CS/CS/SB 350 (2R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Agriculture and Senator Dean—

Tomato Food Safety; Requires minimum food safety standards for producing, harvesting, packing, and repacking tomatoes. Authorizes the DOACS to inspect tomato farms, greenhouses, and packinghouses or repackers. Provides a presumption that tomatoes introduced into commerce are safe for human consumption under certain circumstances. Revises duties of the Division of Fruit and Vegetables for tomato food safety inspections, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

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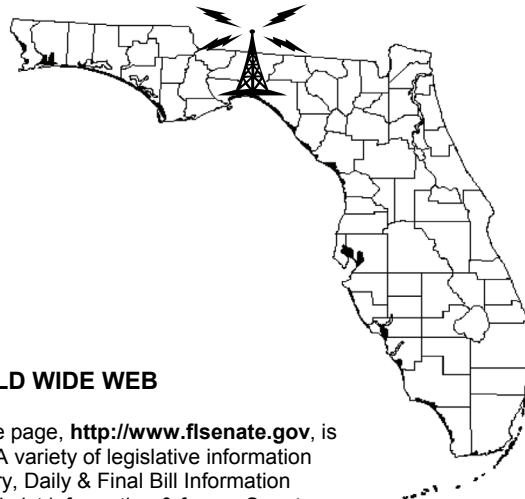
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
