

**Victim & Witness/Protective Services;** redefines term "serious felony offense" to include attempt, solicitation, or conspiracy to commit certain offenses for purposes of provisions that authorize law enforcement agencies to protect victims & witnesses who are at risk of harm. Amends 914.25. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committee on Ways and Means

#### **SB 534 by Senator Kirkpatrick**

**National Guard;** revises language re payments under educational tuition assistance program administered by Military Affairs Department. Amends 250.10. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Reform and Oversight, and withdrawn from the Committee on Ways and Means

#### **SB 540 by Senator Lee**

**Emergency Medical Care Providers;** redefines term "emergency medical care providers" to include physician assistants, emergency room orderlies, & emergency room security guards; provides that term includes personnel who are performing official duties whether within or outside emergency room; provides that enhanced penalties & certain minimum sentences apply if person is convicted of assault or battery against emergency medical care provider. Amends 784.07. Effective Date: 10/01/1998.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committee on Ways and Means

#### **CS/SB 586 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Silver**

**Felony Offenses/Bodily Injury;** revises elements of offense of committing felony that causes bodily injury to provide that if person who perpetrates or attempts to perpetrate certain enumerated felony offenses & who commits, aids, or abets intentional act that could, but does not, cause death of another, the person commits first-degree felony; includes such offense in offense severity ranking chart of Criminal Punishment Code, etc. Amends 782.051, 921.0022. Effective Date: 10/01/1998.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committee on Ways and Means

#### **CS/SB 590 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Silver**

**Property Crimes;** defines term "curtilage"; removes references to unenclosed curtilage from offense of trespass on property other than structure or conveyance; defines term "authorized person"; removes

reference to unenclosed curtilage from offense of theft from dwelling. Amends 810.011,.09, 812.014. Effective Date: 07/01/1998.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice

**SB 678 by Senator Bronson**

**Victims & Witnesses/Fair Treatment;** allows specified state agencies to participate in crime-prevention & educational activities for fair treatment of victims & witnesses in justice system. Effective Date: 07/01/1998.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Governmental Reform and Oversight

**SB 734 by Senator Bronson**

**Petroleum Fuel Measuring Devices;** provides for repair & adjustment of such devices by meter mechanics; provides for notification of Agriculture & Consumer Services Department. Amends 525.07. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Agriculture

**SB 766 by Senator Diaz-Balart**

**Insurance/Continuing Education;** requires continuing education course providers & instructors to be approved by Insurance Dept.; provides for adoption of rules; provides for dept. to investigate

alleged improper conduct by customer representatives & continuing educ. course providers & instructors; provides for admin. fines in addition to other penalties for certain licensees, appointees, & other persons; increases administrative penalty. Creates 626.2816; amends 626.601,.681. Effective Date: 07/01/1998.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

**SB 768 by Senator Diaz-Balart**

**Sureties/Insurance Department;** authorizes Insurance Dept. to establish form for affidavit & statement required under certain provision, re amount & source of any security or consideration for surety bond; prescribes statement to be included on indemnity agreements. Amends 648.442. Effective Date: 10/01/1998.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

**SB 770 by Senator Diaz-Balart**

**Firefighter & Forestry Training;** provides for issuance of special certificate for administrative & command heads; provides guidelines for certain reexaminations. Amends 633.35. Effective Date: 07/01/1998.




