#### **SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [SPCC] GROUPING**

#### **CS/CS/SB 1276 (3R) by the Committees on Education Facilities Appropriations, Education Pre-K - 12 and Senator Bennett—**

**Educational Facilities Construction;** Increases the maximum authorized amount of a day-labor contract to \$280,000. Provides for such amount to be adjusted annually. Provides duties of the Office of Educational Facilities with respect to approving school district construction projects and assisting districts in developing lists of proposed facilities. Limits total project costs except for providential causes, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

*Read the second time and amended on April 2, 2008*

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#### **SB 2516 (3R) by Senator Haridopolos—**

**East Central Florida Memory Disorder Clinic;** Amends provisions to change the name of the "East Central Florida Memory Disorder Clinic at the Joint Center of Advanced Therapeutics and Biomedical Research of the Florida Institute of Technology and Holmes Regional Medical Center, Inc." to "The Memory Disorder Clinic, Inc., operating in Brevard County," etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

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#### **SB 1092 (3R) by the Committee on Health Policy (Dawson)—**

**Alzheimer's Disease/Medicaid Waiver Program;** Extends the authority to continue the Alzheimer's Disease Medicaid home and community-based-services waiver program until the close of the 2010 Regular Session of the Legislature. Requires the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability (OPPAGA) to conduct an evaluation of comparable Medicaid home and community-based-services waiver programs to determine their comparative cost effectiveness, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

#### **ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [EPCC] GROUPING**

#### **CS/CS/SB 2082 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Banking and Insurance, Senator Bennett and others—**

**Insurance;** Requires that an applicant for licensure as an insurance agent, customer representative, adjuster, service representative, managing general agent, or reinsurance intermediary provide to the Department of Financial Services his or her home and office telephone numbers and e-mail address. Revises the elements of the offense known as "churning" to include direct or indirect purchases made for the purpose of earning fees or commissions, etc. Effective Date: 01/01/2009.

*Read the second time and amended on April 2, 2008*

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**CS/CS/SB 2012 (3R) by the Committees on Health Policy, Banking and Insurance, Senator Deutch and others—**

**Insurance Policies;** Revises provisions requiring that insurers notify policyholders of the right to designate a secondary addressee to receive a notice of termination of long-term care insurance policies. Extends the period within which certain insurers must permit claims from a Holocaust victim or from a beneficiary, descendant, or heir of such a victim, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008 except as otherwise provided.

*Read the second time and amended on April 2, 2008*

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**CS/SB 648 (3R) by the Committee on Judiciary and Senator Posey—**

**Insurable Interest/Insurance Contracts;** Provides for the requirement of an insurable interest in an insured at the time of an insurance contract. Provides for actions by the insured to recover benefits under such a contract paid to a person lacking such an interest at the time such contract was executed. Requires the consent of the person insured for certain contracts, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

*Read the second time and amended on April 2, 2008*

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**CS/SB 604 (3R) by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator Jones—**

**Pari-mutuel Wagering;** Removes provisions requiring an application to the Division of Pari-mutuel Wagering for a permit to conduct quarter horse race meetings. Provides for a full schedule of races for a new permitholder to be eligible to renew a cardroom license. Provides an exception to the requirement that each thoroughbred permitholder run an average of one race per racing day against horses bred in this state that have preference over nonstate horses, etc Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

*Read the second time and amended on April 2, 2008*

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**CS/SB 1008 (3R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice and Senator Storms—**

**Failure to Redeliver Hired Vehicles;** Provides that information not otherwise required by law is not required in order to report a hired vehicle as stolen. Requires a law enforcement agency to report a hired vehicle as stolen to the National Crime Information Center and the Florida Crime Information Center, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

**Political Subdivision/Officer & Employee Conduct;** Specifies standards of conduct for officers and employees of entities serving as the chief administrative officer of political subdivisions. Provides for penalties to be imposed against persons other than lobbyists or public officers and employers. Provides for the Commission on Ethics to report to the Governor violations involving persons other than lobbyists or public officers and employees, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

**SB 1036 (SO) by Senator Lawson and others—**

**Inmate Death Notification;** Requires the Department of Corrections to include, in its rules, procedures to provide notice of the death of inmates in state correctional facilities. Prescribes the information to be provided in writing, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

**CS/SB 656 (SO) by the Committee on Banking  
and Insurance and Senator Joyner—**

**Judicial and Execution Sales of Property;** Requires that before a court-ordered sale of property, the mortgagee or lienholder must serve a "Notice Regarding Requested Property Sale" to the property owner or owners which will inform the owner of the possibility of relief through the filing of a bankruptcy petition and warning against purported foreclosure "saving" schemes. Provides for an affirmative defense for failing to provide the notice, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

**SB 96 (SO) by Senator Aronberg—**

**Marital Assets and Liabilities;** Defines "barrier to remarriage" to mean, without limitation and not exclusively, any religious, secular, or conscientious restraint or inhibition of which the spouse is aware, which is imposed on the other spouse, and which exists by reason of the spouse's commission or withholding of any voluntary act. Authorizes the court to take into consideration the failure or refusal of one spouse to remove a barrier to the remarriage, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

