POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS [WPSC] GROUPING

CS/SJR 2204 (3R) by the Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means and Senator Alexander—

Chief Financial Officer Duties; Proposes an amendment to the State Constitution relating to the duties of the Chief Financial Officer.

CS/CS/SB 2206 (3R) by the Committees on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, Governmental Oversight and Accountability and Senator Alexander—

Chief Financial Officer/Charts of Accounts; Requires governmental and statutorily created entities to maintain their financial data in accordance with the requirements of the Chief Financial Officer by a certain date. Requires the Chief Financial Officer to adopt charts of accounts that meet certain requirements by a certain date. Requires a review and update of the charts of accounts. Requires the Chief Financial Officer to adopt certain procedures relating to the charts of accounts, etc. Effective Date: Contingent.

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY [CPSC] GROUPING

CS/CS/SB 926 (3R) by the Committees on Judiciary, Banking and Insurance and Senator Richter—

Trusts; Limits the duties and liability of certain trustees with respect to contracts for life insurance. Provides for the application and nonapplication of certain provisions of state law. Prohibits the compensation of a trustee for the performance of certain activities. Expands the list of delegable investment functions for certain fiduciaries, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

CS/SB 2054 (3R) by the Committee on Transportation and Senator Gaetz—

Road Designations; Designates Doolittle Raiders Highway in Okaloosa and Walton Counties. Designates Beach Highway in Walton County. Designates K. Earl Durden Highway in Bay County. Directs the Department of Transportation to erect markers. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.


