28 citizen advisory board ~~support organization~~ as required by s.
29 267.031(5)(m), the University of West Florida may use an
30 existing direct-support organization of the university
31 provided that the membership of the direct-support

1 organization is representative of the area of the state to be
2 served and provides the needed expertise in the area of
