## I. Summary:

This bill designates key lime pie as the official state pie.

This bill creates section 15.052, Florida Statutes.

## II. Present Situation:

Currently, no pie is designated as the official state pie.

Chapter 15, F.S. designates official state emblems. To date, there are designations for a state tree, state fruit, state beverage, citrus archive, shell, stone, gem, wildflower, play, animal, freshwater fish, saltwater fish, marine mammal, saltwater mammal, butterfly, reptile, air fair, rodeo, festival, moving image center and archive, litter control symbol, pageant, opera, renaissance festival, railroad museums, transportation museum, soil, fiddle contest, band, and sports hall of fame.

Key Lime Pie is one of the most enjoyed desserts in Florida. It is served in various forms in restaurants across the nation. The key limes (*Citrus aurantifolia* Swingle) used to make this dessert are named after the Florida Keys where they first originated in the United States. The first Key Lime Pie was created in the 1850's in south Florida.

**Section 1.** Creates s. 15.052, F.S., to designate Key Lime Pie as the official pie of Florida.

**Section 2.** Provides that this act shall take effect July 1, 2006.
