CS/CS/SB 1018 (3R) by the Committees on Community Affairs, Domestic Security and Senator Bennett—

Tax Benefit/Catastrophic Emergencies; includes as infrastructure any fixed capital expenditure or fixed capital outlay associated with improvement of certain private facilities that owner agrees to make available as public emergency shelter or staging area for emergency response equipment during emergencies declared by state or local government; requires that improvements be limited to those necessary to meet current standards for emergency evacuation shelters, etc. Amends 212.055. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Read the second time on April 5, 2006

*Identical to **HB 737 (HC)** in the Committees on Domestic Security, Community Affairs, Government Efficiency Appropriations, and Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations*

CS/CS/SB 656 (3R) by the Committees on Banking and Insurance, Commerce and Consumer Services, Senator Peaden and others—

Financial Transactions; defines "security freeze"; authorizes consumer to place security freeze on his or her consumer report; authorizes consumer to allow specified temporary access to his or her consumer report during security freeze; provides that credit balances that result from performance of or participation in check-clearing functions are not subject to certain reporting requirements, etc. Creates 501.005, 655.851. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Read the second time on April 5, 2006

*Similar to **HB 37 (HC)** in the Committees on Commerce and Consumer Services, and Banking and Insurance*

CS/SB 1680 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and the Committee on Government Efficiency Appropriations (Atwater)—

Public Documents; requires that each state official, agency, board, & court provide to Library & Information Services Div. of Dept. of State annual list of public documents issued by official, agency, board, or court; defines term "publication" for purposes of requirement that executive agency maintain records of certain publication costs; revises form used by each state agency for purpose of purging publication mailing lists. Amends 257.05, 283.31,.55. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Read the second time on April 21, 2006

CS/CS/SB 2060 (3R) by the Committees on Community Affairs, Regulated Industries and Senator Clary—

Architecture & Interior Design; defines term "responsible supervising control"; authorizes Board of Architecture & Interior Design to adopt certain rules; authorizes certain architects to use title "Architect, Retired"; authorizes certain interior designers to use title "Interior Designer, Retired". Amends 481.203,.205,.223. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Read the second time on April 21, 2006

CS/SB 646 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Campbell—

Sexual & Career Offenders; revises definition of term "institution of higher education" to include career center; revises provisions re use of prior felonies for sexual predator determination; removes provisions allowing sexual predator to register at FDLE; revises provisions re definition of "sexual offender"; revises provision re offender's driver's license or identification card renewal, etc. Amends 775.21,.261, 943.0435, 944.606,.607. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Read the second time and amended on April 21, 2006

HB 699 (3R) by Representative Negron and others—

Health Care Practitioners; revises requirements for instruction of certain health care practitioners concerning domestic violence; provides requirements for supervision of certain said practitioners by physicians; eliminates option for osteopathic physicians to complete continuing education courses in end-of-life care in lieu of said education in AIDS/HIV; requires certain advanced registered nurse practitioners to file protocols with Nursing Board, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 1216 (SUB)** (Peaden) and read the second time on April 21, 2006*

CS/CS/SB 1112 (3R) by the Committees on Governmental Oversight and Productivity, Community Affairs and Senator Bennett—

Development Permits/Denial; requires county to give written notice of its decision to deny development permit; specifies information that notice must include; defines term "development permit"; requires municipality to give written notice of its decision to deny development permit; specifies information that notice must include. Creates 125.022, 166.033. Effective Date: 10/01/2006.

Read the second time and amended on April 21, 2006

CS/CS/SB 1090 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Environmental Preservation and Senator Baker—

Water Well Contractors; authorizes licensed water well contractors to facilitate performance of additional work incidental to construction, repair, or abandonment of water well; requires DEP to include administrative fee in its license-renewal method prescribed by rule; provides exemptions from continuing education requirements for water well contractors on active military duty & their spouses, etc. Amends 373.323,.324,.333. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Read the second time on April 21, 2006

CS/SB 876 (3R) by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Senator Smith—

William W. 'Bill' Hinkley Center/DEP; designates Florida Center for Solid & Hazardous Waste Management as "William W. 'Bill' Hinkley Center for Solid & Hazardous Waste Management"; directs DEP to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Read the second time on April 21, 2006

