BILLS ON THIRD READING

CS/CS/SB 2212 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Communications and Public Utilities and the Committee on Communications and Public Utilities (Bennett)—

Public Service Commission; Revises the deadline for a sitting member of the Public Service Commission to give notice of intent to seek reappointment. Renames the Committee on Public Service Commission Oversight, a standing joint committee of the Legislature, as the "Committee on Public Counsel Oversight." Deletes the committee's authority to recommend to the Governor nominees to fill vacancies on the Public Service Commission, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time on April 16, 2008

CS/CS/SB 482 (3R) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Community Affairs, Senator Garcia and others—

Affordable Housing; Provides for the assessment of property receiving the low-income housing tax credit. Specifies the criteria to be used in arriving at just valuation of a structural improvement, condominium parcel, or cooperative parcel. Revises purposes for which State Apartment Incentive Loans may be used. Revises requirements for distribution of funds in the Local Government Housing Trust Fund, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2008

CS/CS/SB 1430 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Criminal Justice and Senator Aronberg—

Sexual Predators/Sexual Offenders/Public Safety; Revises provisions relating to reimbursement of specified costs by sexual predators. Specifies residency distance limitations for persons convicted of certain sexual offenses. Provides additional residency restrictions for certain offenders. Revises provisions relating to probation or community control for sexual predators and sexual offenders, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 29, 2008

CS/CS/CS/HB 653 (3R) by the Policy & Budget Council, the Policy & Budget Council, the Schools & Learning Council, Representative Traviesa and others—

Corporate Income Tax Credit Scholarship Program; Revises program purposes; revises provisions authorizing total amount of tax credits that may be granted; revises authorized uses of scholarship funds; revises provisions relating to expenditure of contributions; authorizes expenditure of contributions for specified administrative expenses by certain scholarship-funding organizations; provides for annual return of specified eligible contributions to State Treasury; revises scholarship amounts, etc. Effective Date: 06/30/2008.

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 1440 (SUB) (Gaetz), read the second time and amended on April 29, 2008

CS/HB 7045 (3R) by the Policy & Budget Council, the Schools & Learning Council, Representative Pickens and others—

Public School Curricular Standards; Requires State Board of Education to review Sunshine State Standards & replace them with enhanced curricular standards; provides for adoption, review, & revision of standards; restricts expenditure of appropriations for FCAT preparation; specifies additional criteria for evaluating instructional materials; revises requirements for statewide assessment program & Commissioner of Education duties, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 1914 (SUB) (Gaetz), read the second time and amended on April 30, 2008

CS/HB 173 (3R) by the Safety & Security Council, Representative N. Thompson and others—

Controlled Substances; Defines "cultivating" for specified purposes; prohibits owning, leasing, or possessing place, structure, trailer, or other described place with knowledge that it will be used to manufacture, sell, or traffic in controlled substance; provides that possession of specified number or more of cannabis plants is prima facie evidence of intent to sell or distribute, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for CS/SB 390 (SUB) (Oelrich) and read the second time on April 30, 2008

CS/CS/SB 652 (3R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Governmental Operations and Senator Lynn—

Workplace Safety; Creates the Florida Public Task Force on Workplace Safety within the Safety Florida Consultation Program at the University of South Florida. Provides the purpose of the task force. Requires that the task force address certain issues concerning workplace safety in the public and private sectors. Provides for staffing. Authorizes the task force to procure information or assistance from any officer or agency of the state, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Read the second time and amended on April 30, 2008

CS/HB 225 (3R) by the Safety & Security Council, Representative Kiar and others—

Telephone Caller Identification; Prohibits entering or causing to be entered false information into telephone caller identification system with intent to deceive, defraud, or mislead; provides that violation is unlawful trade practice under specified provisions; provides for enhancement of penalties when violation is committed during commission of criminal offense or when violation facilitates criminal offense. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Substituted for CS/SB 694 (SUB) (Aronberg) and read the second time on April 30, 2008

CS/HB 643 (3R) by the Jobs & Entrepreneurship Council, Representative Ford and others—

Foreclosure Fraud; Provides legislative findings & intent relating to need to protect homeowners who enter into agreements designed to save homes from foreclosure; prohibits foreclosure consultants from engaging in specified acts or failing to perform contracted services; requires all agreements for foreclosure-related services & foreclosure-rescue services to be in writing; specifies required information in written agreements, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 992 (SUB) (Fasano) and read the second time on April 30, 2008

