SB 292 (3R) by the Committee on Agriculture (Smith) and others—

Citrus Canker Eradication; repeals s. 4 of ch. 2002-11, Laws of Florida; abrogates repeal of provision which defines term "exposed to infection" for purposes for eradicating citrus canker disease. Abrogates repeal of 581.184(1)(b). Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on March 10, 2005

SB 166 (3R) by Senator Aronberg and others—

Child Support; requires DOR, prior to determining collection or refund to be undistributable to make reasonable efforts to locate persons to whom collections or refunds are owed, including disclosure on Internet of information with appropriate safeguards to protect privacy of persons named in database. Amends 409.2558. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time and amended on March 10, 2005

SB 106 (3R) by Senator Constantine—

State Retirement Program; provides that disability of employee who works in another state full time may be certified by physicians licensed in that state; corrects cross-reference; increases size of State Retirement Commission from three to five members; revises quorum requirements of commission; deletes provision that requires 1 academic year of employment or appointment in State University System for participation in optional retirement program. Amends 121.091,.22,.24,.35. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Read the second time and amended on March 10, 2005

CS/SB 62 (2R) by the Committee on Community Affairs, Senator Campbell and others—

Seniors & Disabled Adults/Services; authorizes each county to create independent special district to provide funding for services for seniors & adults with developmental disabilities; clarifies that county may provide said services or create special district to provide such services by general or special law; authorizes county to create dependent special district to provide services; prohibits councils or districts from requiring matching funds from certain service providers, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs and the Committee on Government Efficiency Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably, with two amendments

CS/SB 64 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Campbell—

Guardianship; authorizes guardian of property of incapacitated person to contest validity of trust before it becomes irrevocable; revises provisions re court monitors; requires orders of appointment & monitors' reports to be served upon certain persons; authorizes court to enter any order necessary to protect ward or ward's estate; authorizes court to appoint court monitor on emergency basis under certain circumstances, etc. Amends Ch. 744, 737.2065. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and the Committee on Banking and Insurance, reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 90 (2R) by Senator Lawson and others—

Herbert F. Morgan Building; designates FAMU-FSU College of Engineering Building as "Herbert F. Morgan Building"; provides for erection of markers. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Education and Governmental Oversight and Productivity

SB 116 (2R) by Senator Saunders and others—

Culpable Negligence/Vehicles/DUI; provides that it is first-degree misdemeanor for person to commit culpable negligence by driving vehicle under influence of alcohol or drugs while accompanied in vehicle by person younger than specified age. Amends 784.05. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Criminal Justice and Judiciary

CS/SB 122 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Saunders and others—

Homestead Exemption/Fraudulent Act; provides value-based sliding scale of criminal penalties applicable to claimant who knowingly & willfully gives false information for purpose of claiming homestead exemption if funds for homestead were obtained by commission of fraudulent act. Amends 196.131. Effective Date: 10/01/2005.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice

CS/SB 152 (2R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Siplin—

Alimony; authorizes court to modify payment of alimony if there is proof by preponderance of evidence that recipient former spouse is in de facto marriage with person of opposite sex outside of legal bond of matrimony; prescribes factors to be considered by court; provides for application. Amends 61.14. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary

CS/SB 232 (2R) by the Committee on Domestic Security and Senator Constantine—

Emergency Management; provides that it is policy of Legislature to encourage counties & municipalities to explore use of emerging technologies for purpose of disseminating information to public before, during, & after emergency or natural disaster; authorizes county or municipality to establish volunteer disaster assistance recovery program, etc. Amends 252.32,.38. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Domestic Security and the Committee on Community Affairs reports the committee substitute favorably

SB 238 (2R) by Senator Campbell—

Personal Injury Protection Insurance; defines terms "biometric" & "biometric time date technology"; revises procedures re use of biometric time date technology for purpose of documenting claims & making payments under personal injury protection benefits. Amends 627.732,.736. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

SB 266 (2R) by Senator Saunders—

Nursing Home Facilities; provides method by which state-designated teaching nursing homes & affiliated assisted living facilities may demonstrate financial responsibility. Amends 400.141. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Health Care and Banking and Insurance

SB 268 (2R) by Senator Posey—

Elections/Early Voting; changes day on which early voting ends. Amends 101.657. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

SB 300 (2R) by the Committee on Government Efficiency Appropriations—

Taxation; repeals s. 11, ch. 2000-312, Laws of Florida; abrogates expiration of provisions in specified provisions, re Revenue Dept. passing upon & ordering refunds of property taxes, taxpayer contest proceedings against dept., procedures by which dept. may resolve disputes re assessment of taxes, interest, & penalties, exemption from tax on intangible personal property for leasehold estates in governmental property, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