HB 121 (3R) by Representative Bendross-Mindingall and others—

Transportation Facility Designations; designates Osun's Village & African Caribbean Cultural Arts Corridor in Miami-Dade Co.; designates Burl Marler Walkway in Okaloosa Co.; designates Dr. Phillip A. Payne Bridge in Escambia Co.; designates Carlos C. Lopez-Aguilar Way, Reverend Samuel Atchison Boulevard, Toussaint L'Ouverture Boulevard, Reverend Gerard Jean-Juste Boulevard, & Adam Leigh Cann Building in Miami-Dade Co.; directs DOT to erect suitable markers, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 254 (SUB)** (Dockery), read the second time and amended on April 21, 2006*

CS/CS/SB 360 (3R) by the Committees on Justice Appropriations, Criminal Justice and Senator Campbell—

Commission on Capital Cases; specifies that capital collateral regional counsels are part of legislative branch; specifies criteria that private attorney must satisfy in order to be eligible to be appointed as counsel in postconviction capital collateral proceeding; provides that attorney may submit to CFO for approval proposed budget as alternative to statutory attorney's fees for representing capital defendant, etc. Amends Ch 27, 216.011. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Read the second time and amended on April 21, 2006

CS/SB 526 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Wise—

Juvenile Defendants/Public Defender; requires that public defender represent indigent child taken into custody under specified delinquency provisions; requires that child be represented at specified point in delinquency court proceedings unless right to counsel is waived after receiving advice of counsel; requires that court appoint counsel for said child if child's parent or legal guardian is alleged victim in case, etc. Amends 27.51, 985.203. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Read the second time on April 21, 2006

HB 7111 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Operations (SAC) and Representative Rivera—

Interference with Custody/OGSR; specifies that offense of interference with custody applies to taking of minor; revises defense to said offense for defendant who is victim of actual or imminent domestic violence to provide that defendant's reasonable belief that interference was necessary to escape from, or protect himself or herself from, domestic violence or to preserve minor or incompetent person from exposure to domestic violence constitutes defense, etc. Amends & Reenacts FS. Effective Date: 10/01/2006.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 708 (SUB)** (Webster) and read the second time on April 21, 2006*

HB 7113 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Operations (SAC) and Representative Rivera—

Interference with Custody/OGSR; expands public records exemption for specified info. contained in report made to sheriff or state attorney as part of statutory exception to offense of interference with custody; provides that address & telephone number of minor or incompetent person contained in such report is confidential & exempt from public records requirements; provides exception to exemption; provides for review & repeal; provides statement of public necessity. Amends 787.03. Effective Date: Contingent.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 710 (SUB)** (Webster) and read the second time on April 21, 2006*

CS/CS/SB 940 (3R) by the Committees on Justice Appropriations, Judiciary and Senator Posey—

Court Costs for Drug Court Programs; authorizes counties to provide by ordinance for funding of drug court programs through assessment of additional mandatory court cost; provides for assessment to be imposed against persons who plead guilty or no contest to, or are convicted of, certain drug-abuse prevention & control provisions or certain local ordinances or uniform traffic control laws involving alcohol or other substance use or abuse, etc. Creates 938.20. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 21, 2006

SB 1850 (3R) by Senator Rich and others—

CFS Department Programs; provides that marriage & family therapist may execute certificate for involuntary examination; requires that documentation of any evaluation performed by marriage & family therapist or mental health counselor be provided when patient is ordered to involuntary inpatient placement; requires service provider personnel who request exemption from disqualification to submit request within certain time after notification, etc. Amends FS. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 21, 2006

HB 7043 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Operations (SAC) and Representative Rivera—

Elderly Affairs/Health Info./OGSR; amends provision which provides exemption from public records requirements for personal identifying information in record held by Elderly Affairs Dept. re individual's health or eligibility for or receipt of health-related, elder care, or long-term care services; makes editorial changes; removes superfluous language; removes scheduled repeal of exemption. Amends 430.105. Effective Date: 10/01/2006.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 514 (SUB)** (Peaden) and read the second time on April 21, 2006*

