1999 Rate Reduction & Equity Act; extends application of universal service provisions & carrier-of-last-resort obligations; requires PSC to make recommendations to Legislature for universal service support mechanism; requires reduction in standard residential service rates by certain time; authorizes local exchange telecommunications companies to set or change rates for premium residential services under certain circumstances, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Children/Great-grandparents' Rights; includes references to great-grandparents in definitions re dependent children; provides for great-grandparents visitation rights & right to adopt; provides for great-grandparents visitation rights & standing re evaluating custody arrangements; conforms references re such visitation rights under certain provisions; includes references to great-grandparents in definitions re delinquent children. Amends Ch. 39, 61.13, 63.0425, 172, 984.03, 985.03. Effective Date: Contingent.

Family Law & Children: Unanimously favorable with one amendment

+ **CS/HB 33** by Claims (CJC) and Sembler (Similar S 0040) ,

Relief/Weathington/Tallahassee; provides for relief of Warren Weathington for injuries sustained as result of negligent conduct of employees of City of Tallahassee. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Health & Human Services Appropriations: Unanimously favorable with one amendment

SB 40 by Campbell, Forman and Grant (Similar CS/H 0033)

Relief/Weathington/Tallahassee; provides for relief of Warren Weathington & his father, Carl Weathington, for injuries sustained as result of negligent conduct of tennis pros employed by City of Tallahassee. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Health & Human Services Appropriations: Withdrawn -

CS/HB 35 by Health Care Licensing & Regulation (HFC), Ball and Harrington (Similar S 0248)

Orthotics/Prosthetics/Pedorthics; extends deadline for person who has practiced orthotics, prosthetics, or pedorthics for required period to apply for licensure, based on person's experience & educational preparation, without meeting educational requirements set forth in statute. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Business Regulation & Consumer Affairs: Unanimously favorable; Health & Human Services Appropriations: Withdrawn

CS/HB 49 by Crime & Punishment (CRC), Trovillion, Ball, Alexander, Hart, Posey, Constantine, Heyman, Byrd and Harrington (Similar CS/S 0286, Compare H 0871, S 0722, S 1074)

Criminal Use of Personal ID Info.; provides that person who willfully & without authorization uses, or possesses with intent to use, personal ID information concerning individual without previously obtaining individual's consent commits either offense of fraudulent use of personal ID info. or offense of harassment by use of personal ID info., depending on specified circumstances; provides penalties, etc. Creates 817.568; reenacts 464.018(1)(d), 772.102(1)(a), 895.02(1)(a). Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Criminal Justice Appropriations: Withdrawn

HB 71 by Stafford, Healey, Sanderson, Farkas, Murman and Hafner (Similar S 0072)

Homicide/Vehicular & Vessel; increases penalties imposed for committing offense of vehicular homicide or vessel homicide; increases penalties imposed for committing vehicular homicide or vessel homicide & failing to give information & render aid when offender knew, or should have known, that accident occurred; amends certain provision re Criminal Punishment Code; conforms references to changes made by act. Amends 782.071, 072, 921.0022. Effective Date: Contingent.

Law Enforcement & Crime Prevention: Unanimously favorable; Crime & Punishment: Unanimously favorable; Criminal Justice Appropriations: Withdrawn

CS/HB 75 by Transportation (EDC), Fasano, Fiorentino, Russell, Byrd, Murman, Spratt and Maygarden (Compare H 0703, H 1643, CS/S 0082, S 0372, S 1730)

Designation of State Properties; codesignates portion of SR 54 in Pasco Co. as "State Trooper James Crooks Hwy."; designates Fla. Hwy. Patrol substation on SR 52 in Land O' Lakes as "State Trooper James Crooks Substation"; directs DOT to erect two additional markers for "Purple Heart Hwy." on SR 54; designates Destin Bridge at E. Pass on U.S. Hwy. 98 in Okaloosa Co. as "William T. Marler Bridge"; designates portion of SR 9 from 58th St. to Co. Line Rd. as "Carrie P. Meek Rd.", etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Transportation & Economic Development Appropriations: Unanimously favorable with one amendment

CS/CS/HB 77 by Governmental Operations (PRC), Financial Services (CAC), Flanagan, Crow, Wallace, Bainter, Goode, Bitner, Turnbull and Fasano (Similar CS/CS/S 0150, Compare H 1707, CS/S 2410)

State Financial Matters; specifies certain powers of Comptroller & Banking & Finance Dept.; specifies procedures, rights, & requirements for enforcing compliance with certain subpoenas; creates Office of Financial Investigations; provides exception to required state government structure for Banking & Finance Dept.; provides for designees of agency heads to perform specified functions re per diem & travel expenses, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 10/01/1999.

General Government Appropriations: Unanimously favorable

HB 135 by Levine, Fasano, Bense, Greenstein, Patterson, Minton, L. Miller, Cosgrove, Heyman, C. Smith, Jacobs and Crist (Identical S 0134)

Controlled Substances/Child Care; corrects misplaced statutory provision re unlawful sale or possession of controlled substance within specified area surrounding child care facility; provides that certain enhanced penalties do not apply unless owner or operator of facility posts sign identifying facility as child care facility. Amends 893.13. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Crime & Punishment: Unanimously favorable; Corrections: Unanimously favorable; Criminal Justice Appropriations: Withdrawn

HB 145 by Effman (Identical S 0268)

Child Support; requires court under certain circumstances to base determination of child support amounts on proportionate amount of time children are required to spend with each parent each year. Amends 61.30. Effective Date: 10/01/1999.

Family Law & Children: Unanimously favorable with one amendment;
Judiciary: Unanimously favorable with one amendment

HB 147 by Alexander, Putnam, Fasano and Dockery (Similar CS/S 0060)

Pretrial Intervention Programs; authorizes court or state attorney to deny admission of defendant to pretrial substance abuse education & treatment intervention program if defendant has rejected any prior offer of admission to such program. Amends 948.08. Effective Date: 07/01/1999.

Crime & Punishment: Unanimously favorable with one amendment;
Corrections: Unanimously favorable; Criminal Justice Appropriations: Withdrawn

HB 169 by Turnbull and Sanderson (Similar S 0326)

Treasurer/Deferred Compensation Plan; provides that fees contributed by participants in Government Employee's Deferred Compensation Plan Act shall not be included in unencumbered balance of certain trust fund maintained by Treasurer. Amends 18.125, 112.215. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Governmental Operations: Unanimously favorable with one amendment;
Financial Services: Unanimously favorable; General Government Appropriations: Unanimously favorable

CS/HB 213 by Real Property & Probate (CJC), Crow, Byrd, Lynn and Sanderson (Similar CS/S 0702, Compare CS/H 0219, CS/S 0704)
