Cites Applicable to a Special Session of the House

RULE

- 1.4 (b) **CONTESTED SEAT – NOTICE PRIOR TO SPECIAL SESSION**
In the case of a special election, notice must be received by the Clerk not less than five days before a special session convenes unless the election is during a session or less than five days before the next session, in which case the notice must be on the next legislative day following the receipt of certified election results.
- 7.1 (d) **EXPIRATION OF COMMITTEE AND COUNCIL APPOINTMENTS**
All standing committee and council appointments shall expire on August 1 of odd-numbered years unless the Legislature is convened in special or extended session on that date in which case expiration occurs upon adjournment *sine die* of such session.
- 7.12 (a) **COMMITTEE AND COUNCIL MEETINGS – NOTICE**
During extended or special session, notice shall be given at least one day in advance of a committee or council meeting.
- 7.17 (e) **COMMITTEE RECONSIDERATION**
During extended or special session, the motion to reconsider must be disposed of when made.
- 7.28 (d) **AMENDMENT DEADLINE FOR COMMITTEE CONSIDERATION**
During extended or special session, amendments to be offered in a committee by nonappointed members shall be filed two hours before the committee meeting. Amendments introduced by committee or council members, including *ex officio* members, shall not be subject to these filing deadlines and may be offered at any time during consideration of a bill.
- 10.2 (b) **DAILY ORDER OF BUSINESS**
During special sessions, the order of business of Introduction and Reference shall be conducted immediately following the order of business of Correction of the *Journal*.
- 10.15 (b) (2) **BILLS PLACED IN PROCEDURAL & REDISTRICTING COUNCIL**
During any extended or special session, all bills upon being reported favorably by the last committee of reference shall be placed in the Procedural & Redistricting Council.
- 10.15 (b) (3) **SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR**
During any extended or special session, the Procedural & Redistricting Council shall establish a Special Order Calendar and only those bills on such Special Order Calendar shall be placed on the Calendar of the House.
- 11.7 (b) **IMMEDIATE CERTIFICATION**
During special session, all bills [upon passage] shall be transmitted to the Senate forthwith.
- 12.2 (b) & (c) **AMENDMENT FILING DEADLINE**
During any extended or special session, no Member floor amendment shall be considered unless a printed original of the amendment has been delivered to the Clerk in the required form at least 1 hour prior to the daily session at which the sponsor seeks to offer the amendment, and no amendment to the amendment or substitute amendment shall be offered unless a printed original of the amendment to the amendment or substitute amendment has been delivered to the Clerk not later than 30 minutes prior to the daily session at which the sponsor seeks to offer the main amendment. By a majority vote, the time limitation for filing any amendment may be waived.

SB 20-E by Villalobos and Sullivan

Education; creates "Florida K-20 Education Code"; conforms provisions & cross references; provides purpose of this act; authorizes activities re reorganization of DOE & implementation of changes to state system of education; provides for review of education code during 2003 Regular Session; requires each district school board to develop plan for K-12 foreign

language curriculum, etc. Creates Chs. 1000-1013; amends FS. Effective Date: 01/07/2003 except as otherwise provided.

HB 43-E by Byrd (Linked H 0025-E, H 0037-E, Compare S 0046-E)

Not-for-profit Corp./Confidentiality; provides exemptions from public records & meetings provisions of Fla. Constitution & Florida law for certain records & meetings of not-for-profit corporation governing & operating Fla. Alzheimer's Center & Research Institute & of certain records & meetings of subsidiaries of such not-for-profit corporation; provides statement of public necessity for such exemptions. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 27-E by Fiscal Responsibility Council and Lacasa (Similar S 0002-E, Compare H 0029-E, S 0004-E)

Appropriations; provides moneys for annual period beginning July 1, 2002, & ending June 30, 2003, to pay salaries, & other expenses, capital outlay - buildings, & other improvements, & for other specified purposes of various agencies of State government. Effective Date: 07/01/2002 or upon becoming law, whichever occurs later.

HB 29-E by Fiscal Responsibility Council and Lacasa (Compare H 0027-E, S 0002-E, S 0004-E)

Appropriations Implementing Bill; revises calculation of additional full-time equivalent membership based on Advanced International Certificate of Education Program; provides district school boards flexibility in use of certain categorical appropriations for purposes of academic classroom instruction; provides copayment requirements for state employees' prescription drug program; provides certain positions under Fla. Turnpike Enterprise remain in career service, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2002 except as otherwise provided.

