I. Summary:

This legislation re-creates the Conservation and Recreation Lands Program Trust Fund without modification, effective November 4, 2008. The Conservation and Recreation Lands Program Trust Fund, FLAIR #77-2-931, is administered by the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. This fund was last re-created by Chapter 2001-34, Laws of Florida.

II. Present Situation:

Section 372.127, F.S., establishes the Conservation and Recreation Lands Program Trust Fund which provides receipt of funding for the management of conservation and recreational lands by the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission. Funds may be appropriated to the trust fund from the Conservation and Recreation Lands Trust Fund in the Department of Environmental Protection or from other sources as the Legislature may determine.

This bill re-creates the trust fund without modification.
