SB 2154 Juvenile Justice by the Committee on Criminal Justice

Provides that confidential information obtained during an official's service with juvenile delinquents may be shared with authorized personnel of the Department of Children and Family Services (DCFS).

Repeals provisions relating to the early delinquency intervention program. Removes references related to the condition of participation in an early delinquency intervention program when the court considers where to commit a delinquent.

Requires the Department of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) to adopt rules to establish procedures to provide ordinary medical care, mental health, substance abuse, and developmental disabilities services to youth within the juvenile justice continuum. Requires that, to the extent possible within available fiscal resources, the procedures must be commensurate with procedures that youth receive in the community.

Deletes references to the DCFS for contracting services that carry out the purposes of the DJJ.

Transfers the responsibility for the juvenile justice training program from the Juvenile Justice Standards and Training Commission to the DJJ. (See bill for details)
