**CS/HB 77** by Local Government & Veterans Affairs (SGC) and Sorensen (Similar S 0946)

Key Largo Hammocks Botanical Site; changes name of Key Largo Hammocks State Botanical Site to “Dagney Johnson Key Largo Hammock Botanical State Park”. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**HB 707** by Business Regulation (SGC) and Kyle (Identical CS/S 0364, Compare H 0501, S 1410)

State Lottery Commission; repeals certain provisions re said commission; abolishes said commission; deletes references to commission, to conform. Repeals 24.103(3),.106; amends 24.105,.108,.123. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**HJR 951** by Crime Prevention, Corrections & Safety (HCC) and Bilirakis (Similar S 0124)

Excessive Punishment; constitutional amendment to authorize death penalty for capital crimes; authorizes retroactive changes in method of execution; changes current prohibition against cruel or unusual punishment to prohibition against cruel & unusual punishment, etc. Amends s. 17, Art. I.

**HB 953** by Crime Prevention, Corrections & Safety (HCC) and Bilirakis (Identical S 1080, Compare S 0950)

Burglary; provides legislative findings & intent; provides for retroactive operation; revises definition of burglary. Creates 810.015; amends 810.02; reenacts 943.325(1)(a). Effective Date: Upon becoming law.