HB 461 (3R) by Representative Patronis and others—

Health Flex Plans; Revises eligibility for enrollment in a health flex plan. Extends the expiration date of the health flex plan program to July 1, 2013, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for SB 1022 (SUB) (Peadar) and read the second time on April 30, 2008

CS/HB 559 (3R) by the Safety & Security Council, Representative Schenck and others—

Material Harmful to Minors; Prohibits distributing certain materials to minors; prohibits knowingly using minor in production of certain materials, regardless of whether those materials are intended for distribution to minors or actually distributed to minors; provides that ignorance of minor's age or minor's consent is not defense in prosecution for specified violations; revises legislative intent concerning enforcement of such laws with respect to minors, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 1128 (SUB) (Fasano) and read the second time on April 30, 2008

CS/HB 547 (3R) by the Environment & Natural Resources Council and Representative Kreegel—

Water Pollution Control; Provides requirements for basin management action plans; allows such plans to take into account benefits of pollutant load reduction achieved by point or nonpoint sources; requires that DEP adopt such plan or amendment thereto by secretarial order pursuant to state law, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Substituted for CS/CS/SB 1208 (SUB) (Gaetz) and read the second time on April 30, 2008

SB 1554 (3R) by Senator Wise—

Firesafety/Structure Markings; Requires owners of certain structures with light-frame truss-type construction to mark such structures with signs or symbols. Requires the State Fire Marshal to conduct a study on the use of Voice over Internet Protocol telephone service for monitoring fire alarm systems. Revises provisions relating to uniform firesafety standards to include application to tunnels, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and amended on April 30, 2008

CS/HB 197 (3R) by the Environment & Natural Resources Council and Representative Kendrick—

Pest Control; Provides for enactment of Pest Control Compact & state participation in such interstate compact. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

HB 7033 (3R) by the Government Efficiency & Accountability Council and Representative Gardiner—

Pub. Rec./Complaint of Discrimination; Transfers provisions which provide public records exemption for complaints & other records in custody of any agency in executive branch of state government which relate to complaint of discrimination; expands exemption to provide for applicability to any agency rather than any agency in executive branch of state government; provides for review & repeal of exemption; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

CS/HB 1429 (3R) by the Healthcare Council and Representative Gardiner—

Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services; Provides service delivery strategies & data sharing agreements; establishes process for DCFS to contract with community-based managing entities; specifies qualifying criteria for contracts between DCFS & managing entities for provision of behavioral health services; creates community-based systems of care; authorizes implementation of managing entities by DCFS; specifies responsibilities of managing entities, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Growth Management; Deletes an exemption from the limitation on the frequency of amendments of comprehensive plans. Requires counties to certify that they have prepared a list of county-owned property appropriate for affordable housing before obtaining certain funding. Extends the date for local governments to adopt plan amendments to implement a financially feasible capital improvements element, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation

**CS/CS/CS/SB 1978 (SO) by the Committees on
Transportation and Economic Development
Appropriations, Transportation and Economic
Development Appropriations, Transportation and
Senator Baker—**

Department of Transportation; Requires the DOT to establish a transportation methodology to serve as the basis for sustainable development impact assessments. Expands the power of authorities to borrow money to include issuing certain debt obligations. Authorizes a lease agreement of up to 50 years for Alligator Alley. Authorizes the driving of a hybrid, low-emission, or energy-efficient vehicle in a HOV lane regardless of occupancy, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time, pending amendment #1 (037438) by Senator Dockery, and with Point of Order having been made by Senator Villalobos

**CS/SB 1490 (SO) by the Committee on
Community Affairs, Senator Bennett and
others—**

Affordable Housing; Provides for the assessment of structural improvements, condominium parcels, or cooperative parcels on land owned by a community land trust and used to provide affordable housing. Provides that property owned by certain nonprofit entities or Florida-based limited partnerships and used or held for the purpose of providing affordable housing to certain income-qualified persons is exempt from ad valorem taxation, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs and the Committee on Finance and Tax, reports the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committee on General Government Appropriations