SB 310 (2R) by Senator Fasano—

Bingo Games/Electronic Use; authorizes use of electronics or other technology in lieu of vocal verification for bingo games. Amends 849.0931. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Regulated Industries

CS/CS/SB 434 (2R) by the Committees on Commerce and Consumer Services, Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Senator Wise and others—

Disabilities/Service Animals; provides that individual with disability has full & equal access to & enjoyment of public accommodations & state & local facilities, programs, services, & activities; provides that said individual may be accompanied by service animal in places of public accommodation & in state & local facilities; provides that trainer of animal has same rights & privileges as person with disability while training animal, etc. Amends 413.08,.081. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and Consumer Services

CS/CS/SB 436 (2R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Criminal Justice, Senator Peaden and others—

Protection of Persons/Use of Force; authorizes person to use force, including deadly force, against intruder or attacker in dwelling, residence, or vehicle under specified circumstances; provides that person is justified in using deadly force under certain circumstances; provides immunity from criminal prosecution or civil action for using deadly force; defines term "criminal prosecution", etc. Creates 776.013,.032; amends 776.012,.031. Effective Date: 10/01/2005.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary

CS/SB 474 (2R) by the Committee on Health Care and Senator Saunders—

Nurses/Home Visits; revises requirements for home visits by registered nurses; deletes mandatory requirement for monthly visits; requires that patient be notified of availability of optional visits. Amends 400.506. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Care

SB 574 (2R) by Senator Haridopolos and others—

Official Fruit of Florida; designates orange as official fruit of State of Florida. Creates 15.0315. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Agriculture and Governmental Oversight and Productivity

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SB 114 (2R) by Senator Saunders and others—

Entertainment Industry Financial TF; creates Entertainment Industry Financial Incentive Trust Fund; provides for sources of funds & purposes; requires funds to remain in trust fund at end of each fiscal year; provides for future review & termination or re-creation of fund. Effective Date: 07/01/2005 if enacted by 3/5ths vote of membership of each house of Legislature.

SB 162 (2R) by Senator Aronberg—

Voyeurism; revises elements of offense of voyeurism in order to eliminate acts of photographing, filming, videotaping, or recording, which are made a crime under offense of video voyeurism; provides that person commits offense of voyeurism when he or she secretly observes another person when other person is in location that provides reasonable expectation of privacy. Amends 810.14. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

SB 312 (2R) by Senator Fasano—

Prisoners/Sale of Literary Accounts; defines terms concerning sale of literary accounts & memorabilia by & on behalf of convicted felon; provides for lien in favor of state on proceeds or profits of sale of literary accounts, materials, & memorabilia payable to or accruing to convicted felon, representative of convicted felon, or profiteer of felony; provides for distribution of proceeds or profits of sale of literary accounts or memorabilia, etc. Amends 944.512, 960.291. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice

SB 544 (2R) by Senator Smith—

Psychotherapist-patient Privilege; redefines term "psychotherapist" to include certain advanced registered nurse practitioners for purposes of psychotherapist-patient privilege of Fla. Evidence Code. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Health Care and reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Judiciary

SB 724 (2R) by Senator Margolis and others—

Affordable Housing/Elderly; increases cap on certain loan amounts available to sponsors of housing for elderly. Amends 420.5087. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Community Affairs and Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

SB 730 (2R) by Senator Fasano—

Prohibition on Prostitution; redefines term "lewdness" to mean indecent or obscene act done in presence of any person, including law enforcement officer. Amends 796.07. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice

SB 1020 (2R) by Senator Haridopolos and others—

Police, Fire, SAR Dogs/Police Horses; prohibits intentionally & knowingly causing great bodily harm to or using deadly weapon upon said animals; prohibits actually & intentionally maliciously touching, striking, or causing bodily harm to said animals; prohibits maliciously harassing, teasing, interfering with, or attempting to interfere with said animals while animal is in performance of its duties; provides for restitution from violators, etc. Amends 843.19. Effective Date: 07/01/2005.

Reported favorably, with two amendments, by the Committee on Criminal Justice

CS/SB 1486 (2R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Garcia—

Property Ins./Hurricane Deductibles; provides that requirement for hurricane deductible to apply on annual basis applies to personal lines residential property insurance policies; requires insurers that provide commercial residential property insurance to offer alternative hurricane deductibles that apply on annual basis or to each hurricane. Amends 627.701. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

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
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
