**CS/SB 1638 by the Committee on Finance and Taxation, Senator Carlton and others**

**Sales & Use Tax Administration;** repeals certain provision which authorizes DOR to contract with certain vendors to develop & implement voluntary system for sales & use tax collection & administration; creates Simplified Sales & Use Tax Administration Act; provides that each state that is party to agreement must abide by certain requirements in order for dept. to enter into agreement, etc. Repeals 213.27(9); creates 213.256. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Taxation*

**SB 1648 by Senator Mitchell**

**Onsite Sewage Treatment & Disposal;** provides for regulation by Health Dept. of maintenance entities for performance-based treatment systems & aerobic treatment unit systems; requires such systems to contract with permitted maintenance entity; provides duties of such entities; reduces operating permit fee for aerobic treatment units & provides operating permit & maintenance entity permit fees for performance-based treatment systems, etc. Amends 381.0065,.0066. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

*Reported favorably by the Committees on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care, and Finance and Taxation, and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government and Appropriations*

**SB 1658 by Senator Smith**

**Jurors;** provides for jurors to be taken from registered electors, rather than from persons possessing driver's license or identification card; deletes provisions requiring HSMV to send lists of persons in departmental database to clerks of court; provides for voter lists to be used for jury selection; deletes requirement that department provide certain information to courts, etc. Amends 40.01,.011,.022, 98.095, 322.20. Effective Date: 10/01/2001.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary*

**CS/SB 1684 by the Committee on Appropriations and Senator Klein**

**Transition to Teaching Program;** encourages participation by postsecondary education institutions & organizations that represent eligible employees or employ eligible applicants; provides for grant proposals & applications; requires evaluation; authorizes certain activities & places limitations on expenditures; provides for repayment of certain stipends. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

*Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Education and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Appropriations Subcommittee on Education and withdrawn from the Committee on Appropriations with subcommittee recommendation*

**CS/SB 1726 by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care and Senator Saunders**

**Public Records/Elderly Affairs Dept.;** provides for release of public records information under certain circumstances; provides for confidentiality & exemption from public records law for information re clients of Elderly Affairs Dept., clients of service providers contracting with Elderly Affairs Dept., & certain elders receiving services through programs administered by or funded by department; requires consent for disclosure, etc. Creates 430.105. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care, and withdrawn from the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and Rules and Calendar*

**SB 1820 by Senator Silver and others**

**Instant Bingo Games;** defines terms "instant bingo" & "package"; provides rules for operation of instant bingo games. Amends 849.0931. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

*Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries and withdrawn from the Committee on Criminal Justice*

**CS/SB 1850 by the Committee on Finance and Taxation and Senator Burt**

**Dept. of Revenue Clerks of Court TF;** creates Department of Revenue Clerks of Court Trust Fund; provides for sources of funds & purposes; provides for future review & termination or re-creation of trust fund. Effective Date: Contingent.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Taxation, and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government and Appropriations*

**CS/SB 1852 by the Committee on Finance and Taxation and Senator Burt**

**State Revenue Collection/Court Clerk;** provides for electronic remittance to DOR; provides for remittance by DOR to various trust funds & agencies; provides for remittance of all moneys collected by clerks of court for state to DOR; provides for remittance of funds to DOR & deposit in designated trust fund; repeals outdated language. Amends Chs. 28,318,372,938, 27.52, 34.041, 44.108, 316.192, 327.35, 329.73, 382.022,023, 569.11, 741.01, 775.0835, 960.17; creates 213.13. Effective Date: 03/01/2002 except as otherwise provided.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Taxation, and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government and Appropriations*

**SB 1906 by Senator Latvala**

**Insurance;** provides additional exception to requirement that minimum of 2 months' premium be collected to issue policy or binder for motor vehicle insurance; authorizes insurers that finance premiums for certain policies to charge interest or service charge at specified rate on unpaid premiums on those policies. Amends 627.7295,.902. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

*Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Banking and Insurance*

**SB 1916 by Senator Sebesta and others**

**Elderly/Disabled Adults/Bingo;** authorizes bingo games for residents or clients of certain facilities for elderly or disabled, & their guests; provides conditions; provides for use of proceeds; provides exemption from local regulation & fees. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

*Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Comprehensive Planning, Local and Military Affairs, and withdrawn from the Committee on Criminal Justice*

**CS/SB 2024 by the Committee on Finance and Taxation and Senator Pruitt**

**Fish & Wildlife Conservation Comm.;** provides civil penalty for violation of certain established vessel speed limits; increases permit fee for private game preserve or farm; revises provisions re issuance of certain licenses to take wild animal life, freshwater aquatic life, & marine life, & administrative costs & reporting related thereto; creates gold sportsman's license for residents, etc. Amends Chs. 370, 372, 327.73, 328.72,.76, 705.101. Effective Date: 07/01/2001.

*Reported favorably, with six amendments, by the Committee on Natural Resources and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Taxation, and withdrawn from the Committees on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government and Appropriations*

**CS/SB 2034 by the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities and Senator Latvala**

**Rural Electric Cooperatives;** authorizes cooperative bylaws to permit voting by limited proxy for certain purposes & under certain circumstances; provides criteria & limitations; prohibits voting by general proxy; provides procedures & requirements for appointing limited proxies. Amends 425.09. Effective Date: 10/01/2001.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Economic Opportunities, and the Committee on Agriculture and Consumer Services, reports the committee substitute favorably*

**CS/SB 2098 by the Committee on Ethics and Elections, Senator Jones and others**

**Elections/Voter's Bill Of Rights;** provides for Voter's Bill of Rights & Responsibilities; provides responsibilities of supervisors of elections. Amends 101.031. Effective Date: 10/01/2001.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Ethics and Elections*


