CS/SB 1126 by Banking and Insurance, Posey, Wasserman Schultz and Latvala (Similar CS/H 0551, Compare CS/H 1361, H 2021, CS/S 1418, S 2328)

Insurance Policy Holder Protection; creates Insurance Policy Holder Protection Act; revises certain agent commission payment & policy servicing procedures & requirements; adds area eligible for coverage from Fla. Windstorm Underwriting Association; preserves policyholder's right to select & maintain certain agents; authorizes DOI to adopt rules to preserve such right; provides application. Amends 627.351, 3511; creates 627.3517. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time March 13

HB 2021 by Fiscal Responsibility Council, Alexander and Atwater (Similar CS/H 1361, CS/S 1418, Compare H 0109, CS/H 0551, CS/S 1126, S 1784)

Insurance; provides for certain additional coverages under Fla. Hurricane Catastrophe Fund; renames Residential Property & Casualty Joint Underwriting Association as Citizens Property Insurance Corporation to provide residential & commercial property insurance; provides for emergency assessments for policyholders of participating insurers; authorizes corporation to enter into quota share primary insurance agreements, etc. Amends Ch. 627, 215.555. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read second time and amended March 13

CS/CS/CS/HB 193 by Council for Competitive Commerce, Judicial Oversight (SGC), Insurance (CCC), Gannon and Kallinger (Linked CS/CS/H 0195, Similar CS/CS/S 0432, Compare CS/CS/S 0430, CS/ S 1822)

Insurer Rehabilitation & Liquidation; provides for DOI to approve insurer withdrawals upon certain conditions being satisfied; revises construction & purpose provisions; limits application of certain time restrictions; authorizes DOI to exercise certain third-party rights; provides exception; includes certain assets within provisions authorizing receiver to

take certain actions, etc. Amends Ch. 631, 626.9541, 624.430; creates 817.2341; repeals 624.3101. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read second time and amended March 13

CS/HB 691 by Council for Competitive Commerce, Kottkamp, Harrell, Murman, Melvin, Negron, Pickens, Paul, Betancourt, Green, Needelman, Cantens, Heyman, Gannon, Crow, Davis, Gottlieb, Rich and Sobel (Similar CS/S 1002)

Cruelty to Animals; provides that any person convicted of specified acts which constitute cruelty to animal, where finder of fact determines that violation includes knowing & intentional torture or torment of animal, shall be ordered to undergo psychological counseling or anger management treatment; provides minimum mandatory fine, etc. Amends 828.12; reenacts various FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time March 13

CS/HB 35 by Council for Smarter Government, Allen and Siplin (Similar CS/CS/S 1458, Compare CS/S 1532)

Expressway Authorities; provides that certain activities of expressway authority may be approved by governing body of affected county at conclusion of public hearing on matter; restricts certain activities affecting Wekiva River or Green Swamp Area by Orlando-Orange County Expressway Auth.; prohibits authority from financing or constructing new facilities to Northwest Beltway Part A without prior legislative approval unless on behalf of DOT, etc. Amends Ch. 348. Effective Date: 60 days after sine die.

Read second time and amended March 15

CS/SB 1276 by Appropriations and Silver (Similar H 1761, Compare H 0703, CS/CS/S 0596, CS/CS/S 1838)

Fla. Health & Human Services Access; creates "Florida Health & Human Services Access Act"; provides legislative findings & intent re access to state-funded health services; requires AHCA to establish as pilot project

comprehensive health & human services eligibility access system; authorizes agency to request federal waivers; establishes Health Care Access Steering Committee; authorizes planning, development, & implementation of Florida 211 Network, etc. Amends Chs. 408, 430, 409.912. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time and amended March 15

HB 2017 by Council for Lifelong Learning, Melvin and Kilmer
(Linked H 2019)

Education; creates "Florida K-20 Education Code"; creates specified provisions re "K-20 General Provisions", "K-20 Governance", "Student & Parental Rights & Educational Choices", "Public K-12 Education", "Public Postsecondary Education"; creates specified provisions re "Nonpublic Postsecondary Education", & "Support for Learning & Student Services", etc. Creates Chs. 1000-1013; amends FS. Effective Date: 01/07/2003 except as otherwise provided.

