This legislation re-creates the Operating Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2004. The Operating Trust Fund, FLAIR #52-2-510, is administered by the Department of Community Affairs (DCA). This fund was last re-created effective November 4, 2000 by Chapter 2000-30, Laws of Florida.
