Intangible Personal Property Taxes; reduces rate of annual tax; reduces rates of tax on securities in Florida's Future Investment Fund, to conform; provides applicability. Amends 199.032,.033. Effective Date: 01/01/2002.

Fiscal Policy & Resources: Favorable; Fiscal Responsibility Council: Favorable

CS/HB 55 by Fiscal Responsibility Council, Fasano, Ritter and Fiorentino (Similar S 0254)

Public Medical Assistance; reduces annual assessment on hospital outpatient services to fund public medical assistance; limits financial information that may be required to determine amount of assessment; reduces annual assessment on certain other health care entities to fund public medical assistance; provides for annual appropriations to replace funds lost due to such reductions. Amends 395.701,.7015,.7016. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

CS/HB 77 by Local Government & Veterans Affairs (SGC) and Sorensen (Similar S 0946)

Key Largo Hammocks Botanical Site; changes name of Key Largo Hammocks State Botanical Site to "Dagney Johnson Key Largo Hammock Botanical State Park". Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Parental Rights/Child's Records; provides that specified rights apply to both parents. Amends 61.13. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

Sharpening the Pencil Act; creates said act; provides legislative intent re school district best financial management practices reviews; provides OPPAGA with primary responsibility for completion of best financial practices reviews; provides for appearance of school officials before Legislature upon failure to implement adopted action plan; provides for citizen appeals to Education Commissioner, etc. Amends Ch. 230, 11.51, 233.43, 235.2197; repeals 11.515. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

CS/HB 271 by Council for Lifelong Learning, Negron, Melvin, Diaz de la Portilla, Alexander, Harrington, Farkas and Brummer (Similar S 1048)

Corporate Income Tax; provides purpose & definitions; provides credit against said tax for contributions to nonprofit scholarship funding organization; provides for use of such contributions by such organizations for scholarships for certain children & provides requirements & limitations with respect thereto; provides for inclusion of amounts taken as credit under specified provision in determining taxpayer's adjusted federal income, etc. Amends Ch. 220. Effective Date: 01/01/2002.

CS/HB 277 by Council for Lifelong Learning, Atwater, Lynn, Melvin, Negron, Wallace, Betancourt, Garcia, Jordan, Diaz de la Portilla, Gardiner, Mahon, Pickens, Haridopolos, Paul, Mack, Davis, Bennett, Kravitz, Attkisson, Bowen, Alexander, Harrington, Farkas, Brummer and Fiorentino

Schools/Attendance/Learnfare Program; reestablishes Learnfare program; reduces temporary cash assistance based on failure to meet certain education participation requirements; requires conferences between Learnfare participants & school officials; requires development of electronic data transfer system; repeals specified provision re Learnfare program, etc. Creates 414.1251; amends 228.041, 230.23; repeals 414.125. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/HB 279 by Education Appropriations (FRC), Lynn, Atwater, Murman, Wilson, Mayfield, Rich, Justice, Fiorentino, Arza, Gottlieb and Frankel (Compare S 0866)

Barry Grunow Act; creates "Barry Grunow Act"; provides death benefits re certain teachers & school administrators; provides for payment of certain health insurance premiums; provides for waiver of certain educational expenses for children of certain deceased teachers & school administrators; provides that teacher & school administrator death benefits are exempt property under Fla. Probate Code; provides for funding, etc. Creates 112.1915; amends 732.402. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 383 by State Administration (SGC) and Brummer (Similar S 0632)

Bank Account Numbers/Records Exempt.; amends certain provision which provides exemption from public records requirements for bank account numbers or debit, charge, or credit card numbers given to agency for purpose of payment of fee or debt; reenacts such exemption & removes October 2, 2001, repeal thereof scheduled under OGSR Act of 1995. Amends 119.07. Effective Date: 10/01/2001.

Council for Smarter Government: Favorable

HB 385 by State Administration (SGC) and Brummer (Similar S 0382)

Municipal Utilities/Records; amends certain provision which provides exemption from public records requirements for specified period of time for certain information used by municipal utility to prepare & submit certain sealed bids to customers or prospective customers; reenacts such exemption & removes October 2, 2001, repeal thereof scheduled under OGSR Act of 1995. Amends 119.07. Effective Date: 10/01/2001.

Council for Smarter Government: Favorable

HB 387 by State Administration (SGC) and Brummer (Similar S 0454)

Sports-Related Industries/Records; amends certain provision which provides exemption from public records requirements for identity of donors & prospective donors to direct-support organization authorized to assist in promotion of sports-related industries; reenacts such exemption & removes October 2, 2001, repeal thereof scheduled under OGSR Act of 1995. Amends 288.12295. Effective Date: 10/01/2001.