Read second time and amended March 15

SB 264 by King and Crist (Identical H 0651)

Drug-free Workplaces; clarifies that drug testing must be conducted in conformity with that section in order for employer to qualify as having drug-free workplace program; requires certain contractors to implement drug-free workplace program under certain circumstances. Amends 440.102. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

Read second time March 15

HB 37 by Harper (Identical S 0044)

Relief/James Torrence; provides for relief of James Torrence; authorizes & directs Palm Beach Co. Health Care District to compensate him for personal injuries resulting from surgery negligently performed by health care district employee. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time and amended March 14

HB 39 by Bucher (Similar S 0038)

Relief/Rosemary Falkenburg; provides for relief of Rosemary Falkenburg; authorizes & directs City of West Palm Beach to compensate Rosemary Falkenburg for personal injuries she suffered due to negligence of city employee. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time and amended March 14

HB 61 by Seiler (Identical CS/S 0010)

Relief/Mark Schwartz; provides for relief of Mark Schwartz, a minor, for injuries sustained as result of negligence of employees of Coral Springs Medical Center. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time and amended March 14

HB 63 by Ritter (Similar CS/S 0042)

Relief/Maria Garcia/Orange Co.; provides for relief of Maria Garcia, as legal guardian of Delfina Benjumea; compensates her for injuries & damages sustained by Delfina Benjumea as result of negligence of Orange Co. Sheriff's Office; provides legislative intent re expenditures. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time and amended March 14

CS/HB 79 by Council for Lifelong Learning, Kravitz, Fasano, Fiorentino, Sobel, Melvin, Murman, Baker, Stansel, Lynn, Bense, Richardson, Bean, Gannon, Needelman, Romeo, Crow, Pickens, Bendross-Mindingall and Wishner (Similar CS/S 0174)

Sexual Offenders; requires school bus stop location information; prohibits certain sexual offenders subject to conditional release supervision from living within specified distance of certain places where children congregate; prohibits persons convicted of certain sex crimes from residing within 1,000 feet of school, day care center, park, or playground. Amends 234.02, 947.1405; creates 794.065. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

Read second time and amended March 15

HB 85 by Betancourt (Identical CS/S 0052)

Relief/Calderon/Miami-Dade Co.; provides for relief of Jessica Ann Calderon, personal representative of Estate of Roberto Luis Calderon, Sean Ryan Calderon, minor child of Roberto Luis Calderon & Jessica Ann Calderon, & Lily Ann Calderon, minor child of Roberto Luis Calderon & Jessica Ann Calderon; compensates them for wrongful death of Roberto Luis Calderon as result of negligence of Miami-Dade Co. employee. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time March 14

HB 151 by Waters (Similar S 0026)

Relief/Skowroneks/Clearwater; provides for relief of Eva Skowronek, as widow of Wieslaw Skowronek, & for relief of Anna Marie Skowronek, Victor Skowronek, & Hubert Skowronek, children of Wieslaw Skowronek, for death of Wieslaw Skowronek as result of negligence of City of Clearwater. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time March 14

CS/HB 155 by Council for Smarter Government and Trovillion
(Similar CS/CS/S 0990, CS/S 1450, Compare CS/H 0539, CS/H 1307, CS/H 1667, CS/S 0104, S 0274)

Business Regulation; provides for annual rather than biannual inspections of transient & nontransient apartments; revises requirements for testing & certification of food service managers, including fee requirements; requires elevator service maintenance contracts be made available to DBPR upon request for oversight purposes; extends period of validity of certificates of operation from 1 to 2 years, etc. Amends Chs. 399, 509. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time and amended March 12

HB 187 by Attkisson, Meadows and Murman (Similar S 0008)

Relief/Hopkins & Bowman; provides for relief of Towanna Denise Hopkins, incompetent, by & through Willie Lee Hopkins, her father & legally appointed guardian, Robert Keith Bowman, Jr., son of Towanna Denise Hopkins, & Willie Lee Hopkins, individually; authorizes & directs Fla. Board of Regents, University of South Florida, & USF Health Sciences Center Insurance Company to compensate them for injuries & damages, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time March 14

HB 189 by Siplin (Identical S 0074)

Relief/Steven Mitchell/Volusia Co.; provides for relief of Steven Mitchell; authorizes & directs Halifax Hospital Medical Center, special taxing district in Volusia Co. d/b/a Halifax Medical Center to compensate Mr. Mitchell for personal injuries that he suffered while at Halifax Medical Center. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time and amended March 14

HB 203 by Sorensen (Similar CS/S 0060)

Relief/Joshua England/Monroe Co.; provides for relief of Joshua England, a minor; authorizes & directs District School Board of Monroe Co. to compensate Joshua England for personal injuries that he suffered due to negligence of Monroe County district school board employees; provides for use of such funds; provides for forfeiture & reversion of funds; provides for trustee qualifications. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time and amended March 14

HB 205 by Sorensen (Similar CS/S 1800)

