BILLS ON CALENDAR

SPECIAL ORDER CALENDAR AS DETERMINED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES AND CALENDAR FOR FRIDAY, JULY 11, 2003

CS/SB 2-C (SO) by the Committee on Health, Aging and Long-Term Care and Senator Jones and others—

Medical Malpractice; revises requirements for setoffs against damages in medical malpractice actions if there is written release or covenant not to sue; provides that creation of Fla. Center for Excellence in Health Care is contingent on enactment of public-records exemption; requires development of statewide electronic infrastructure to improve patient care & delivery & quality of health care services, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Introduced Inside the Call on July 9, 2003.— Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care

*Similar to **HB 15-C (HC)** in Messages (Inside Call)*

SB 4-C (SO) by Senator Jones and others—

Patient Records/Pub. Rec. & Meetings; provides that patient records obtained by, & other documents identifying patient by name & contained in patient safety data held by, Fla. Center for Excellence in Health Care are exempt from public-record requirements; provides that meetings held by center at which such information is discussed are exempt from public-meeting requirements; authorizes release of info. under specified circumstances, etc. Creates 381.04091. Effective Date: Contingent.

Introduced Inside the Call on July 9, 2003.— Reported favorably by the Committee on Health, Aging, and Long-Term Care

SB 6-C (SO) by Senator Jones and others—

Adverse Incident Info./Pub. Rec.; amends provision which provides exemption from public-records requirements for information contained in notification of adverse incident provided to AHCA by facility licensed under Hospital Licensing & Regulation chapter; authorizes use of information as part of certain disciplinary proceedings; removes repeal of exemption scheduled under OGSR Act of 1995, etc. Amends 395.0198. Effective Date: 10/01/2003.