CS/SB 1024 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Constantine—

Deferred Compensation Programs; revises term "employee"; authorizes governmental entities, by ordinance, contract agreement, or other documentation, to participate in deferred compensation plan of state & specifies responsibility of CFO with respect thereto; revises duties of State Board of Administration re establishment & management of deferred compensation plans for employees of governmental entities, etc. Amends 112.215, 20.121. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 21, 2006

CS/CS/SB 1510 (3R) by the Committees on Community Affairs, Children and Families and Senator Lynn—

Child Care Facilities; provides criteria that certain said facilities must meet in order to obtain & maintain designation as Gold Seal Quality Care provider; authorizes DCFS or local licensing agency to convert license or registration to probation status for violation of certain laws; authorizes provision of child care for period longer than otherwise authorized if parent or legal guardian works shift of 24 hours or more, etc. Amends Ch. 402. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Read the second time on April 21, 2006

CS/SB 2242 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Productivity and Senator Dockery—

Jeffrey Klapatch Act; provides for Driver Licenses Div. of HSMV to implement system that provides adult who signed minor's application for driver's license with Internet access to driver history record of minor; provides for termination of such access. Amends 322.20. Effective Date: 01/01/2007.

Read the second time on April 21, 2006

*Identical to **HB 1173 (HC)** in the Committees on Transportation, Governmental Oversight and Productivity, and Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations*

HB 7045 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Operations (SAC) and Representative Rivera—

Public Records & Meetings/AHCA/OGSR; amends provision which provides exemption from said records requirements for rebate amount, percent of rebate, manufacturer's pricing, supplemental rebate, & other trade secrets held by AHCA relative to preferred drug list established by AHCA & exemption from said meetings requirements for that portion of meeting of Medicaid Pharmaceutical & Therapeutics Comm. at which rebates, pricing, or other trade secrets are discussed, etc. Amends Ch. 409. Effective Date: 10/01/2006.

*Substituted for **CS/SB 516 (SUB)** (Peaden) and read the second time on April 21, 2006*

CS/CS/SB 786 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Commerce and Consumer Services, Senator Hill and others—

State Minimum Wage/Notification; provides definitions; requires employer to display posters at worksites to provide employees notice about said wage; requires Agency for Workforce Innovation to make available updated poster each year; provides for size & contents of posters. Creates 448.109. Effective Date: 01/01/2007.

Read the second time on April 21, 2006

CS/SB 1218 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary, Senator Bennett and others—

Recovery/Vehicles/Vessels; prescribes rates for towing & storage in counties & municipalities that have not established rates; requires rates for wrecker operator system of FHP to be established & adjusted biannually for purpose of ensuring that rates are equitable; revises certain requirements that notice be provided by mail to owner, insurance company, & persons claiming lien against vehicle or vessel, etc. Amends Chs. 125, 166, 321, 713. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Read the second time and amended on April 21, 2006

HB 7033 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Operations (SAC) and Representative Rivera—

Security System Plans/State/OGSR; amends provision which provides exemption from public records requirements for security system plans for any property owned by or leased to state or any of its political subdivisions & any privately owned or leased property; removes scheduled repeal of exemption under OGSR Act; amends provision which provides exemption from public meetings requirements for meeting that would reveal said plan or portion thereof, etc. Amends 119.071, 286.0113. Effective Date: 10/01/2006.

Substituted for CS/SB 696 (SUB) (Diaz de la Portilla) and read the second time on April 21, 2006

CS/CS/SB 2184 (3R) by the Committees on Children and Families, Judiciary and Senator Campbell—

Parental Relocation with a Child; deletes standards for determining whether to allow primary residential parent to move child; provides for notification of certain persons of intent to relocate child & provides procedures therefor; requires that certain information be provided on Notice of Intent to Relocate; provides that filing of certain notices & orders re uncontested relocation are exempt from filing fees, etc. Amends 61.13, 28.241; creates 61.13001. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Read the second time on April 21, 2006

HB 7023 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Operations (SAC) and Representative Rivera—

Medical Facilities Info./OGSR; reorganizes provisions, makes editorial changes, & removes superfluous language re medical facility terrorism response information; removes scheduled repeal of exemption under OGSR Act. Amends 381.95. Effective Date: 10/01/2006.