HB 5-E by Lacasa (Similar S 0022-E)

Miami-Dade Co. Home Rule Charter; amends said charter; provides additional powers of Board of County Commissioners; specifies thirteen County Commission districts; requires Board to adopt certain reapportionment plan development procedures; creates office of County Mayor; revises provisions for election & terms of County Commissioners; provides for nonpartisan election of County Supervisor of Elections; provides for County Comptroller, etc. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 9-E by Wallace (Similar S 0018-E)

Job Creation & Worker Assistance Act; provides for giving effect to certain provisions of Job Creation & Worker Assistance Act of 2002 for state corporate income tax purposes; adopts 2002 version of Internal Revenue Code; provides for retroactive operation. Amends 220.23. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Fiscal Policy & Resources: Favorable

HB 49-E by Kilmer (Identical S 0040-E)

Economic Development; provides for additional uses of moneys in Rural Infrastructure Fund; amends provisions re tax refund program for qualified defense contractors; provides exemption from mandatory loss of tax refund eligibility & decertification resulting from agreement breach in cases of uncontrollable economic factors or specific acts of terrorism; amends provision re tax refund program for qualified target industry businesses, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 65-E by Goodlette (Similar S 0068-E)

Constitution/Amendments/Initiatives; requires Revenue Estimating Conference to provide analysis of estimated fiscal impact to state or local governments resulting from any constitutional amendment proposed by initiative; authorizes said conference to solicit information re proposed initiative amendment; requires that summary analysis of estimated fiscal impact be included on ballot following ballot title & substance of initiative, etc. Amends 100.371, 101.161. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/HB 15-E by Health & Human Services Appropriations (FRC), Crow, Fasano and Goodlette (Linked H 0035-E, Compare CS/S 0028-E, S 0030-E)

Controlled Substances; provides for specified licensing boards to adopt rules governing prescribing of controlled substances in emergency department settings; requires DOH to establish electronic system to monitor prescribing of certain controlled substances; prohibits presigning of blank prescription forms & provides penalties; revises provisions re to misbranded drugs & devices, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Contingent.

HB 35-E by Crow (Linked CS/H 0015-E, Similar S 0030-E, Compare CS/S 0028-E)

Public Records/Rx Recipient ID; creates public records exemption for identity of recipient of certain controlled substances, dispenser's National Assoc. of Boards of Pharmacy number, & practitioner's U.S. Drug Enforcement Admin. number, held by Health Dept. & contained in dept.'s electronic prescription monitoring system; creates public records exemption for identity of patient to whom controlled substance has been prescribed & such patient's address, etc. Effective Date: Contingent.

State Administration: Favorable with one amendment

HB 3-E by Alexander and Flanagan (Compare S 0026-E, CS/S 0042-E)

Governmental Reorganization; deletes reference to Banking & Finance Dept. & substitutes Insurance & Financial Services Dept.; creates Office of Chief Financial Officer; creates Insurance & Financial Services Dept.; provides for executive director; creates Offices of Commissioner of Insurance & Commissioner of Financial Services; creates office of executive director of Insurance & Financial Services Dept., etc. Amends 20.04; creates 20.121.,131. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 37-E by Diaz-Balart, Fasano, Rubio and Murman (Linked H 0043-E, Identical S 0046-E, Similar H 0025-E, Compare H 0023-E, H 0051-E)

Health Care/Health Flex Plans; provides legislative findings & intent re health flex plans; provides for pilot program for said plans for certain uninsured persons; exempts approved health flex plans from certain licensing requirements; provides criteria for eligibility to enroll in such plan; establishes Florida Alzheimer's Center & Research Institute at USF; includes preferred provider organizations & health insurers in claim dispute resolution program, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 10/01/2002 except as otherwise provided.

Dale Hickam Excellent Teaching; redesignates program & trust fund as "Dale Hickam Excellent Teaching Program" & "Dale Hickam Excellent Teaching Program Trust Fund"; repeals specified provisions re Excellent Teaching Program & Excellent Teaching Program Trust Fund; provides for construction of act in pari materia with laws enacted during Regular Session

of Legislature. Creates 1012.72, 1010.72; repeals 236.08106,.08107.
Effective Date: Upon becoming law.
