I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Child Care and Development Trust Fund, effective November 4, 2004 without modification. The Child Care and Development Trust Fund, FLAIR #75-2-098, is administered by the Agency for Workforce Innovation. The Child Care and Development Block Grant Trust Fund was last re-created in the Department of Children and Families effective November 4, 2000, by Chapter 2000-8, Laws of Florida. The fund was renamed the Child Care and Development Trust Fund by Chapter 2000-117, Laws of Florida.

This fund tracks the receipts and expenditures of the federal Child Care and Development Fund grant and transfers from the federal Temporary Assistance for Needed Families (TANF) grant to support services and activities in subsidized child care.
