POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS [WPSC] GROUPING

CS/SB 1178 (2R) by the Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, Senator Haridopolos and others—

Cost-benefit/Return-on-investment/Dynamic Scoring; Authorizes the President of the Senate or the Speaker of the House of Representatives to request special impact sessions of consensus estimating conferences to evaluate proposed legislation based on specified techniques. Requires the Office of Economic and Demographic Research to develop protocols and procedures to be used by the consensus estimating conferences when evaluating proposed legislation, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Finance and Tax, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Policy & Steering Committee on Ways and Means, and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules

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
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