District Courts of Appeal; specifies minimum membership of district courts of appeal; provides construction & application; provides criteria for selecting judges to fill vacancies; requests district courts of appeal judicial nominating commissions to adopt uniform rules of procedure. Amends 35.01. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time and amended March 14

HB 225 by Gannon, Mayfield and Allen (Identical CS/S 0046)

Relief/Sharon & Victor Dixon, Sr.; provides for relief of Sharon Dixon & Victor Dixon, Sr.; authorizes & directs School Board of Indian River Co. to compensate them for wrongful death of their minor child, Victor Dixon, Jr., due to negligence of employee of school board. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time and amended March 14

CS/HB 231 by Transportation (RIC), Meadows and Gottlieb (Similar S 0184)

High-occupancy Vehicle Lanes; allows certain energy-saving vehicles to travel in such lanes, regardless of occupancy; provides for decal & registration certificate; provides for fee; provides rulemaking authority. Amends 316.0741. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

Read second time March 13

HB 301 by Mayfield (Similar CS/S 0056)

Relief/Joseph Arvay/Vero Beach; provides for relief of Joseph Arvay; compensates Joseph Arvay for injuries caused by negligence of City of Vero Beach police officer. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time and amended March 14

HB 349 by Atwater (Similar CS/S 0024)

Relief/Margaret B. Helm/Martin Co.; provides for relief of Margaret B. Helm for injuries & damages sustained as result of negligence of Martin Co. Volunteer Fire Dept.; specifies use of funds appropriated; provides for reimbursement of Medicaid Brain & Spinal Cord Injury Program & Vocational Rehabilitation Services expenditures. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time and amended March 14

HB 359 by Diaz de la Portilla (Identical CS/S 0064)

Relief/Jesnor Exanor/Delray Beach; provides for relief of Jesnor Exanor, as personal representative of Estate of Nancy Mervil, on behalf of himself & two minor children of his deceased wife, Nancy Mervil; authorizes & directs City of Delray Beach to compensate them for death of Nancy Mervil due to negligence of employee of city; provides terms & conditions re payment & use of such compensation. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time and amended March 14

HB 361 by Diaz de la Portilla (Similar S 0062)

Relief/Millie Jackson/Miami-Dade Co.; provides for relief of Millie Jackson & compensates her for injuries & damages sustained as result of negligent acts by employee of Miami-Dade County. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time March 14

HB 369 by Lee (Similar CS/S 0018)

Relief/McCarty/Bailey/Decker; provides for relief of Kathleen McCarty, individually & as personal representative of Estate of Laura Bailey, deceased, & George Decker & Joan Decker, individually & as co-personal representatives of Estate of Christina Decker; compensates them for losses sustained as result of actions of CFS Dept. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time March 14

HB 375 by Bullard (Similar CS/S 0066)

Relief/Harley & Dent; provides for relief of Mary Nell Dent Harley, as legal guardian of Ariel Alexis Dent, for injuries sustained by Ariel Alexis Dent as result of negligence on part of employee of Palm Beach County School Board. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time and amended March 14

HB 425 by Prieguez (Identical S 0030)

Relief/Hilda De Paz/Miami-Dade Co.; provides for relief of Hilda De Paz; authorizes & directs Miami-Dade Co. to compensate Hilda De Paz for personal injuries she suffered due to negligence of county employees. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time March 14

HB 427 by Brown, Flanagan, Bennett, Trovillion, Bowen, Baker, Greenstein, Ritter, Gannon, Hogan, Seiler and Wishner (Similar S 0470)

Insurance Plans Participation; prohibits requiring contractors or subcontractors under certain contracts to participate, or be penalized for nonparticipation, in certain insurance plans. Amends 255.05, 287.057. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time and amended March 15

HB 563 by Smith (Similar CS/CS/S 0076)

Relief/William & Anne Hennelly; provides for relief of William Hennelly & Anne Hennelly; authorizes & directs St. Lucie Co. Sheriff's Office to compensate them for personal injuries they suffered due to negligence of employees of sheriff's office. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time and amended March 14

HB 587 by Negron (Similar S 0050)

Relief/Lawrence Bigney; provides for relief of Lawrence Douglas Bigney; authorizes & directs Sheriff's Office of Palm Beach Co. to compensate him for personal injuries suffered due to unlawful acts of employee of Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time March 14

HB 653 by Wishner and Harrell (Compare H 0723, H 0729, H 0733, S 0436, S 0450, S 0488, S 0490, S 0518)

Terrorism/Restitution/Prank or Hoax; defines term “terrorism”; provides for payment of restitution of costs or damages re any person who commits prank or hoax act of terrorism. Creates 775.30. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read second time and amended March 12