Substituted for CS/SB 698 (SUB) (Diaz de la Portilla) and read the second time on April 21, 2006

HB 273 (3R) by Representative Mayfield and others—

Outdoor Advertising Signs; revises provisions re proximity of vegetation & beautification projects to said signs; specifies distances that constitute view zone on interstate highways, expressways, federal-aid primary highways, and State Highway System for said signs; provides for claim of violation of view zone clearance requirements; revises provisions for height increase of certain outdoor advertising signs, etc. Amends 479.106,.25. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 566 (SUB) (Haridopolos) and read the second time on April 21, 2006

HB 7025 (3R) by the Committee on Governmental Operations (SAC) and Representative Rivera—

Emergency Mgmt. Plans/Hospitals/OGSR; amends provision which provides exemption from public records requirements for those portions of comprehensive emergency management plan that address response of public or private hospital to act of terrorism & which provides exemption from public meetings requirements for that portion of public meeting which would reveal information contained in said plan that addresses response of hospital to act of terrorism, etc. Amends 395.1056. Effective Date: 10/01/2006.

Substituted for CS/SB 700 (SUB) (Diaz de la Portilla) and read the second time on April 21, 2006

SB 2174 (3R) by Senator Peaden—

Contaminated Drycleaning; provides that drycleaning facility where accident caused or exacerbated contamination is eligible for exemption from liability; defines term "accident". Amends 376.3078. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 21, 2006

Identical to HB 1155 (HC) in the Committees on Environmental Preservation, Judiciary, and General Government Appropriations

HB 641 (3R) by Representative Russell and others—

Animal Service Providers; provides that ch. 474, F.S., re veterinary medical practice, does not apply to part-time worker or independent contractor who is hired by owner to provide certain services; provides for retroactive effect. Amends 474.203. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 1654 (SUB) (Baker) and read the second time on April 21, 2006

HB 209 (3R) by Representative Brummer and others—

Intangible Personal Property Tax; repeals provisions re annual intangible personal property tax; provides additional legislative intent re said tax; amends provisions to conform to repeal of said tax; provides for application of certain collection, administration, & enforcement provisions to taxation of certain leaseholds; authorizes DOR to adopt emergency implementing rules for certain time. Repeals & amends various ss. of Ch. 199; amends FS. Effective Date: 01/01/2007 except as otherwise provided.

Substituted for SB 714 (SUB) (Clary) and read the second time on April 21, 2006

SB 692 (3R) by Senator Webster—

Sales Tax/School Supplies & Clothing; specifies period during which sale of books, clothing, & school supplies is exempt from tax on sales, use, & other transactions; provides definitions; provides exceptions; authorizes DOR to adopt rules. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Read the second time and amended on April 21, 2006

SB 1074 (3R) by Senator Smith—

Tax/Obsolete Agricultural Equipment; provides for obsolete agricultural equipment to be assessed at its value as salvage; defines term "agricultural equipment"; provides procedure for taxpayer to claim right of assessment under this section; authorizes property appraiser to require information establishing taxpayer's right to classification. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 21, 2006

CS/SB 2432 (SO) by the Committee on Health Care and Senator Constantine—

Prepaid Limited Health Svc./Travel; exempts certain sellers of travel from licensing requirements to sell prepaid limited health service contracts that covers cost of transportation provided by air ambulance service. Amends 636.044. Effective Date: 07/01/2006.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Care

CS/CS/CS/SB 638 (SO) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Community Affairs, Criminal Justice and Senator Clary—

Sheltering of Sex Offender/Predator; requires Emergency Management Div., in conjunction with specified agencies, to set forth policy guidance for sheltering of individuals designated as sexual predators or subject to registration as sexual offenders; requires sexual predators & individuals subject to registration as sexual offenders seeking shelter to adhere to specified guidelines & provisions; provides penalties, etc. Amends 252.35, 775.21, 943.0435. Effective Date: 01/01/2007.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs and withdrawn from the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

CS/SB 306 (SO) by the Committee on Education and Senator Margolis—

School Year/Opening Date; amends specified provision re powers & duties of district school boards; provides requirement re opening date of school year; includes opening date requirement for participation in Fla. 
