I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Federal Law Enforcement Trust Fund without modification, effective upon becoming a law. The Federal Law Enforcement Trust Fund, FLAIR #55-2-719, is administered by the Department of Transportation. This fund was created by Chapter 2000-147, Laws of Florida.

The Federal Law Enforcement Trust Fund was created to receive receipts and revenues as a result of federal criminal, administrative, or civil forfeiture proceedings and federal asset sharing programs.