HB 845 by Atwater

Palm Beach Co. Sheriff's Employees; revises procedures for appeal of disciplinary actions & complaints against employees of Sheriff of Palm Beach County; revises provisions for appointment of boards to hear appeals & procedures with respect thereto; revises provisions re monetary emoluments based on performance; extends collective bargaining status to deputy sheriffs. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time and amended March 15

CS/HB 899 by Council for Ready Infrastructure, Russell, Lynn, Flanagan, Kendrick, Wishner and Sobel (Similar CS/S 0306, Compare CS/CS/H 0223, CS/S 0520)

Driver's Licenses & ID Cards; prohibits person from knowingly selling, manufacturing, or delivering, or offering to sell, manufacture, or deliver, any blank, forged, stolen, fictitious, counterfeit, or unlawfully issued driver's license or identification card or any instrument in similitude of such license or such card; authorizes investigations of violations of this section; provides penalties. Amends 322.212. Effective Date: 10/01/2002.

Read second time and amended March 13

HB 1271 by Dockery, Goodlette, Ross, Arza and Harrington (Similar CS/S 2090)

Motor & Other Fuel Taxes; requires that sales tax revenues generated by sale of motor & other fuels be transferred to State Game Trust Fund; specifies purposes for which revenues transferred may be used; requires that sales tax revenues generated by sale of motor & other fuels be transferred to Marine Resource Conservation Trust Fund & to State Game Trust Fund; specifies purpose for which revenue transferred may be used. Amends 206.606, .608. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read second time and amended March 15

CS/HB 1335 by Council for Smarter Government, Mealor and McGriff (Similar CS/S 2108)

Designation of Buildings; designates renovated transplant housing unit at University of Florida's Shands Hospital as “Gerold L. Schiebler/Shands Transplant Housing Complex”; designates School of Business & Industry building at Florida Agricultural & Mechanical University as “Sybil C. Mobley Business Building”; designates building which houses University of Central Florida Downtown Center as “James & Annie Ying Academic Center”, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time and amended March 14

CS/HB 1373 by Council for Competitive Commerce and Negron (Similar CS/S 2192)

Solvency of Insurers & HMOs; specifies authority of DOI re certain notice requirements; specifies that administrative review of certain orders does not operate as automatic stay of such orders; specifies that certain actions are not subject to administrative review; revises liabilities workers' compensation insurer must include on its financial statements; provides requirements for certain annuity agreements, etc. Amends Chs. 624, 641, 625.041, 627.481. Effective Date: 10/01/2002 except as otherwise provided.

Read second time and amended March 13

CS/HB 1535 by Council for Smarter Government, Carassas and Cantens (Compare CS/H 0757, CS/H 0789, H 2001, CS/CS/S 0382, CS/S 1906, CS/ S 2228)

Growth Management; provides that Administrative Hearings Div. has exclusive jurisdiction over all claims for damages to real or personal property caused by use of explosives in connection with construction materials mining; designates Whopper Way in Miami-Dade Co. & directs DOT to erect suitable markers; authorizes creation of educational facilities benefit districts pursuant to interlocal agreement, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time and amended March 15

CS/HB 1541 by Council for Smarter Government, Ross and Sobel (Similar CS/S 2124)

Drycleaning Solvent Cleanup Program; defines term “nearby real property owner”; adds statement of intent; exempts certain real property owners & others from claims for property damage arising from contamination by drycleaning solvents; provides for retroactive application; revises provisions governing statutory construction of immunity provisions; revises provisions governing immunity; redefines term “third-party liability”, etc. Amends 376.301, .3078, .308, .313, .30781, .3079. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time and amended March 14

CS/HB 1597 by Council for Smarter Government, Needelman and Heyman (Compare H 0655, H 0823, CS/S 0300, S 1512, S 2158)

Sexually Violent Offenders; provides that certain evidence may be used in criminal proceeding or for purpose of identification; authorizes person held in secure facility under certain provisions, to file petition for habeas corpus; provides for response & evidentiary proceeding; prohibits person from filing petition for habeas corpus in commitment proceedings; provides that petitioner does not have right to appointed counsel, etc. Creates 394.9215; amends 394.923. Effective Date: 07/01/2002.

Read second time and amended March 14

HB 1771 by Arza (Similar CS/S 2248)

Indian Reservations; provides that state shall not have jurisdiction over crimes by one Miccosukee committed against person or property of another Miccosukee within reservations of Miccosukee Tribe of Indians of Florida. Amends 285.16. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read second time and amended March 14

HB 1777 by Attkisson, Flanagan, Green and Henriquez (Similar CS/CS/S 2224)
