Effective Date: This act shall take effect upon becoming a law

**Governmental Reorganization;** Revises various statutory provisions relating to the Cabinet and to members of the Cabinet, which provisions were affected by the amendment of Article IV,

Section 4 of the State Constitution; conforms various statutory provisions to such revisions. Effective Date: This act shall take effect upon becoming a law

#### **HB 1739 by Education K-20, Kilmer** (Identical S 2576, Compare S 0703, S 0851, CS/CS/S 1436)

**Access to Postsecondary Education;** Deletes requirement that the high school life management skills course be taken at specific grade levels; requires certain test accommodations and modifications of procedures for students with disabilities; requires award of a standard diploma to a student with a disability who meets certain criteria; revises provisions relating to admission of students to community colleges; revises provisions relating to eligibility for reasonable substitutions for admission and graduation requirements; requires review and report on use of acceleration mechanisms and grading practices. Effective Date: This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

**Florida Clean Indoor Air Act;** Amends various provisions of pt.