Council for Smarter Government: Favorable

HB 389 by State Administration (SGC) and Brummer

Public Records/Economic Development; amends specified provision which provides exemption from public records requirements for records of economic development agency which contain or would provide plans, intentions, or interests of private entities re their business activities; reenacts

such exemption & removes October 2, 2001, repeal thereof scheduled under OGSR Act of 1995. Amends 288.075. Effective Date: 10/01/2001.

Council for Smarter Government: Favorable

HB 391 by State Administration (SGC) and Brummer

Public Records/Tax Refund Programs; amends specified provision which provides exemptions from public records requirements for certain identifying, proprietary, tax, & trade secret information received in connection with administering said tax refund programs; reenacts such exemptions & removes October 2, 2001, repeal thereof scheduled under OGSR Act of 1995; deletes superfluous language. Amends 288.1066. Effective Date: 10/01/2001.

Council for Smarter Government: Favorable

HB 393 by State Administration (SGC) and Brummer (Similar S 0456)

Public Records/Marketing Projects; amends specified provision which provides exemption from public records requirements for identity of any person responding to marketing or research projects conducted by corporation & for trade secrets obtained pursuant thereto; reenacts such exemption & removes October 2, 2001, repeal thereof scheduled under OGSR Act of 1995. Amends 288.1226. Effective Date: 10/01/2001.

Council for Smarter Government: Favorable

HB 395 by State Administration (SGC) and Brummer (Similar S 1062)

Public Records/Airport Security Plan; amends provision which provides exemptions from public records requirements for airport security plans of aviation authority or county or municipal aviation department & for other material that depicts critical airport operating facilities; reenacts such exemptions & removes October 2, 2001, repeal thereof scheduled under OGSR Act of 1995. Amends 331.22. Effective Date: 10/01/2001.

Council for Smarter Government: Favorable

HB 397 by State Administration (SGC) and Brummer (Similar S 1060)

Public Records/Toll Facility Charges; amends provision which provides exemption from public records requirements for personal identifying information given to DOT, county, or expressway authority for purpose of prepaying electronic toll facility charges by check, credit card, or charge card; reenacts such exemption & removes October 2, 2001, repeal thereof scheduled under OGSR Act of 1995; clarifies cross reference. Amends 338.155. Effective Date: 10/01/2001.

Council for Smarter Government: Favorable

HB 399 by State Administration (SGC) and Brummer (Similar S 0384)

Public Record/Emergency "911" Number; amends provision which provides exemption from public records requirements for information that reveals name, address, telephone number, or personal information about, or other information that would identify, person requesting emergency service or reporting emergency; reenacts such exemption & removes October 2, 2001, repeal thereof scheduled under OGSR Act of 1995; corrects cross reference. Amends 365.171. Effective Date: 10/01/2001.

Council for Smarter Government: Favorable

HB 401 by State Administration (SGC) and Brummer (Similar S 0414)

Public Records/Health Care Community; amends provision which provides exemption from public records requirements for certain documents, contracts, & proprietary confidential business information submitted by such entities in connection with request for antitrust no-action letter for specified

period; reenacts such exemption & removes October 2, 2001, repeal thereof scheduled under OGSR Act of 1995. Amends 408.185. Effective Date: 10/01/2001.

Council for Smarter Government: Favorable

HB 403 by State Administration (SGC) and Brummer (Similar S 0804)

Public Record/Pawnbroker Transaction; amends provision which provides exemption from public records requirements for records re pawnbroker transactions delivered to appropriate law enforcement officials; reenacts such exemption & removes October 2, 2001, repeal thereof scheduled under OGSR Act of 1995. Amends 539.003. Effective Date: 10/01/2001.

Council for Smarter Government: Favorable

HB 405 by State Administration (SGC) and Brummer (Similar S 1026)

Public Records/Surplus Lines Ins.; amends provision which provides exemption from public records requirements for certain surplus lines insurance information submitted to DOI or available for inspection by department; reenacts such exemption & removes October 2, 2001, repeal thereof scheduled under OGSR Act of 1995; narrows exemption to apply to information specific to particular policy or policyholder, etc. Amends 626.921. Effective Date: 10/01/2001.

Council for Smarter Government: Favorable

HB 407 by State Administration (SGC) and Brummer (Compare S 0418)

Public Records/Univ. Health Services; repeals provision which provides that meetings of governing board of university health services support organization are public & requires that certain records be made available to DOI; reenacts such exemptions & removes October 2, 2001, repeal thereof scheduled under OGSR Act of 1995; requires university health services support organizations to make certain records available to DOI, etc. Repeals 240.2995(6); amends 240.2996. Effective Date: 10/01/2001.

HB 657 by Rules, Ethics & Elections (PRC) and Goodlette (Compare S 0274)
