Specifies that the provisions do not affect any common-law duty of care owed by a person or entity in possession or control of a business premises, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Sovereign Immunity; Increases the statutory limits on liability for tort claims against the state and its agencies and subdivisions. Provides for application of the act to claims arising on or after the effective date. Effective Date: 10/01/2011.

CS/SB 844 (2R) by the Committee on Criminal Justice, Senator Bennett and others—

Insurance; Expands the definition of "affiliated party" to include certain third-party marketers. Includes family members of insurance agents in a prohibition related to the transaction of life insurance. Prohibits the Department of Financial Services from issuing certain licenses in certain circumstances. Increases the administrative fine that may be imposed for each willful violation of the offenses of twisting and churning, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Collective Bargaining for Certain Public Employees; Specifies that for purposes of resolving an impasse the sheriff, the tax collector, the property appraiser, the supervisor of elections, and the clerk of the circuit court are each deemed the "legislative body" for their respective employees, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

CS/SB 1118 (2R) by the Committee on Community Affairs, Senator Altman and others—

Docks; Authorizes the placement of roofs on certain residential single-family docks. Authorizes the DEP to adopt rules that include special criteria for approving certain docking facilities in shellfish harvesting waters. Authorizes the department to maintain a list of projects or activities for applicants to consider when developing proposals in order to meet mitigation or public interest requirements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Community Affairs

CS/SB 1882 (2R) by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation and Senator Gaetz—

State Park Designations/Bob Graham/Jack Mashburn; Designates the Bob Graham Grayton Beach State Park in Walton County. Designates the Jack Mashburn Marina within St. Andrew's State Park. Directs the Department of Environmental Protection to erect appropriate signs and markers. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Environmental Preservation and Conservation

CS/SB 464 (2R) by the Committee on Transportation and Economic Development Appropriations, Senator Fasano and others—

Veterans' Suicide Prevention; Directs the FDVA, in partnership with the Statewide Office for Suicide Prevention and the DCFS, to seek federal funding for a grants program that addresses veterans' outreach and suicide prevention. Revises the membership of the Suicide Prevention Coordinating Council to include a representative of the Florida Psychological Association and veterans appointed by the Governor, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

CS/SB 30 (2R) by the Committee on Health Regulation and Senator Dean—

Relief/Lois Lacava/Munroe Regional Health System; Compensates Lois H. Lacava for injuries sustained as a result of the negligence of the Munroe Regional Medical Center. Provides a limitation on the payment of fees and costs, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Relief/Estrada/USF Board of Trustees; Compensates Daniel and Amara Estrada, parents and guardians of Caleb Estrada, for the wrongful birth of Caleb Estrada and for damages sustained by Daniel and Amara Estrada as a result of negligence by employees of the University of South Florida Board of Trustees. Provides a limitation on the payment of fees and costs. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Recommended unfavorably by The Special Master on Claim Bills and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation

SB 54 (2R) by Senator Gardiner—

Relief/Erskin Bell, II/City of Altamonte Springs; Compensates Erskin Bell, II, for injuries and damages sustained as the result of negligence by the City of Altamonte Springs. Provides a limitation on the payment of fees and costs, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Recommended favorably by The Special Master on Claim Bills and reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice

SB 208 (2R) by Senator Oelrich—

Community College Student Fees/Transportation; Authorizes community college boards of trustees to establish a transportation access fee. Limits the amount of the fee. Provides a timeframe for a fee increase and implementation of an increase. Prohibits the inclusion of the fee in calculating the amount a student receives under Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program awards. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Higher Education and reported favorably by the Committee on Higher Education Appropriations

CS/SB 436 (2R) by the Committee on Higher Education, Senator Baker and others—

Community Colleges/Palm Beach/Seminole; Amends a specified provision relating to educational institutes. Conforms provisions. Renames Palm Beach Community College and Seminole Community College as "Palm Beach State College" and "Seminole State College of Florida," respectively. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Higher Education

CS/CS/SB 532 (2R) by the Committees on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Health Regulation and Senator Altman—

Food Service Inspections; Includes the investigation of food service programs for domestic violence centers and group care facilities within the Department of Health's environmental health program. Revises the definition of the term "food service establishment" to exclude domestic violence centers under certain conditions. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs

CS/CS/SB 998 (2R) by the Committees on Banking and Insurance, Judiciary and Senator Thrasher—

Trust Administration; Limits a personal representative's entitlement to payment from a trust of certain estate expenses and obligations. 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