**CS/SB 2094 (SO) by the Committee on Finance
and Tax, Senator Webster and others—**

Sales Tax Exemption/Books/Clothing/School Supplies; Specifies a period during which the sale of clothing and school supplies is exempt from the tax on sales, use, and other transactions. Provides definitions and exceptions. Authorizes the Department of Revenue to adopt rules, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Finance and Tax

**CS/SB 2170 (SO) by the Committee on Higher
Education, Senator Oelrich and others—**

Retirement; Clarifies that the term "compensation" for purposes of the benefit retirement program or the Public Employee Optional Retirement Program of the Florida Retirement System does not include fees or salary payments made from a faculty practice plan authorized by the Board of Governors of the State University System for clinical faculty at a state university having a faculty practice plan, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Higher Education

**CS/CS/SB 2714 (SO) by the Committees on
Transportation and Economic Development
Appropriations, Commerce, Senator Fasano and
others—**

Economic Development; Establishes the Building Florida's Future Revolving Loan Guarantee Program within the Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development. Provides for the program to provide loan guarantees or credit enhancements to units of local government or to private entities for use in constructing or modernizing facilities and infrastructure necessary to attract or expand certain industries as part of an economic-development project, etc. Effective Date: Contingent.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

**CS/HB 257 (SO) by the Healthcare Council,
Representatives Traviesa, Mayfield and others—**

Abortion; Requires third trimester abortions be performed in hospital; provides for disciplinary actions; requires ultrasound that is reviewed with patient; specifies who must perform required duties; requires written certification when patient declines review; provides exemptions; revises printed materials requirements; revises parental notice provisions; requires appointment of guardian ad litem for minor petitioning for waiver, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Read the second time and with pending amendment #1 (386098) by Senator Webster on April 24, 2008

**ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES POLICY AND
CALENDAR COMMITTEE [EPCC] GROUPING**

CS/CS/SB 282 (2R) by the Committees on Criminal Justice, Transportation, Senator Lynn and others—

Drivers' License Restrictions/Person Under 18 Yrs.; Restricts the number of certain passengers permitted in a vehicle operated by a person under 18 years of age unless accompanied by a driver at least 21 years of age. Provides for secondary enforcement. Provides citation procedures for violation of such restrictions, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice

CS/SB 386 (2R) by the Committee on Health Regulation and Senator Crist—

Food Service/Restroom Inspections; Requires the Division of Hotels and Restaurants within the Department of Business and Professional Regulation to inspect toilet facilities of public food service establishments. Provides the minimum sanitation standards for toilet facilities to include, but not be limited to, privacy of occupants, placement so that a patron does not pass through food-preparation or utensil-washing areas, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Regulated Industries and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation and the Committee on General Government Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/CS/SB 920 (2R) by the Committees on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Governmental Operations, Transportation, Senator Fasano and others—

Driver's License Fees; Increases the nonrefundable service charge paid to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles or to the clerk of the court to reinstate a suspended driver's license and privilege to drive. Increases the civil penalty a person must pay for a late payment of civil traffic penalties. Increases the fees for reinstating a suspended or revoked driver's license or commercial motor vehicle license, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Operations and the Committee on Finance and Tax, reports the committee substitute favorably and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, and the Committee on General Government Appropriations reports the committee substitute favorably

CS/CS/SB 1422 (2R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Banking and Insurance and Senator Bennett—

Commercial Property Insurance; Excludes nonassessable commercial property insurance from emergency assessments for the Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund. Provides rate standards regarding nonassessable commercial property insurance. Provides that nonassessable commercial property insurance is not subject to a determination that the rate is excessive or unfairly discriminatory, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and the Committee on Commerce reports the committee substitute favorably and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on General Government Appropriations

CS/CS/CS/SB 2156 (2R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Governmental Operations and the Committee on Banking and Insurance—

Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund; Creates the Division of the Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund as a division of the State Board of Administration. Requires that the division enter into a contract with each insurer writing covered policies in this state to provide to the insurer reimbursement as prescribed by state law. Extends for an additional year the offer of reimbursement coverage of up to \$10 million for specified insurers, etc. Effective Date: 06/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Operations and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on General Government Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 2220 (2R) by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations and the Committee on Transportation—

Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles; Reenacts and amends the provision relating to the creation of the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (HSMV) under the Florida Government Accountability Act. Requires the HSMV to collect and report to the Legislature information concerning customer service at driver's license offices. Deletes provisions exempting certain persons from the requirement to surrender a license issued by another jurisdiction, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 2338 (2R) by the Committees on Commerce, Banking and Insurance and Senator Aronberg—

