I. Summary:

The committee substitute designates: the swim/dive office and training facility at the University of Florida as the “Wayne and Jimmie Carse Swimming and Diving Complex”; the first Lifelong Learning Center to be constructed at Florida Atlantic University for use by the Lifelong Learning Society as the “Barry and Florence Friedberg Lifelong Learning Center”; Flint Hall at the University of Florida as “Keene-Flint Hall”; a residence hall on the Sarasota/Manatee Campus of New College of the University of South Florida as the “Peggy Bates Residence Hall”; the library tower at Florida International University the “Steven and Dorthea Green Library”; the recording facility donated to Florida State University by Echelon International Development Corporation as “Critchfield Hall”; and the Florida Resident Access Grant Program as the “William L. Boyd, IV Florida Resident Access Grant Program.”

The effective date of the bill is upon becoming a law.

The committee substitute does not amend, create, or repeal any sections of the Florida Statutes.

II. Present Situation:

Section 267.062, F.S., provides that no state building, complex, or facility may be named after a living person, except as specifically provided by law.
