**CS/SB 1864 by the Committee on Education and Senator Kirkpatrick**

**High School Diplomas;** provides for award of high school diploma to certain honorably discharged World War II veterans. Amends 232.246. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

## **SB 1896 by Senator Laurent**

**Air Pollution Permits;** authorizes citrus juice-processing facilities to comply with specified emissions standards in lieu of obtaining air pollution construction & operating permits under specified provision; provides for emissions trading; requires fees; provides for exceptions; requires submission of law for approval by United States Environmental Protection Agency within specified time limits; authorizes DEP to explore alternative permitting, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

## **CS/CS/SB 1904 by the Committees on Natural Resources, Agriculture and Consumer Services and Senator Thomas**

**Agric. & Consumer Services Dept.;** clarifies provisions re conveyance of state lands to dept. for forestry facilities; revises authority of dept. to adopt rules re pesticides used for preconstruction treatments; allows dept. to deposit money from sale of certain personal property in employees' benefit funds; limits local government regulations re Right to Farm Act; creates Agricultural Economic Development Program Disaster Loans, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

## **CS/SB 1906 by the Committee on Fiscal Policy and Senator Lee**

**Calculating HS Students' Grades;** requires school districts to disclose on high school students' report cards or permanent records that contain weighted grade point average that grade point average differs from that used for Bright Futures Scholarship Program; requires school districts to inform students annually of their progress toward Bright Futures Scholarship requirements; revises criteria for calculating & weighting grade point averages, etc. Amends Chs. 232, 240. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

## **CS/SB 1910 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Laurent**

**Child Welfare;** revises confidentiality of recorded central abuse hotline calls re child abuse, neglect, or abandonment; provides clarifying language for community-based care providers of foster care & related services; provides for inclusion of child protection team in list of those to whom alleged abuse reporter's name may be released; clarifies language re initiation of protective investigations, etc. Amends Chs. 39, 383.402, 409.1671. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably, with three amendments, by the Committee on Children and Families, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice*

## **CS/SB 1946 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Silver**

**Correctional Work Programs;** clarifies application of sovereign immunity re corporation that operates correctional work programs; revises requirements for lease of facilities by corporation; deletes requirement that lease be approved by Attorney General; deletes

certain limitations on transfer of operating losses & requirements for employing personnel of DOC; provides for insurance of property leased by corporation, etc. Amends Ch. 946, 957.04. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

## **CS/SB 1956 by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Lee**

**Viatical Settlements;** redefines terms "viatical settlement contract," "viatical settlement provider," "viator," "related provider trust," & "viatical settlement purchaser"; provides for disclosure to viatical settlement purchasers; provides for regulation of interstate conflicts; provides for contestability of viaticated policies; provides for grace period for unlicensed viatical settlement providers, etc. Amends Ch. 626. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

## **CS/SB 1996 by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Clary**

**Design Professional Contracts;** provides for indemnification in design professional contracts & voids all others as being against public policy; provides definitions; provides for application; conforms to act. Creates 725.08; amends 725.06. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

## **CS/SB 2000 by the Committee on Natural Resources and Senator King**

**Key Largo Hammocks State Site;** changes name of Key Largo Hammocks State Botanical Site to "Dagny Johnson Key Largo Hammocks State Botanical Site". Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**CS/SB 2108 by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Brown-Waite**

**Health Care of Inmates/DOC;** provides legislative intent re Correctional Managed Health Care Pilot Program; creates Correctional Managed Health Care Oversight Board to oversee pilot program; establishes said pilot program; specifies correctional facilities to be included in pilot program; requires DOC to contract with private health care vendor for purpose of providing health care services, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**CS/SB 2134 by the Committee on Natural Resources and Senator Geller**

**Resource Recovery & Management;** redefines term "source separated". Amends 403.703. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

**CS/SB 2140 by the Committee on Natural Resources and Senator Latvala**

**Water Management;** provides requirements to protest contracts administered by water management district; revises criteria to be considered in determining cumulative impacts of activities upon surface waters & wetlands; provides for classification & permitting of aquifer storage & recovery wells; requires dept. to adopt & enforce certain primary & secondary drinking water regulations for nontransient & transient noncommunity water systems, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**SB 2230 by Senator Meek**

**Nursing Home Facilities/Receivership;** provides conditions under which AHCA must petition court for appointment of receiver for facility; prescribes term of receivership; authorizes agency to adopt rules; provides funds for administering receivership from Resident Protection Trust Fund; removes limitation on term of appointment of receiver. Amends 400.126. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care, and withdrawn from the Committee on Fiscal Policy*

**CS/SB 2266 by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care and Senator Forman**

**Unlicensed Assisted Living Facility;** requires field offices of AHCA to establish local coordinating workgroups to identify operation of unlicensed assisted living facilities & to develop plan to enforce state laws re such facilities; requires health care practitioners to report known operations of such facilities; requires paramedics & EMTs to report acts of abuse committed against disabled adult or elderly person, etc. Amends Chs. 400, 415. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

**SB 2320 by Senator Sebesta**

**Cultural Endowment Program;** revises types of instruments into which trustees may invest, to include any investment-quality financial instruments. Amends 265.606. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

**SB 2460 by Senator Carlton**

**Veterans' Nursing Home of Florida;** prescribes eligibility requirements for admittance to home. Amends 296.36. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**CS/SB 2506 by the Committee on Natural Resources and Senator Bronson**

**Beach Management;** revises provisions re permit conditions; provides authority of DEP re beach nourishment for certain coastal construction & excavation; revises declarations of public policy re beach erosion control, restoration, & nourishment; authorizes department to enter into certain cooperative agreements for inlet project management & cost-sharing; deletes provisions re nonexistent erosion control account, etc. Amends Ch. 161. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

**SB 2516 by Senator Diaz de la Portilla**

**Law Enforcement Academies;** requires background check prior to entrance into basic-recruit class; requires basic-recruit candidates to pass basic skills examination. Amends 943.14., 17. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

**SB 2546 by Senator Scott**

**Dept. of Management Services;** amends provision re minimum benefit adjustment; provides for person to refuse minimum benefit adjustment; amends provision re Special Risk Class membership; amends provision re past service & prior service; amends provision re retirement benefits payable under system; provides for retention of service credit upon termination; amends provision re authorized leaves of absence, etc. Amends Ch. 121, 112.362, 287.16. Effective Date: 07/01/2000.

**SB 2574 by Senator King**

**Presidential Preference Primary;** changes date of presidential preference primary; revises other dates re selection & certification of candidates or delegates whose names are to appear on ballot & to qualifying of delegates for such purpose, to conform; provides applicability. Amends 103.101. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

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
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
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