Motor Vehicle Insurance/PIP; Revises the schedule of maximum charges on which an insurer may base a limited reimbursement for certain medical services, supplies, and care for injured persons covered by personal injury protection. Specifies a minimum amount for the applicable fee schedule or payment limitation under Medicare for such reimbursements, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce

LAW AND JUSTICE POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [LPCC] GROUPING

CS/SB 1086 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Bennett and others—

Illegal or Undocumented Aliens/DOC; Requires the Department of Corrections and the Parole Commission to establish agreements to implement a federal deportation program for state inmates. Requires the DOC to coordinate with federal authorities to determine immigration status and eligibility for removal. Authorizes the control release dates to be set after the alien has served a minimum 50 percent of his or her court imposed sentence, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and the Committee on Judiciary reports the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations

RESPONSIBLE REGULATION POLICY AND CALENDAR COMMITTEE [RPCC] GROUPING

CS/SB 640 (2R) by the Committee on Community Affairs, Senator Oelrich and others—

Local Governments/Financial Management; Revises a requirement that the sheriff and the clerk of the circuit court keep financial statements and books of accounts in accordance with the Uniform Local Government Financial Management and Reporting Act. Clarifies that the act does not authorize the clerk to audit the offices of the county constitutional officers unless otherwise provided by the charter or approved by avote of the electors, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs and withdrawn from the Committee on Judiciary

CS/CS/SB 1296 (2R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Senator Saunders and others—

Water Management Districts; Reenacts specified provisions relating to the creation of the WMDs, pursuant to the provisions of the Florida Government Accountability Act. Eliminates the Oklawaha River Basin Advisory Council. Provides that a WMD's millage rate is subject to annual authorization by the Legislature. Revises the beginning and ending dates of a district's fiscal year. Revises meeting requirements for members of the governing boards of WMDs, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on General Government Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 2246 (2R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Agriculture, Senator Baker and others—

Revises the definition of "agricultural enclave," etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

SB 1044 (2R) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and others—

Child Abuse, Abandonment, or Neglect Reporting; Requires the Department of Children and Family Services to annually report to the Legislature information concerning reports, investigations, and prosecutions involving child abuse, abandonment, or neglect, investigations and fines imposed for false reports, and reports resulting in prosecution, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice

CS/SB 1950 (2R) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Rich—

Forensic Services for Retarded or Autistic Persons; Revises requirements regarding the appointment of experts to evaluate competency if a defendant's suspected mental condition is retardation or autism, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and the Committee on Criminal Justice reports the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committee on Judiciary and withdrawn from the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

SB 2564 (2R) by Senator Fasano and others—

Suicide Prevention Education/School Boards; Requires that, beginning with the 2008-2009 school year, each school district provide access to suicide prevention education for all instructional and administrative staff using resources approved by the Statewide Office of Suicide Prevention, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 and reported favorably by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and withdrawn from the Committee on Education Pre-K - 12 Appropriations

CS/CS/CS/SB 2762 (2R) by the Committees on Governmental Operations, Judiciary, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Senator Dockery and others—

Confidential Records of Children/Access; Requires that the case file of a child under the supervision or in the custody of the Department of Children and Family Services be maintained in a complete and accurate manner. Specifies who has access to the case file and the records in the file. Requires that the department release information in a manner and setting that is appropriate to the child's age and maturity and the nature of the information, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Operations

CS/SB 2866 (2R) by the Committee on Health Regulation, Senator Diaz de la Portilla and others—

Practice of Medicine; Prohibits the Department of Health from registering a person as a resident physician, intern, or fellow, or issuing a license to practice medicine to a person who is a United States citizen or resident, and who has traveled to Cuba for medical training or a medical degree. Specifies that the prohibition does not apply to any native or citizen of Cuba who received his or her medical training or medical degree prior to immigrating to the U.S., etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

CS/SB 668 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Posey and others—

Child-restraint Requirements; Provides specified child-restraint requirements for children ages 4 through 7. Redefines the term "motor vehicle" so as to exclude certain vehicles for such requirements. Provides a grace period. Provides exceptions to such requirements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008 except as otherwise provided.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Transportation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and withdrawn from the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

