**I. Summary:**

Abolishes the State Lottery Commission and conforms related provisions.

This bill substantially amends, creates, or repeals the following sections of the Florida Statutes: ss. 24.103, 24.106, 24.105, and 24.108, and 24.123, F.S.

**II. Present Situation:**

The State Lottery Commission consists of five members that are appointed by the Governor. The commission meets at least once each quarter. The purpose of the commission is to serve as a resource for the department and to provide the Secretary with private sector perspectives on the operation of a large marketing enterprise.

The 1999 Legislature enacted Senate Bill 2280 (Chapter 99-255, Laws of Florida) which required each department of the executive branch to survey each board, commission, and other such entity and recommend whether the entity should be abolished, continued, or revised. This information was provided to the Department of Management Services for inclusion in a final report to the Governor and Legislature. In its January 2000 “Boards and Commissions Review,” the Department of Management Services concluded that the Lottery Commission “does not significantly enhance the Lottery’s mission . . . , is an unnecessarily duplicative and unjustifiable expense,” and recommended that the Lottery Commission be abolished.

**III. Effect of Proposed Changes:**

The bill would abolish the Lottery Commission, consistent with the January 2000 Department of Management Services report entitled “Boards and Commissions Review.”
