SB 622

Orders of No Contact with Victims of Crimes by Senator Dockery

Requires that offenders convicted of specified violent offenses, including, but not limited to, arson, sexual battery, robbery, kidnapping, aggravated child abuse, aggravated abuse of an elderly person or disabled adult, aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, murder, manslaughter, or aggravated stalking be prohibited from having any contact with the victim for the duration of the sentence imposed.

Authorizes the court to reconsider such prohibition upon the request of a guardian ad litem for a child victim if such person affirms that he or she does not believe that the contact would be harmful to the child.

Provides penalties and that the penalty for violation of such an order run consecutive to the sentence for the original violation. (See bill for details)