**CS/SB 1130 (SO) by the Committee on Judiciary,  
Senator Peaden and others—**

**Firearms in Motor Vehicles;** Creates the "Preservation and Protection of the Right to Keep and Bear Arms in Motor Vehicles Act of 2008." Prohibits a public or private entity from prohibiting a customer, employee, or invitee from possessing any legally owned firearm that is lawfully possessed and locked inside or locked to a private motor vehicle in a parking lot, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Directs the Chief Financial Officer to draw a warrant. Requires the purchase of an annuity. Provides for the waiver of specified tuition and fees. Provides conditions for payment. Provides legislative intent, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Provides for reimbursement and indemnification, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**CS/SB 192 (SO) by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Senator Baker and others—**

**State Parks;** Creates penalties for the violation of rules adopted under the provisions of state parks and preserves and for specified activities within the boundaries of a state park. Authorizes the operation of a golf cart within a state park under certain circumstances. Authorizes state employees, state park volunteers, and state park visitors to operate golf carts and utility vehicles on public roads within state park boundaries, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

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**CS/CS/SB 1428 (SO) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Governmental Operations and Senator Fasano—**

**Retirement/Community Colleges & Universities;** Clarifies that the term "compensation" for purposes of the benefit retirement program or the Public Employee Optional Retirement Program of the FRS does not include fees or salary payments made from a faculty practice plan authorized by the Board of Governors of the State University System for clinical faculty at a state university having a faculty practice plan, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Removes a requirement for the issuance of warrants to political subdivisions eligible for certain funding, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

**Museums/Conveyance of Bodies Into or Out of State;** Authorizes a museum that is accredited by the American Association of Museums, or certified by the Association of Science-Technology Centers, to convey plastinated bodies into or out of the state for exhibition and educational purposes without the consent of the board, if the museum notifies the board regarding the duration and location of the exhibition at least 30 days before the intended conveyance, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

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**SB 784 (SO) by Senator Bennett—**

**Local Telecommunications Services;** Repeals the provisions relating to procedures for seeking a stay from the Florida Public Service Commission of a price reduction for basic local telecommunications services, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

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**SM 1454 (SO) by Senator Wilson—**

**Federal 2010 Census in Creole;** Urges the Congress of the United States to require the United States Census Bureau to make census forms for the United States Decennial Census of 2010 available in the Creole language to provide for optimal accessibility by the Haitian population of Florida and to prepare the census forms in a manner that will allow a respondent to indicate whether he or she is a Haitian national or of Haitian descent, etc.

**SB 1022 (2R) by Senator Peadar and others—**

**Health Flex Plans;** Revises eligibility for enrollment in a health flex plan. Extends the expiration date of the health flex plan program to July 1, 2013, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

**CS/SB 1096 (2R) by the Committee on Finance and Tax, Senator Margolis and others—**

**Wine Production and Shipment;** Authorizes a winery to directly ship wine to a resident of this state only under a winery shipper's license obtained from the Division of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco. Provides for the monthly payment of taxes to the Department of Revenue, and a monthly report to the division. Requires recipients of a direct shipment of wine to be 21 years of age. Requires proof of age and the signature of a recipient. Provides for severability, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

**SM 2452 (2R) by Senator Posey—**

**National Catastrophe Insurance Program;** Urges the Congress of the United States to support a National Catastrophe Insurance Program, etc.

**Drivers' Licenses/Suspended, Revoked, or Canceled;** Provides that a person commits a second-degree misdemeanor upon a first conviction and a first-degree misdemeanor upon a second or subsequent conviction of the same offense if the person's driver's license or driving privilege is canceled, suspended, or revoked for offenses, including, but not limited to, failure to pay child support, failure to comply with a civil penalty, and designation as a habitual traffic offender, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and the Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations, reports the committee substitute favorably*

## RESPONSIBLE REGULATION POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [RPCC] GROUPING

**CS/SB 1378 (2R) by the Committee on Community Affairs, Senator Fasano and others—**

**Display of Flags/Homeowners' Associations;** Authorizes homeowners to display certain flags in a specified manner. Provides that such provisions apply to nonmandatory homeowners' associations and community development districts, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs and the Committee on Military Affairs and Domestic Security, reports the committee substitute favorably, with one amendment*

**CS/SB 1630 (2R) by the Committee on Agriculture—**

**OGRS/Department of Agriculture & Consumer Services;** Revises and readopts an exemption from the public records requirements for information that is deemed confidential under federal law, and that is provided to the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services during a joint investigation concerning food safety or food-borne illness, as a requirement for conducting a federal-state contract or partnership activity, or for regulatory review, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

*Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Agriculture and the Committee on Governmental Operations reports the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules*

**CS/SB 2224 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Operations and the Committee on Community Affairs—**

**OGRS/Paratransit Services;** Expands an exemption from public records requirements which is provided for information identifying an applicant for or a recipient of paratransit services so that the exemption applies to all agencies. Repeals a provision relating to the prior exemption provided for such information. Deletes provisions providing for repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

**SB 54 (2R) by Senator Joyner—**

**Relief/Daniel Decembre/Orange County School Board;** Provides relief for Daniel Decembre, a minor, by and through his parents and natural guardians, Desnar and Mignone Decembre, for injuries and damages he sustained as a result of negligence by agents and employees of the school board, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

**SB 60 (2R) by Senator Ring—**

**Relief/Adrian Fuentes/South Broward Hospital Dist.;** Provides relief for Adrian Fuentes, a minor, by and through his parents and natural guardians, Luz Fuentes and Jose Fuentes for injuries and damages sustained as a result of the negligence of the South Broward Hospital District, d/b/a Memorial Hospital Primary Care Center. Provides for payment to aspecial needs trust established for the care and benefit of Adrian Fuentes, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

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
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
