Codifies, amends, and reenacts chapter 99-442, Laws of Florida, as amended, as the "Citrus County Hospital and Medical Nursing and Convalescent Home Act." Requires an annual independent audit of the fiscal management of the hospital at the discretion of the hospital board, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Community Affairs and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENTAL OPERATIONS [GPSC] GROUPING

CS/SB 2170 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and the Committee on Ethics and Elections—

OGSR/Commission on Ethics/Ethics and Public Trust; Amends a specified provision which provides an exemption from public records requirements for complaints and related records held by the Commission on Ethics or a Commission on Ethics and Public Trust established by a county or municipality and an exemption from public meetings requirements for proceedings conducted by such commissions pursuant to a complaint or preliminary investigation, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Ethics and Elections, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules

POLICY AND STEERING COMMITTEE ON SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY [SPSC] GROUPING

CS/SJR 72 (2R) by the Committee on Health Regulation, Senator Baker and others—

Health Care Services; Proposes the creation of Section 28 of Article I of the State Constitution, relating to health care services.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation and the Committees on Judiciary and Health and Human Services Appropriations, report the committee substitute favorably and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 606 (2R) by the Committee on Banking and Insurance, Senator Gelber and others—

Termination of Rental Agreement; Requires the landlord or mortgagor or its agent to tender to the registry of the court or to the foreclosing entity all funds held for advance rent or security deposits at the time of foreclosure. Directs that such funds continue to be held for the use and benefit of the tenants of the foreclosed property, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Banking and Insurance

CS/CS/CS/SB 694 (2R) by the Committees on General Government Appropriations, Judiciary, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Storms—

Child Support; Provides that an obligor may make child support payments directly to the obligee under certain circumstances. Clarifies when income deduction payments are required to be paid to the State Disbursement Unit. Authorizes the DOR to submit to the court a written declaration signed under penalty of perjury for the purpose of establishing an obligation for child support, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law except as otherwise provided.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on General Government Appropriations

CS/CS/CS/SB 724 (2R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Storms—

Review/DCFS/Florida Government Accountability Act; Reenacts and amends a specified provision relating to the establishment of the Department of Children and Family Services. Deletes obsolete provisions relating to the privatization of South Florida State Hospital. Revises licensure requirements for family day care homes. Revises provisions relating to lead agencies. Requires the department to annually evaluate each agency, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

CS/CS/CS/SB 752 (2R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Criminal Justice, Health Regulation and Senator Gaetz—

Health Care; Prohibits the AHCA from issuing an initial license to a home health agency for the purpose of opening anew home health agency under certain conditions until a specified date. Authorizes the agency to revoke a home health agency license if the applicant or any controlling interest has been sanctioned for acts specified under a specified provision. Revises the list of employers who are eligible to enroll in the Florida Health Choices Program, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health Regulation and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

SB 884 (2R) by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs—

OGSR/Domestic Violence Fatality Review Team; Repeals a specified provision relating to an exemption from public records and public meetings requirements for information held by a domestic violence fatality review team and for portions of meetings of a review team at which confidential or exempt information is discussed. Saves the exemption from repeal under the OGSR Act. Deletes provisions providing for repeal of the exemption. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 1198 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and the Committee on Judiciary—

OGSR/Identification of a Minor; Amends specified provision relating to a public records exemption for information contained in court files which identifies a minor petitioning for a waiver of the notice requirements contained in the Parental Notice of Abortion Act. Saves the exemption from repeal under the OGSR Act, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules

CS/SB 1200 (2R) by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability and the Committee on Judiciary—

OGSR/Guardians Ad Litem/Identifying Information; Amends specified provision relating to a public records exemption for identifying information of current or former guardians ad litem. Saves the exemption from repeal under the OGSR Act. Expands the public records exemption to include the names and locations of schools and day care facilities attended by the children of current or former guardians ad litem, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming law.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and withdrawn from the Committee on Rules

CS/CS/SB 1234 (2R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Judiciary and Senator Garcia—

Child Care Facilities/Licensing Standards; Cites this act as the "John F. Serrano, Rachel Lou Napier, and Alexandra Ali Safety and Accountability Act." Provides minimum licensing requirements for window blinds and other window coverings. Requires child care facilities to retrofit window blinds, window coverings, pull cords, or inner cords by a specified date in order to eliminate cords that pose a risk of strangulation. Authorizes the DCFS to adopt rules, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably, with one amendment, by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

CS/CS/CS/SB 1298 (2R) by the Committees on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations, Judiciary, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Senator Wise and others—

Supervised Visitation & Exchange Monitoring Prog.; Adopts state standards for supervised visitation and exchange monitoring programs. Provides factors for the court or child-placing agency to consider when referring cases for supervised visitation or exchange monitoring. Authorizes said programs to conduct security background checks of employees and volunteers and criminal records checks through the FDLE, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 1382 (2R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs and Senator Rich—

Child Care Facilities; Provides that certain child care facilities, large family child care homes, and family day care homes that are accredited by a nationally recognized accrediting association may apply to the DCFS to receive a "Gold Seal Quality Care" designation. Prohibits a person under the age of 18 from being the operator of a child care facility. Requires the department to address minimum age requirements for before-school and after-school care, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

CS/CS/CS/SB 1520 (2R) by the Committees on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Criminal Justice, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Senator Storms and others—

Screening; Revises an exemption from screening requirements for volunteers who assist providers under contract with the DCFS. Revises background screening requirements for the Guardian Ad Litem Program, mental health personnel, nursing home personnel, home health agency personnel, nurse registry personnel, companions and homemakers, hospice personnel, personnel at homes for special services, and for transitional living personnel, etc. Effective Date: 08/01/2010.

Reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal Justice and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

CS/CS/SB 1974 (2R) by the Committees on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations, Judiciary and Senator Negron—

Department of Law Enforcement; Requires certain reports to be submitted in an automated format. Revises provisions relating to the Criminal Justice Information Program under the Department of Law Enforcement. Requires the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission to adopt rules relating to the maintenance of officers who engage in those specialized areas found to present a high risk of harm to the officer or the public at large, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Criminal Justice and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Judiciary and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations

CS/SB 2530 (2R) by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations, Senator Alexander and others—

Nursing; Authorizes the disclosure of certain confidential information required of nursing license applicants to certain persons. Revises requirements for graduation from certain nursing education programs for nursing license applicants seeking to take the licensing examination. Revises restrictions on nursing graduates who may use certain titles and abbreviations. Revises requirements for the approval of nursing education programs, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2010.

Reported favorably by the Committees on Health Regulation, Higher Education, and Governmental Oversight and Accountability, and reported favorably as a committee substitute by the Committee on Health and Human Services Appropriations

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
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
