I. Summary:

This bill designates The Florida Citrus Archives, located at Florida Southern College and dedicated to Thomas B. Mack, as the official citrus archive of Florida.

This bill creates an as yet unnumbered section of the Florida Statutes.

II. Present Situation:

As reported in the bill, Florida Southern College in Lakeland has accumulated and maintains an extensive collection of citrus related materials. The collection is called The Florida Citrus Archives and is dedicated to Thomas B. Mack, the person most responsible for the success of the project. Florida Citrus Mutual, an association representing growers statewide, maintains that The Florida Citrus Archives are the largest collection of its kind by far and that they function now as the unofficial statewide citrus archives.

III. Effect of Proposed Changes:

Section 1. Designates The Florida Citrus Archives, located at Florida Southern College and dedicated to Thomas B. Mack, as the official citrus archive of Florida.

Section 2. Provides that the act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