SB 1626 (2R) by Senator Alexander—

Charter County Transit System Surtax; Renames the Charter County Transit System Surtax as the Charter County Transportation System Surtax. Expands the eligibility to levy the surtax to all charter counties, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation and reported favorably by the Committee on Community Affairs and withdrawn from the Committee on Finance and Tax, and withdrawn from the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

CS/CS/SB's 2086, SB 2498 (2R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Regulated Industries, Senators Jones and Bennett—

Department of Business and Professional Regulation; (THIS BILL COMBINES S2086 & S2498) Requires that hazard insurance be based upon the replacement cost of the property to be insured as determined by an independent insurance appraisal or update of a prior appraisal. Provides for coverage by developer-controlled associations. Changes the name of the Division of Florida Land Sales, Condominiums, and Mobile Homes to the Division of Florida Condominiums, Timeshares, and Mobile Homes, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008 except as otherwise provided.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries and the Committee on Banking and Insurance, reports the committee substitute favorably, with two amendments and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and withdrawn from the Committee on Governmental Operations and withdrawn from the Committee on General Government Appropriations

CS/SB 2272 (2R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance and Senator Posey—

Escrow Agents; Prohibits unauthorized persons from transacting business using "escrow" in a name or a title under certain circumstances. Provides certain exceptions to such prohibition. Authorizes a person aggrieved by a violation of the act to bring an action for declaratory relief. Provides for recovery by an injured person of actual damages, plus attorney's fees and court costs. Provides criminal penalties, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, and withdrawn from the Committee on Commerce and withdrawn from the Committee on Judiciary

CS/SB 2374 (2R) by the Committee on Commerce and Senator Diaz de la Portilla—

Counterfeit Goods; Provides that possession of more than a specified number of counterfeit items, unless satisfactorily explained, allows an inference that such property is possessed with intent to offer it for sale or distribution in certain circumstances. Prohibits specified offenses involving forging or counterfeiting private labels, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Commerce and the Committee on Criminal Justice reports the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committee on Judiciary and withdrawn from the Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations

CS/SB 2504 (2R) by the Committee on Regulated Industries, Senator Posey and others—

Residential Properties; Provides for the regulation and exemption from regulation for homeowners' association swimming pools. Revises provisions relating to homeowners' association board meetings, inspection and copying of records, and reserve accounts of budgets. Provides requirements for secret ballots. Requires that the disclosure summary to prospective parcel owners include additional provisions. Creates the "Home Court Advantage Dispute Resolution Act," etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries and withdrawn from the Committee on Community Affairs and withdrawn from the Committee on Judiciary

CS/SB 2864 (2R) by the Committee on Regulated Industries and Senator King—

Beverage Law; Extends to importers and primary American sources of supply, brand owners, and brand registrants, and brokers, sales agents, and sales persons thereof, the prohibition against providing certain financial assistance to retail vendors, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Regulated Industries and withdrawn from the Committee on Finance and Tax, and withdrawn from the Committee on General Government Appropriations

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CS/SB 708 (2R) by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation, Senator Saunders and others—

Water Management; Directs the Secretary of Environmental Protection to coordinate with the water management districts to conduct a study examining all current and available desalination technologies. Creates the Reclaimed Water Coordination Task Force. Requires that the task force review certain rules, programs, and policies when preparing its recommendations. Requires that the DEP and each WMD encourage the use of pilot projects for certain purposes, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation, and withdrawn from the Committee on General Government Appropriations

CS/SB 1376 (2R) by the Committee on General Government Appropriations and Senator Dean—

Agriculture; Prohibits county government imposition of an assessment or fee for stormwater management on agricultural land meeting certain requirements. Expands the applicability of an exemption from a local business tax receipt for the privilege of selling specified products. Provides conditions for use of Casuarina cunninghamiana as a windbreak for commercial citrus groves. Expands the materials used in agricultural operations that can be openly burned, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Agriculture and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on General Government Appropriations and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 1996 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Operations and Senator Crist—

Public Libraries/Internet Safety Education Program; Encourages all public libraries to implement an Internet safety education program for children and adults for the purpose of promoting the use of prudent online department and broadening awareness of online predators. Requires libraries to annually report to the Division of Library and Information Services of the Department of State the number of users who complete the program, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2008.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Operations and the Committee on Criminal Justice reports the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations

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
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
